New Delhi, July 21 : Senior Congress leader Rahul Gandhi staged a protest near the residence of Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi. New Delhi, July 21 : Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Tuesday congratulated Andy Burnham on assuming office as the Prime Minister of the United Kingdom, saying India and the UK would continue to strengthen their partnership across key areas including trade, investment, technology and defence. In a post on X, Prime Minister Modi said: "Warmest congratulations to Mr. Andy Burnham on assuming office as Prime Minister of the United Kingdom. India and the UK are bound by shared democratic values."



KTR Strong Warning to officials and Congress leaders : If BRS workers are harassed, we won't leave them go

Mancherial, July 21: BRS Working President KTR warned that those harassing party workers would not be spared. He made it clear that not a single person engaging in such actions would be let off the hook. He stated that officials who cross the line would be dragged out and made to stand before the public, even after their retirement. He emphasized that those who torment BRS leaders would not be spared. He advised the Mancherial MLA to mend his ways, stating that he was not a good-natured person like KCR. Speaking in Mancherial on Tuesday, KTR recalled that BRS chief KCR had constructed the

Kaleshwaram project to prevent drought in the state. KTR lashed out at the Revanth Reddy government, stating that no repairs have been carried out on the Kaleshwaram project for 31 months. He alleged that L&T, the company responsible for the project's repairs, had also been threatened. He expressed anguish that Godavari river water is flowing towards Andhra Pradesh, where the Pattiseema project is operational. He remarked sarcastically that CM Revanth Reddy knows only two things: votes and hurling abuses.

From NTR to Chandrababu Naidu has recognized the importance of water : Nimmala Ramanaidu

Amaravati, July 21: Minister Nimmala Ramanaidu stated that leaders ranging from Anna NTR to Chandrababu have recognized the importance of water. Speaking to the media on Tuesday about achievements made over the past two years—specifically regarding the

Polavaram and other irrigation projects—he lashed out at the YCP, alleging that they had handed over an economy on ventilator support and a devastated irrigation sector. It was stated that the Irrigation Department



has prepared a schedule today. Polavaram was described as a boon and a lifeline for the state. It was noted that 72% of the Polavaram project had been completed back then, and had the TDP government.

UAE minister meets Chandrababu Naidu, discusses proposed food cluster in Andhra Pradesh

Amaravati, July 21 : UAE Minister of Economy and Tourism, Abdulla Bin Touq Al Marri, met Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu here on Tuesday and discussed the proposed establishment of a food cluster in the state.

The delegation from the United Arab Emirates (UAE) held discussions with the Chief Minister and senior officials at the State Secretariat. The state government said that a decision has been taken to establish a value chain for exporting various horticultural prod-

ucts—including mangoes, bananas, and cocoa—to international markets. An agreement for establishing a food cluster was reached at the World Economic Forum meet at Davos early this year.



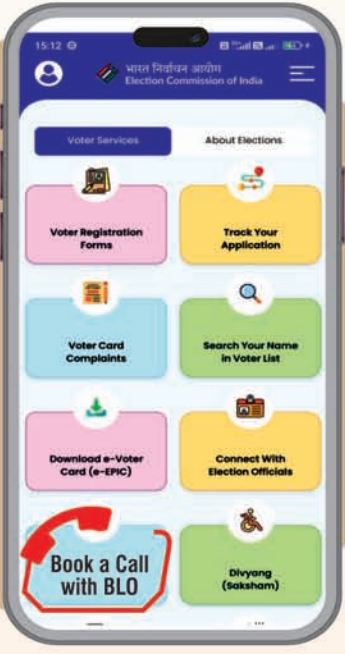

Goal: Curbing accidents on national highways

Vikas Raj, Special Chief Secretary, Transport, Roads & Buildings Department. Review meeting held via video conference with District Collectors. District Collector Garima Agrawal attended.

Rajanna Sircilla, July 21: Vikas Raj, Special Chief Secretary of the Transport, Roads & Buildings Department, emphasized that the primary objective is to curb road accidents on national highways. He conducted a review meeting via video conference from Hyderabad with District Collectors, joined by Transport Commissioner Ilambarithi and officials from the Police and National Highways departments. District Collector Garima Agrawal participated in the meeting from the District Integrated Offices Complex. Speaking on the occasion, Vikas Raj and Transport Commissioner Ilambarithi advised against parking heavy vehicles and trucks along national highways, in accordance with Supreme Court directives. They clarified that vehicle parking is prohibited outside designated areas and stressed the need to prevent encroachments on the roads. They directed District Collectors to constitute task force teams comprising officials, police personnel, and National Highway authorities. Furthermore, they instructed that police and transport department vehicles should conduct regular patrols along the national highways and ensure that emergency service equipment is available on board these patrol vehicles. Officials from the Medical and Health Department were instructed to map the details of all hospitals and trauma care centers within their districts and ensure their availability during emergencies. Orders were also issued to identify “black spots” across all districts and take measures to address them. *Strict Implementation of Government Orders* District Collector Garima Agarwal stated that directives regarding road safety would be strictly implemented in the district. She mentioned that all necessary steps are being taken to resolve issues related to black spots identified along national highways by the District Road Safety Committee. She reviewed the work undertaken by the task force in the district and provided guidance on future plans. District Transport Officer Srinivas, Probationary Deputy Collector Nikita, District Medical Officer Angela Alfred, R&B Divisional Engineers Shanthayya and Varaprasad, along with police and National Highways officials, participated in the video conference.

Harish alleges Congress-created irrigation crisis in Telangana



Hyderabad, July 21 : Former minister and BRS deputy floor leader T. Harish Rao has accused the Congress government of deliberately denying irrigation water to farmers despite the availability of adequate Godavari water, alleging that administrative negligence had pushed large parts of the erstwhile Warangal district into an avoidable drought. Addressing a press conference at Telangana Bhavan on Tuesday, Harish Rao said the present crisis was “not a drought caused by El Niño, but a drought created by the Congress Government.” Recalling the BRS press conference held on July 12, Harish Rao said the party had demanded that the government immediately operate the Devadula Lift Irrigation Scheme pumps. He said that the very next day, Ministers Uttam Kumar Reddy, Bhatti Vikramarka and Ponguleti Srinivas Reddy visited the project and announced that 38 TMC of water would be lifted to fill 22 reservoirs under the Devadula project, prompting farmers to begin transplantation. “Today, those promises have been completely forgotten. The government is neither lifting water nor supplying irrigation to farmers who trusted its assurances,” he said.

NSA Doval urges BIMSTEC nations to collaborate, take decisions for mutual benefits amid global uncertainties

National Security Advisor (NSA) Ajit Doval on Thursday stressed the need for BIMSTEC nations to collaborate, take decisive actions for mutual benefit, and find solutions through discussions, amid the conflicts and geopolitical uncertainties. Addressing the fifth BIMSTEC National Security Advisors' Meeting in New Delhi on Thursday, NSA Doval said, "We are meeting today in the backdrop of a challenging global landscape. We are witnessing conflicts and geopolitical uncertainties. We are also facing multi-domain security threats amplified by rapid technological advancement. Disruptions in global supply chains have also resulted in economic hardship for all our countries."

"In this setting, there is an urgent need for us to collaborate, take decisive actions for our mutual benefit, and find solutions through mutual discussions and deliberations to the best problems that we are all facing," he added.

NSA Doval noted that BIMSTEC brings together the most significant and vibrant regions of the Indian Ocean and represents a population of almost 22 per cent of the world population, with a combined GDP of nearly \$5 trillion. He stated that BIMSTEC nations are united by the Bay of Bengal geographically and through "deep civilisational and cultural legacies" that have evolved over a millennium of shared history.

He said, "Building on these unique bonds, BIMSTEC has been anchored in robust cooperation across a range of sectors on the foundations of a great past. We strive to achieve a great future sharing prosperity and resilience for all our people. We have advanced and strengthened cooperation in fighting terrorism, combating transnational organised crime, cyber threats, meeting maritime challenges, and we are poised to combat new and emerging threats together." "BIMSTEC's long-standing goals of regional security, connectivity, capacity building and economic security should continue to drive our collective efforts," he added.

He said that BIMSTEC represents India's vision of Neighbourhood First and its commitment to the Act East policy and the MAHASAGAR vision. He stated, "As BIMSTEC celebrates its 30th anniversary next year, let us commit to further expand our collaborative potential and infuse new energy and resources towards ensuring national and regional security. We aim to build institutional capacity and cooperation across our priority sectors. I am certain that our vision and common aspirations, coupled with mutual trust, will continue to result in tangible outcomes."

The Bay of Bengal Initiative for Multi-Sectoral Technical and Economic Cooperation (BIMSTEC) is a regional organisation that was established on June 6, 1997, with the signing of the Bangkok Declaration, according to the official statement. Initially known as BIST-EC (Bangladesh-India-Sri Lanka-Thailand Economic Cooperation), the organisation is now known as BIMSTEC and comprises seven Member States, with the admission of Myanmar on December 22, 1997, and Bhutan and Nepal in February 2004.

Nepal, India discuss strengthening ties as senior MEA official visits Kathmandu

Kathmandu, July 21 : Additional Secretary (North) at India's Ministry of External Affairs (MEA), Munu Mahawar, on Tuesday paid courtesy calls on Nepal's Minister for Foreign Affairs, Shisir Khanal, and Foreign Secretary Amrit Bahadur Rai.

During the meetings, both sides held productive discussions on India-Nepal cooperation across various sectors and explored ways to further strengthen the unique partnership, the Indian Embassy in Kathmandu said in a social media post.

Nepal's Ministry of Foreign Affairs said the discussions focused on further strengthening the close and enduring ties be-

tween Nepal and India in areas of mutual interest. Mahawar is part of the Indian delegation that participated in the 13th meeting of the Nepal-India Joint Steering Committee (JSC) on Power Sector Cooperation, co-chaired by Nepal's Energy Secretary Sarita Dawadi and India's Power Secretary Pankaj Agarwal in Nepal's western city — Pokhara on Wednesday.

During the JSC meeting, the two sides conducted a comprehensive review of bilateral cooperation in the power sector, covering hydropower development, cross-border electricity trade and transmission infrastructure, according to a press statement issued by the Indian Embassy.



The meeting also discussed the coordinated operation of the Indian and Nepali power grids, the development of solar energy projects, cooperation in green hydrogen, and capacity building for Nepali energy professionals. The two sides also agreed to expedite work on several new high-capacity cross-border transmission line projects. Nepal's Ministry of Energy, Water Resources and Irrigation said the two countries had agreed to

increase the volume of electricity traded through two cross-border transmission line projects. The two sides agreed that Nepal could export up to 1,650 MW of electricity to India and import up to 1,400 MW through the two 400 kV cross-border transmission lines connecting the two countries. The transmission lines are the Dhalkebar-Muzaffarpur and Dhalkebar-Sitamarhi 400 kV cross-border links. Of the two, the Dhalkebar-Muzaffarpur transmission line has been operational since 2016, while the Dhalkebar-Sitamarhi transmission line is nearing completion, according to Nepal's Ministry of Energy, Water Resources and Irrigation.

H5N1 bird flu could take hold in New Zealand within months: Govt



Wellington, July 21 : A newly detected strain of H5N1 avian influenza is likely to become endemic in New Zealand within months, after the country recorded its first case in a wild seabird, a senior veterinary official said on Tuesday. Ministry for Primary Industries' Chief Veterinary Officer Mary van Andel told Radio New Zealand (RNZ) that eradication would be unlikely if the virus establishes in wildlife, reports Xinhua news agency.

Calls grow against Bangladesh's continued persecution of journalists

New York, July 21 : Several leading press freedom and human rights organisations have called on the Bangladesh government to end the persecution of journalists in the country, while urging the authorities to ensure that media professionals Farzana Rupa and Mozammel Babu are not criminally prosecuted, particularly on charges of crimes against humanity, for carrying out their journalistic work. In a joint statement, the organisations also raised concerns over the ongoing pre-trial detention of Rupa, Babu, and two other journalists, Shakil Ahmed and Shyamal Dutta, in other cases connected to the 2024 mass protests that ousted the Sheikh Hasina-led Awami League government.

Bangladesh's International Crime Tribunal on May 14 showed journalists Rupa and Babu, along with former minister Dipu Moni, arrested in a case linked to alleged crimes against humanity during the 2013 crackdown on the Hefazat-e-Islam rally at Shapla Chattar in



Dhaka. The signatories said that since then, the lawyers representing Rupa and Babu had not been provided with any evidence or a chargesheet. They noted that the prosecution had indicated that the case was based on broadcast coverage of the 2013 events, including a current affairs programme presented by Rupa that allegedly "spread misleading information" about casualty figures and contributed to "crimes against humanity". "A fundamental aspect of the right to freedom of expression is the protection of journalistic work, including reporting and editorial decisions on matters of significant public interest.

US to tighten terror finance crackdown

Washington, July 21 : The Trump administration on Tuesday announced an expanded effort to disrupt the financing of organisations it accuses of supporting political terrorism, with Treasury Secretary Scott Bessent saying the United States would intensify scrutiny of charities, non-profit organisations and international financial networks used to channel illicit funds.

Bessent, addressing the State Department's Ministerial on the Resurgence of Political Terrorism, said terrorist organisations increasingly exploit legitimate financial institutions and charitable structures to conceal funding and sustain operations across borders.

"At President Trump's direction, the United States Treasury is bringing the full weight of our authorities to defend the integrity of the US global financial systems," Bessent said. He said the Treasury Department was broadening the mission of its Office of Terrorism and Financial Intelligence, originally established after the September 11, 2001, terrorist attacks, to address what he described as evolving forms of organised political terrorism. "The resurgence of organised political terrorism has long occupied a blind spot," Bessent said. "The international community has struggled to identify this danger, much less defeat it. But as the threat of terrorism evolves, the institutional tools that defend against it must adapt." According to Bessent, terrorist networks increasingly rely on international financial systems, cross-border fundraising and organisations operating under charitable or non-profit status.

"Violence requires money, channels through which funding can move and institutions behind which it can hide," he said. "Increasingly legitimate nonprofit and charitable structures are being exploited as a mechanism to conceal the movement of illicit funds to support political terrorism."

He said the Treasury Department would examine whether tax-exempt organisations had been used to facilitate illicit financial activity and pledged action where evidence justified it.

"We are examining where tax-exempt status has been exploited, where charitable entities have become financial conduits for foreign influence activity, and how those entrusted with stewardship of these organisations have



instead enabled violence," Bessent said. "Where the evidence leads, we will not hesitate to follow." Bessent said the administration had already designated four far-left extremist organisations abroad as foreign terrorist organisations, while the Treasury had sanctioned 17 organisations that it described as sham charities accused of financing Hamas activities. He said financial institutions also had a responsibility to strengthen oversight. "Just as financial institutions must know their clients, they must know their grantees," he said. While outlining the administration's approach, Bessent stressed that enforcement actions would remain subject to US law.

"To be clear, in the fight against domestic terrorism, we must respect the constitutional rights, freedom of speech, association and assembly of all Americans," he said. "Treasury will act based on suspected unlawful conduct by these terror organisations, not because of their beliefs or ideologies." The Financial Action Task Force (FATF), of which both India and the United States are members, has made combating terrorist financing a central priority. Washington has frequently used sanctions, asset freezes and financial intelligence tools against organisations accused of supporting terrorism, while encouraging greater international coordination to prevent the misuse of global financial systems.

Japanese Defence Minister could visit India next month: Report



Tokyo, July 21 : Japanese Defence Minister Shinjiro Koizumi is planning to visit India in August to hold talks with his Indian counterpart Rajnath Singh. This will be Koizumi's first visit to India after assuming office in October last year, local media reported on Tuesday.

The two ministers are expected to discuss cooperation about defence equipment, including the export of the Unicorn communication antenna system from Japan to India, Jiji Press reported citing information received from the officials of the Japanese Defence Ministry.

Koizumi and Singh will discuss expanding joint exercises between Japan's Self-Defense Forces and the Indian military. In addition, the two leaders are likely to discuss the situation in the Indo-Pacific region, including activities by China, the report detailed.

On July 13, India and Japan held the 8th Defence Policy Dialogue in Tokyo and discussed ways to deepen cooperation in emerging domains, including defence industrial collaboration.

South Korea's media watchdog floats possible social media ban for minors



Seoul, July 21 : South Korea's media watchdog said Tuesday it is considering a social media restriction against children aged 14 years old and younger amid escalating concerns over excessive use of such platforms. Kim Jong-cheol, the chairman of the Korea Media and Communications

Commission, made the remarks at a policy briefing in Cheong Wa Dae, emphasizing that excessive social media use by teenagers is a worldwide problem. "We are reviewing, in phases, a plan to restrict children under 14 years of age from creating accounts on social media platforms, and limiting exposure to designs and algorithms that could encourage excessive use of such platforms for teens aged 14 to 19," Kim said.

Pakistan: Four police personnel killed in firing incidents in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa

Islamabad, July 21 : Four police personnel were killed in two separate firing incidents in Pakistan's Khyber Pakhtunkhwa on Tuesday, local media reported citing the police. Three police personnel were killed after unidentified assailants riding a motorcycle opened fire on traffic police personnel in Lakki Marwat's Sarai Naurang city, according to police spokesperson, Pakistan-

based Geo News reported. Following the incident, the attackers fled from the spot. The deceased have been identified as Traffic Police In-charge Naurang Jalal Khan, Constable Azizullah, and Constable Abdullah. Police has initiated a search operation in the area and have started a probe. Meanwhile, a police personnel was killed after unidentified gunmen opened fire in Mandan area of Bannu.



Police said Constable Rashid Khan was targeted while he was heading to Mandan Police Station for duty from his home. The latest incidents come in a series of attacks targeting police personnel in Pakistan, especially in the bordering provinces of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and Balochistan.

US intercepts three commercial vessels attempting to breach Iran naval blockade : CENTCOM



Washington, July 21 : US forces intercepted three commercial vessels attempting to breach the US naval blockade against Iran, the US Central Command (CENTCOM) said. CENTCOM said on X: "As of today, American forces have redirected 3 commercial vessels trying to run the blockade, disabled 1 that didn't comply, and boarded 1 to ensure full compliance with the ongoing U.S. naval blockade against Iran." US Marines from the 11th Marine Expeditionary Unit conduct a verification boarding aboard M/T Wen Yao in the Gulf of Oman, July 16, CENTCOM announced. US forces resumed blocking maritime traffic entering and leaving Iranian ports on Tuesday. "The Strait of Hormuz and the surrounding waters remain free and open, except for vessels attempting to violate America's steel wall blockade," CENTCOM said.

IAF Rafales arrive in Australia for Pitch Black 2026 air combat exercise

Canberra, July 21: India's Rafale fighter jets and C-17 transport aircraft have arrived in Australia to participate in the Royal Australian Air Force's (RAAF) premier multinational air combat exercise, Pitch Black 2026, marking another step in expanding defence cooperation between the two countries. Announcing the arrival of the Indian Air Force (IAF) contingent, the High Commission of India in Canberra said in a post on X, "The High Commission of India is proud to welcome the Indian Air Force contingent of four Rafale and two C17 aircraft along with over 120 Air Warriors to Darwin to participate in Royal Australian Air Force's premier air combat exercise Pitch Black 2026." The diplomatic mission added that the deployment reflects India's commitment to strengthening military partnerships.

Assam: Akhil Gogoi criticises One Nation, One Election

Guwahati, July 21 : Rajior Dal chief and Sibsagar MLA Akhil Gogoi on Tuesday mounted a sharp attack on the Centre’s proposed ‘One Nation, One Election’ (ONOE) initiative, alleging that the move is aimed at weakening India’s federal structure and centralising power. Addressing reporters, Gogoi claimed the proposal would fundamentally alter the constitutional framework by reducing state autonomy and undermining the country’s federal system. He alleged that the plan was an attempt to convert India into a unitary form of governance, contrary to the spirit of the Constitution. “One Nation, One Election is an attempt to transform India from a federal democracy into a completely unitary state. India is a Union of states, and no government has the authority to dilute that constitutional principle,” Gogoi said. The Rajior Dal chief urged the Centre to withdraw



the proposal, maintaining that simultaneous elections were incompatible with the country’s democratic and constitutional framework. He further alleged that the initiative reflected an authoritarian mindset and warned that it could face widespread public opposition if pursued. Gogoi claimed that restructuring the electoral system in such a manner would erode democratic institutions and the federal balance envisaged by the Constitu-

tion. He warned that if the proposal was forced upon the people, there would be a massive democratic movement across the country, with citizens uniting to protect the Constitution and India’s federal character. The legislator also asserted that opposition parties and civil society groups would resist any attempt to implement the proposal if it compromised the rights and powers of the states.



MP: Narmada waters reach more Vindhya farmlands as longest water tunnel nears completion

Bhopal, July 21 : After 17 years of overcoming formidable geological challenges, the 11.952-kilometre-long tunnel has reached its final stage of completion. The state claimed it is the longest in the country. Once operational, Narmada water will flow through the tunnel by gravity to irrigate vast tracts of land in the Vindhya region. The Sleemanabad Tunnel is a remarkable engineering achievement designed to carry Narmada water across the Vindhya mountain range to the Son River basin. Madhya Pradesh Chief Minister Mohan Yadav will visit the Sleemanabad Tunnel site in Katni district on Tuesday. This

project is expected to provide permanent irrigation benefits to 2.45 lakh hectares of land across nearly 1,450 villages in six districts: Jabalpur, Katni, Maihar, Satna, Rewa and Panna. The initiative promises to transform the agricultural economy of the Vindhya and Mahakaushal regions by bringing water to previously arid farmlands. Constructed by the Narmada Valley Development Authority, the tunnel posed unprecedented technical difficulties. Engineers had to bore through hard marble, limestone, dolomite and vast underground caverns approximately 30 metres below ground level.

GenAI a top priority for 70 pc Global Capability Centres in India: Report

Mumbai, July 21 : The adoption of Artificial Intelligence (AI) within Global Capability Centres (GCCs) in India is accelerating, with nearly 70 per cent of centres investing in generative AI (GenAI), according to a report on Tuesday. The EY India GCC Pulse Survey 2024, based on insights from 88 GCCs in India, reveals that 78 per cent of GCCs are upskilling teams for GenAI adoption, while 37 per cent are piloting use cases, highlighting a shift from experimentation to practical applications of AI focused on talent management and risk mitigation. It identified climate change and sustainability agenda top focus area for GCCs in the country. This was followed by 85 per cent wanting to expand functional capabilities and 61 per cent wanting to drive enterprise-wide digital transformation.



India surpasses 200 GW in renewable energy capacity: Centre

New Delhi, July 21 : India has surpassed 200 GW (gigawatt) in renewable energy capacity, accounting for more than 46.3 per cent of the country's total installed capacity, the Centre said on Tuesday. According to the Central Electricity Authority (CEA), the total renewable energy-based electricity generation capacity now stands at 203.18 GW, as the country aims to achieve 500 GW from non-fossil sources by 2030. Solar power leads the way with 92.12 GW, playing a crucial role in India's efforts to harness its abundant sunlight. Wind power follows closely with 47.72 GW, driven by the vast potential of the coastal and inland wind corridors across the country. "Hydroelectric power is another key contributor, with large hydro projects generating 46.93 GW and small hydro power adding 5.07 GW, offering a reliable and sustainable source of energy from India's rivers and water systems," according to the Ministry of New and Renewable Energy. Biopower, including biomass and biogas energy, adds another 11.32 GW to the renewable energy mix.

China's 'pirate business model' poses existential threat to Western automakers: Report

New Delhi, July 21: China's auto company BYD has gained top spot in global electric-vehicle market through its alleged "pirate business model", prompting concern in Europe and North America about the implications for domestic auto industries, a new report has claimed. The report from European media house Politico claimed BYD sold about 4.6 million vehicles in 2025, including 2.26 million pure battery-electric cars, surpassing Tesla's roughly 1.6 million deliveries. The report found that BYD and other Chinese automakers are gaining market share in Europe, allegedly putting pressure on legacy manufacturers such as Volkswagen, Mercedes-Benz and



BMW. "This will not end well unless the West unites. BYD is not just another automaker — it is a pirate ship with a balance sheet, weakening both Europe's and America's industrial bases, one cheap EV at a time," the re-

port warned. It described BYD's rise as the result of a business model based on piracy which relied on "copy, absorb, subsidise, scale, dump and dominate" strategy.



Microsoft cuts Claude Code access as AI coding costs surge

New Delhi, July 21 : US-based technology firm Microsoft has begun scaling back access to Anthropic's Claude Code among its employees and is redirecting engineers towards GitHub Copilot CLI as surging AI usage drives up enterprise computing costs, according to multiple reports. Reports said the technology company had earlier expanded access to Claude Code across thousands of employees, including developers, project managers and designers, to encourage experimentation with AI-assisted coding tools. However, the rapid adoption of the platform is now said to have significantly increased operational expenses. Despite the rollback, Microsoft's broader partnership with Anthropic remains intact. The company continues to maintain its multibillion-dollar Foundry agreement, which in-

cludes cloud infrastructure support and access to Claude models through Azure services. The development comes as several technology companies grapple with the rising costs associated with large-scale deployment of generative AI tools. In addition, Uber Chief Technology Officer Praveen Neppalli Naga had reportedly said that the company exhausted its entire 2026 budget for AI coding tools within the first four months of the year due to heavy employee usage.



India on track to meet 500 GW non-fossil power target by 2030: MNRE Secretary

New Delhi, July 21 : India is on course to achieve its ambitious target of 500 gigawatts (GW) of non-fossil fuel power capacity by 2030, with a strong pipeline of renewable energy projects already in place, a top government offi-

cial has said. India currently has around 260 GW of non-fossil fuel capacity, Santosh Sarangi, Secretary at the Ministry of New and Renewable Energy (MNRE) said while speaking to NDTV Profit.

PLI scheme for food processing industries sees Rs 9,207 crore investment

New Delhi, July 21 : A cumulative investment of about Rs 9,207 crore has been made by the approved applicants under the production-linked incentive (PLI) scheme for Food Processing Industries (PLISFPI), according to the government. Around 35 lakh metric tonnes per annum of processing and preservation capacity has been created under the scheme. Total incentive amount of Rs 2,714.79 crore has been disbursed till date, according to Minister of State for Food Processing Industries, Ravneet Singh. Out of 168 applicants approved under PLISFPI Scheme, 69 applicants are under Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs) category. In addition, 40 contract manufacturing units of main approved applicants are also from MSME.



Hyundai Motor India shares slip to Rs 1,745, down over 10 pc of IPO price

Mumbai, July 21 : Shares of Hyundai Motor India, that were listed at Rs 1,931 apiece, have slipped more than 10 per cent from its IPO praxice. Apple announces 15 new games on Arcade gaming service On Tuesday, the stock closed in red at Rs 1,745 apiece, owing to poor performance of the automaker in the second quarter of FY25. At closing, Hyundai Motor India shares

were down 3.37 per cent. The shares of Hyundai Motor India, one of the country's leading automobile companies, have continued to decline since its listing. The listing of Hyundai Motor India shares took place on October 22. The reason for the fall in the stock is attributed to the company's poor results and sales figures. Hyundai Motor India on Thursday released the results for the second quarter of the financial year 2024-25. The company's consolidated profit declined by 16 per cent year-on-year to Rs 1,375 crore, which was Rs 1,628 crore in the same period a year ago.

Wipro Q1 profit falls over 4 pc, forecasts flat to weak Q2 IT services revenue

Mumbai, July 21 : IT major Wipro on Tuesday reported a decline in its net profit for the first quarter of FY27, with consolidated PAT declining over 4 per cent sequentially despite a marginal rise in revenue. The company's consolidated net profit declined 4.7 per cent quarter-on-quarter (QoQ) to Rs 3,352 crore in the April-June quarter, although PAT was flat from a year ago. Meanwhile, gross revenue rose 1 per cent sequentially

and 10.6 per cent year-on-year (YoY) to Rs 24,480 crore. At the operating level, IT services' operating margin stood at 16 per cent during the quarter, down 1.3 percentage points sequentially and 1.2 percentage points year-on-year. Operating cash flow rose 3.6 per cent sequentially to Rs 3,290 crore and accounted for 98 per cent of the company's net income during the quarter. The company's voluntary attrition rate stood at 13.9 per cent on a trailing 12-month basis.

Looking ahead, Wipro expects revenue from its IT services business to be in the range of a 1.5 per cent decline to growth of 0.5 per cent. According to Srinu Pallia, CEO and Managing Director, "Clients are moving beyond technology modernisation to AI-enabled operating models that improve quality, resilience, and productivity. Wipro's consulting-led, AI-powered approach helps clients embed AI at the core of their business, and these engagements reflect both the



breadth of our capabilities and the trust clients place in us as a transformation partner, Pallia added. Apart from earnings, the board also declared an interim dividend of Rs 2 per equity share. Shares of Wipro on Tuesday ended at Rs 177.80,

an increase of 1.83 per cent on the BSE. The IT stock has declined 33.56 per cent in the last six months and 32.38 per cent over the past year. It plunged by 38.49 per cent over the last five years.

Info Edge shares plunge over 5 pc to hit fresh 52-week low

Mumbai, July 21 : Shares of Info Edge India -- the parent company of Naukri.com -- plunged over 5 per cent in early trade on Tuesday and hit a fresh 52-week low as analysts remained cautious on the near-term growth outlook. The BSE 100 stock touched an intraday low and a new 52-week low of Rs 909.20, down 5.4 per cent from the previous close during early trade on the BSE.





Hindu seers, right-wing groups slam Maulana Jarjis Ansari over 'Lord Krishna' remark

New Delhi, July 21: A controversy erupted after a viral video showed Maulana Jarjis Ansari claiming that Lord Krishna was a Muslim and offered namaz five times a day, with Hindu saints and right-wing groups launching a scathing attack on the Muslim cleric.

Maulana Ansari further drew the ire of the seers for reportedly reciting a verse from the Bhagavad Gita in order to support his claim. Reacting on the cleric's remarks, Mahamandaleshwar Vishnu Das said: "A Maulana has claimed that Lord Krishna was a Muslim and offered namaz. Whoever cuts off his tongue will be rewarded with Rs 10 lakh. He has hurt the religious sentiments of Lord Krishna's devotees. He does not know even a single word of Sanskrit and is misinterpreting verses from the Bhagavad Gita."



Two linked to Kaushal-Bambiha gang held in Punjab, weapons recovered

Chandigarh, July 21 : In a major breakthrough, Jalandhar Commissionerate Police have apprehended two associates linked to the Kaushal-Bambiha gang after a hot chase and cross-firing in which both were critically injured, Punjab's Director General of Police Gaurav Yadav said on Tuesday.

Govt defends 'New Rural Employment Scheme', slams Congress over 'misleading campaign'

Bhopal/New Delhi, July 21 : In a sharp rebuttal to the Congress' recent announcement of a "Save MGNREGA Movement", Union Agriculture Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan has accused the Opposition of attempting to shield corruption rather than protect rural workers. In a press conference, Union Minister Chouhan said that the Mahatma Gandhi Na-

tional Rural Employment Guarantee Act (MGNREGA), once envisioned as a lifeline for rural labourers, had over time become synonymous with irregularities and misuse of funds. The Union Minister highlighted that under previous administrations, contractors often replaced workers, machinery was used instead of manual labour, and repeated projects drained resources without creating permanent assets.

Social audits conducted by village assemblies reportedly uncovered more than a million complaints, ranging from inflated worker rolls to elderly individuals being falsely shown as labourers. By contrast, the Union government emphasised that Prime Minister Narendra Modi's tenure has seen unprecedented allocations -- more than Rs 8.48 lakh crore -- towards rural employment and development. The new initiative, branded as the "Viksit Bharat-G RAM G Yojana", promises stronger safeguards, increased transparency, and expanded benefits. Key reforms include extend-



ing guaranteed employment from 100 to 125 days, introducing penalties for delayed wage payments, and strengthening provisions for unemployment allowances, Union Minister Chouhan said. He stressed that unlike earlier practises where states dictated projects, the revamped scheme empowers gram sabhas and elected village representatives to decide local priorities.

J&K: SIA frames charges in narco-Terror case

Srinagar, July 21 : J&K State Investigation Agency (SIA) on Tuesday achieved a breakthrough by framing charges in a landmark narco-terror case in the Special NIA Court. A statement said: "In a breakthrough against narco-terrorism and cross-border terror financing, the Special NIA Court has ordered the framing of charges in a landmark case investigated by the State Investigation Agency (SIA), Kashmir, clearing the way for the trial of members of an alleged Pakistan-backed Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT) syndicate accused of funding terrorism in Jammu and Kashmir through narcotics smuggling." The case was registered in

October 2022 based on credible intelligence regarding a highly organised cross-border conspiracy orchestrated by Pakistan/PoJK-based handlers of the proscribed terrorist organisation LeT. Investigation conducted by SIA Kashmir established that the syndicate smuggled narcotic substances across the Line of Control into J&K and channelised the illicit proceeds for financing terrorism, sustaining terrorist infrastructure, and strengthening the terror ecosystem. During an extensive investigation, SIA Kashmir uncovered the larger conspiracy and identified the involvement of 16 accused persons, including four Pakistan/PoJK-based terrorist handlers.



Cong urges Tripura govt to exempt school teachers from census duty amid staff shortage



Agartala, July 21 : The Congress has urged the Tripura government to exempt teachers of government-run schools from the upcoming census exercise and instead engage contractual staff for the enumeration process, citing an acute shortage of teachers and its adverse impact on academic activities. In a letter to Chief Minister Manik Saha, Tripura Pradesh Congress Committee President Asish Kumar Saha said on Tuesday that while the state government frequently speaks about improving the quality of education, government schools continue to face a severe shortage of teachers. According to Saha, a former MLA, around 18,000 teaching posts at various levels of edu-

cation are currently lying vacant, while more than 400 government schools are functioning with only a single teacher, as highlighted in a NITI Aayog report. "In the interior and tribal-inhabited areas, a large number of schools have been closed due to various reasons. Owing to the shortage of teaching and non-teaching staff, academic activities have been adversely affected, leading to a decline in the quality of education," he said. Saha also added that the state government has announced plans to introduce pre-primary and nursery sections in 450 schools despite the continuing shortage of teachers. The Congress leader said that his party has been consistently demanding that around 9,000 government school teachers be kept out of census-related duties, warning that assigning them to the exercise would severely disrupt academic activities across the state. "Teachers should primarily focus on educating students and carrying out academic programmes. However, they are frequently assigned to various government administrative duties, including election-related work and the Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of electoral rolls," Saha said in his letter to the Chief Minister. He also demanded that the state government immediately launch a transparent recruitment drive to fill the large number of vacant teaching posts in government schools and address the acute shortage of teachers.

20,000 pregnant women visiting AAP clinics every month, says Punjab minister

Chandigarh, July 21 : The Punjab government has decentralised maternal healthcare, with Aam Aadmi Clinics emerging as the new lifeline for expectant mothers, government officials said on Tuesday. Within four months of launching a specialised, protocol-driven pregnancy care model, the state has recorded a massive surge in service utilisation, with nearly 20,000 pregnant women visiting these clinics every , said the State Health and Family Welfare Minister Balbir Singh.



RJD leader Mrityunjay Tiwari resigns from party, levels serious allegations

Patna, July 21 : Senior Rashtriya Janata Dal (RJD) leader and party spokesperson Mrityunjay Tiwari on Tuesday resigned from all his organisational posts, alleging that dedicated party workers are no longer respected within the party. Announcing his resignation, Tiwari accused the party leadership of ignoring the concerns of loyal members and claimed that repeated attempts to raise internal issues went unaddressed. He said that he had voiced his concerns before State RJD President Mangani Lal Mandal and other senior office-bearers, but received no response. He also alleged that Leader of the Opposition Tejashwi Yadav also did not take cognisance of his grievances. "No one can continue in politics while facing constant humiliation. We stood by the Rashtriya Janata Dal even during its most difficult times. (RJD supremo) Lalu Prasad Yadav trusted me and entrusted me with the responsibilities of party's spokesperson and media in-charge. I fulfilled those responsibilities with complete dedication.

Chhattisgarh govt rolls out new law: Risk-based Ease of Doing Business Act 2026

Raipur, July 21 : In a major boost to industry and entrepreneurship, the Chhattisgarh Legislative Assembly has passed the Chhattisgarh Ease of Doing Business Act, 2026. It is a comprehensive risk-based business approval system. After a debate and an amendment replacing "coordinator" with "Secretary" (the state's chief secretary), the Bill was passed by voice vote. The new law aims to dramatically reduce bureaucratic hurdles for businesses by categorising them according to risk profiles based on size, investment.



Azerbaijan: India set to open permanent exhibition on its world heritage sites

Baku, July 21 : The Indian Embassy in Azerbaijan is set to open in Baku a permanent exhibition on the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organisation (UNESCO) World Heritage Sites of India. The Embassy shared an invitation for the event with a video message from India's Ambassador to Azerbaijan, Abhay Kumar. "Ambassador Abhay Kumar's message inviting you to the Opening of Permanent Exhibition on UNESCO World Heritage Sites of India and Indian Street Food Festival on 18th of July, 6 PM at Embassy of India, Baku," the Embassy wrote on X. "We are delighted to present a permanent exhibition on UNESCO World Heritage Sites of India in Baku.



Venezuela setting up diplomatic mission in US

Caracas, July 21 : A delegation is currently in Washington to establish Venezuela's diplomatic mission in the United States, the Venezuelan Foreign Ministry has announced. In the delegation are Vice Foreign Minister for Europe and North America Oliver Blanco, as well as Felix Plasencia, who has been appointed charge d'affaires for the Venezuelan embassy in the United States. In a video shared on social media on Tuesday (local time), Blanco said that the delegation has held meetings with the US Deputy Secretary of State Christopher Landau and other senior officials as part of the working agenda. Plasencia noted that the visit aims to address issues of concern to Venezuelan citizens, reports Xinhua news agency.

Protest erupt in Pakistan-occupied Gilgit-Baltistan over appointment of controversial personalities

Islamabad, July 21 : The GB Youth Movement staged a protest in the Chinarbagh region of Pakistan-occupied Gilgit-Baltistan (PoGB) against the inclusion of controversial personalities in the so-called caretaker government, local media reported on Tuesday. Political and civil society members also announced protests in Ghanche, Nagar and Shigar districts over the lack of representation in the so-called caretaker cabinet, Pakistan's leading daily, Dawn, reported. Protesters stated that several controversial people were included in the so-called cabinet and stressed that the inclusion of such figures in the caretaker cabinet was part of an attempt at election rigging in the upcoming general elections, and termed it unacceptable. The protesters called for representation of educated youth and neutral people in the cabinet. They announced that a sit-in protest will



be held until the decision to appoint the so-called cabinet members is revoked. During the protest, demonstrators blocked River Road in Chinarbagh, and later, police arrested eight protesters, including the chairman of the GB Youth Movement. Last month, a report stated that upcoming polls in PoGB would be meaningless until the region has its own provisional constitution

and the Assembly has authority to legislate over resources. Nationalists have demanded reinstatement of state subject rule, legislative autonomy, and reunification with India to secure cultural survival, resource control, and democratic self-determination. Locals have continued to remind Pakistan of the United Nations Security Council resolution,



Gangsters sustain bullet injuries after trying to escape from police custody in Punjab

Chandigarh, July 21 : In a major action by the Jalandhar Commissionerate Police, two gangsters of the Kaushal-Bambiha gang sustained critical injuries while attempting to escape from the police custody at the outskirts of Jalandhar cantonment in Punjab, Director General of Police (DGP) Gaurav Yadav said here on Tuesday. He said two pistols along with five cartridges were recovered from their possession. Both the gangsters, Rajeshwar Kumar and Deepak Vaid, were arrested after their names cropped up during follow-up investigations in the Arms Act case registered on October 17. As per the information, police teams had arrested four members of this Kaushal-Bambiha module and recovered four weapons from their possession.



South Korea's President condoles coal mine explosion in China

Seoul, July 21 : South Korea's President Lee Jae Myung on Tuesday expressed condolences over a deadly gas explosion at a coal mine in China's Shanxi province, voicing hope for a swift recovery from the tragedy. "I pray for the souls of those who lost their lives in the tragic accident, and express my deep condolences and sympathies to the bereaved families and to the people of China," Lee wrote on the social media platform X. He also posted the message in Chinese, Yonhap news agency reported. The South Korean President expressed hope that the situation would be brought swiftly under control through the efforts of the Chinese government and relevant authorities, and wished a speedy recovery to all those who were injured in the explosion. At least 82 people were killed

in the gas explosion that occurred at the Liushenyu coal mine in northern China on Friday, according to media reports. On Saturday, Prime Minister Narendra Modi also conveyed his condolences to Chinese President Xi Jinping over the loss of lives in a mining accident in Shanxi Province. "Saddened by the loss of lives in a mining accident in China's Shanxi Province. On behalf of the people of India, my condolences to President Xi Jinping and the people of China. May the bereaved families find strength in this tragic hour. Praying for the early and safe recovery.

FMs of South Korea, Ukraine agree to handle issue of North Korean POWs in line with humanitarian principles



Seoul, July 21 : The foreign ministers of South Korea and Ukraine have agreed to make efforts to resolve the issue of two North Korean soldiers captured during the Russia-Ukraine war in accordance with international law and humanitarian principles, Seoul's foreign ministry said on Tuesday. Foreign Minister Cho Hyun and his Ukrainian counterpart, Andrii Sybiha, discussed the issue of North Korean prisoners of war (POWs) and other matters during their talks in

France on Tuesday (local time) on the sidelines of a meeting of Group of Seven (G7) foreign ministers, the ministry said. Two North Korean soldiers were captured by Ukrainian forces in January last year while fighting alongside Russia, reports Yonhap news agency. The Korean government has voiced a willingness to receive them through consultations with Ukraine, as the POWs have reportedly expressed their wish to come to South Korea instead of returning home. On March 6, Cho told a parliamentary session in Seoul that Ukraine has assured that the two North Korean soldiers will not be repatriated to Russia amid concerns that they could be transferred to the North against their will. Earlier this month, Rep. Yu Yong-weon of the main opposition People Power Party said after visiting Ukraine that Russia had included the two soldiers on its list of prisoners it demanded be released in a POW exchange. Separately, Cho attended the G7 foreign ministers' meeting held Thursday and Friday near Paris to discuss maritime security and other global issues. He also held bilateral talks with his counterparts from eight countries, including the United States and France.

82 Japanese local assemblies urge Takaichi govt to uphold non-nuclear principles

Tokyo, July 21 : A total of 82 local assemblies across Japan have submitted written opinions to the central government or the parliament urging the administration of Prime Minister Sanae Takaichi to uphold Japan's Three Non-Nuclear Principles or enshrine them into law, local media reported. Since the Takaichi administration took office in October last year, opinions concerning the principles have been adopted by five prefectural assemblies, 48 city assemblies and 29 town and ward assemblies, while none of the submissions called for revising the Three Non-Nuclear Principles, according to a report by Kyodo News.

The sharp increase marks a significant contrast with previous administrations, which received either no such opinions or only a handful. The surge reflects growing public concern over possible moves by the Takaichi government to alter Japan's long-standing non-nuclear policy, reports Xinhua, quoting Kyodo. Japan's Three Non-Nuclear Principles, which prohibit possessing, producing or permitting the introduction of nuclear weapons into Japanese territory, were formally adopted by the Japanese parliament in 1971 and have since become the cornerstone of the country's nuclear policy. Local media previously reported that the Takaichi government was considering revising the principle prohibiting the introduction of



nuclear weapons into Japan. The reported move has sparked widespread concern among various sectors of Japanese society. Earlier this year, the city assemblies of Hiroshima and Nagasaki adopted statements urging the Japanese government to adhere to the country's Three Non-Nuclear Principles. The Hiroshima City Assembly unanimously adopted its statement in January.



Inflation is choice, high price growth would not continue under my leadership, says US Fed chief

Washington, July 21 : Federal Reserve Chairman Kevin Warsh has said that "inflation is a choice" and pledged that persistently high price growth would not continue under his leadership, signalling that restoring price stability remains the US central bank's overriding priority despite uncertainty over artificial intelligence, geopolitical tensions and other economic risks. Appearing before the Senate Banking Committee on Tuesday (local time) for his first semi-annual monetary policy.

Pakistan's energy crisis rooted in policy failures: Report

New Delhi, July 21 : Pakistan's deepening energy crisis and rising burden of circular debt are the result of years of flawed policy decisions, expensive imported fuel dependence and weak regulatory oversight rather than the International Monetary Fund (IMF) alone, according to a strongly worded analysis examining the country's power sector. The report cited by The Tribune Express argued that Pakistan's energy sector problems worsened significantly after the Nawaz Sharif-led government returned to power in 2013 and cleared nearly Rs 480 billion in circular debt within weeks of taking office. The move coincided with the launch of the China-Pakistan



Economic Corridor under China's Belt and Road Initiative. According to the analysis, Chinese officials had advised Pakistan to prioritise renewable energy projects such as solar, wind and hydropower. However, the country instead focused on imported liquefied natural gas (LNG)-based and coal-fired power plants dependent on imported fuel priced in US dollars.

PM Vidyalaxmi scheme will ease financial barriers to higher education: Students

New Delhi, July 21 : The Union Cabinet has approved a new scheme - PM Vidyalaxmi, aimed at providing financial support to meritorious yet needy students in pursuing higher studies at top-ranking institutions across the country. The scheme offering collateral-free and guarantee-free loans to students have left the latter happy and elated. Many of them spoke to IANS and shared how this will remove the obstructions and financial constraints that usually in their way in pursuing higher edu-

cation. They expressed optimism over the scheme, with many praising Modi government for the initiative. Ayushi Singh, a student at Jamia Millia Islamia, described the scheme as a significant step toward women's empowerment. "I have just read about the Vidya Lakshmi scheme launched by PM Modi. This scheme opens up opportunities for girls who may otherwise be denied education due to financial issues. It encourages families to educate their daughters and gives them a chance to

progress," she said. She further highlighted that the scheme, offering up to Rs 7.5 lakh in financial aid, would help students to explore more career options. "This is a substantial amount, and past governments may have offered similar schemes, but none quite at this scale. Such scholarships not only propel students forward but also instill courage to make a difference in society," she added. Sahil Alam, another student at Jamia Millia Islamia, pursuing a BA (Hons) in Mass Media, emphasised the scheme's im-



pact on middle-class families. "This scheme provides critical support for children from poorer backgrounds who struggle to pay for their education. Many families can't afford schooling, especially when children have to work to support themselves. It's commend-

able that the government has included special provisions for economically disadvantaged students, encouraging them to pursue their studies and contribute to the nation," he said. Himang Dwivedi, a second-year BA (Hons) Mass Media student at Jamia Millia

Islamia, echoed these sentiments, noting the scheme's focus on students from economically weaker sections, particularly girls. "Under the Vidya Lakshmi scheme, all girls and students from underprivileged families will have greater access to education.

White House says inflation falls to six-year low

Washington, July 21 : The White House has hailed the latest inflation figures as evidence that President Donald Trump's economic policies are delivering results, pointing to falling consumer prices, rising real wages and lower prices at major retailers as signs that the administration's agenda is benefiting American families. Opening the daily White House briefing on Tuesday, Press Secretary Karoline Leavitt said the latest Consumer Price Index (CPI) report had exceeded expectations. "Tuesday's CPI report confirmed what President

Trump predicted -- prices are falling, and this administration's economic policies are working," she added. "Inflation dropped 0.4 per cent last month, beating expectations and marking the largest monthly decline in more than six years." Leavitt said price declines were recorded across several sectors. "Prices fell, including for gasoline, electricity, non-prescription drugs, car insurance, medical care services and hotels, delivering relief for American working families." She also highlighted gains in workers' earnings. "We also saw real weekly earnings rise in the month of June. For private sector workers, real wages

have increased by roughly \$1,000 since President Trump took office, after falling nearly \$3,000 during the previous administration." Calling the figures "real progress", Leavitt said the administration remained focused on reducing household costs. "There is still more work to do, no doubt, which is why President Trump remains

laser focused on lowering costs and raising wages for working families across the country." The White House also welcomed recent announcements by major retailers to cut prices. "Just last week, Walmart and Sam's Club announced they will be lowering prices.

Uganda discharges last Ebola patient, begins 42-day countdown to end outbreak



Kampala, July 21 : Uganda on Tuesday discharged its last Ebola patient after the person tested negative for the virus, marking the start of the country's 42-day countdown to declare the outbreak over if no new cases are detected. Uganda's Minister of Health, Chris Baryo muni, presided over the symbolic discharge ceremony at Mulago National Referral Hospital in the capital, Kampala. During the

ceremony, Baryomunsi presented the patient with an Ebola discharge certificate stating that he no longer poses a risk of transmitting the virus after testing negative, Xinhua news agency reported. "His current state of health does not constitute a danger to the community and can therefore return to his household and professional environment and continue with his normal activities," the minister said. "The community and the authorities are requested to accept him in order to promote his social reintegration," he added.

After losing Kerala, Pinarayi Vijayan faces resentment within party



Thiruvananthapuram, July 21 : For perhaps the first time in his six-decade-long public life, Pinarayi Vijayan finds himself politically cornered, not by his political adversaries alone, but from within the very party structure he once controlled with unquestioned authority. The stunning electoral debacle suffered by the CPI(M) in Kerala has triggered an unprecedented backlash against Vijayan across party committees, from grassroots area meetings to the party's national leadership forums. The man who for nearly a quarter century remained the undisputed power centre of Kerala CPI(M), and for the past decade ran the government with an iron grip where

little moved without his approval, is now facing criticism on a scale rarely witnessed in the party's tightly disciplined history. What has particularly rattled the Kerala leadership is the outright rejection by the CPI(M) Central Committee of the state unit's argument that there was no anti-incumbency sentiment in Kerala. Leaders at the national level reportedly questioned how the party could collapse so dramatically if public resentment against the government did not exist. The criticism has not remained confined to Delhi. At area committee meetings in Kerala, party members openly accused Vijayan's style and public remarks of alienating ordinary people from the CPI(M). At the Chalakudy Area Committee, members reportedly stated that the former Chief Minister's words and approach distanced voters from the party.

Afghan police seize illegal drugs, arrest seven smugglers in Western Afghanistan

Kabul, July 21: The counter-narcotics police in the fight against illegal drugs have discovered hundreds of kilograms of materials during a series of operations in western Afghanistan's Nimroz province, the counter-narcotics police commander in the province, Mawlawi Esmatullah Ahmad, said

Tuesday. The contraband, which includes 84 kg of opium, 130 kg of methamphetamine, and more than 200 kg of other illegal objects used in manufacturing opium and heroin, has been seized over the past week, the official asserted. Police have also arrested seven persons on charges of involvement in smuggling illegal drugs in the province, the official added,

Xinhua News Agency reported. Similarly, police in the drive against illegal drugs set ablaze 730 kg of opium publicly in the northern Badakhshan province on Wednesday. On July 4, Afghan police confiscated 60 kg of illicit drugs and arrested two suspected drug smugglers in a targeted operation in northern Takhar province, a local



police official reported. The smugglers had concealed 52 kg of opium and 8 kg of hashish in hidden sections within a vehicle while attempting to transport it to an unknown destination. However, police uncovered the drugs during the raid.

Aid group resumes activities at famine-hit camp in Sudan

Port Sudan, July 21 : The non-governmental medical aid group Doctors Without Borders (MSF) announced that it has resumed activities in a famine-hit camp for internally displaced persons in El Fasher, the capital of Sudan's North Darfur State. "After 60 days, we have resumed our full outpatient nutritional program as we finally received 2,433 boxes of life-saving Ready-to-Use Therapeutic Foods (RUTFs) and other medical supplies," the MSF said on social platform X.

"This is only enough for five weeks," the organisation added, noting, "We ran so low on therapeutic food supplies in September that we had to stop providing life-saving treatment to 5,000 children under five in the midst of an intense hunger crisis." In early August, MSF reported it was forced to reduce the number of malnourished children receiving treatment at the Zamzam camp, one of the largest camps for the displaced in Sudan's Darfur region, due to a medical supply blockade imposed by the paramilitary Rapid Support

Forces (RSF). Sudan has been ravaged by a deadly conflict between the Sudanese Armed Forces (SAF) and the RSF since mid-April 2023. According to a situation report issued by the Armed Conflict Location & Event Data Project on October 14.



Turkey expects tariff relief from new US administration: Trade minister



Ankara, July 21 : Turkey expects the new US administration to lower tariffs on its steel and textile exports following the re-election of Donald Trump as the US President, Turkish Trade Minister Omer Bolat said. Bolat made the remarks on Tuesday when speaking to local broadcaster A Haber. "We expect improvements in bilateral relations, including the removal of certain embargoes on our defence industry's needs," he said. The Turkish Minister added that Turkish companies and banks face significant pressures from sanctions on Russia, expressing hope that "these pressures would be alleviated and eventually removed". Bolat also expected a more balanced and fair approach to-

wards the region from the new US administration, Xinhua news agency reported. However, in 2018, then-President Trump authorised higher tariffs on imports from Turkey, imposing a 20-per cent duty on aluminum and a 50-per cent one on steel, as tensions mounted between the two sides over Ankara's detention of an American pastor and other diplomatic issues. Trump has promised to levy a 10 per cent tariff on all imported goods, to restrict migration, and to quickly end wars taking place in Turkey's north and south, in Ukraine and the Palestinian territory of Gaza respectively. Trump's sweeping US presidential victory on Wednesday helped spark a rally of as much as 0.4 per cent in Turkey's lira, to 34.2 to the dollar, its strongest level since mid-October. Bolat said he expected the Trump administration, to begin in January, would benefit Turkey's defence industry needs, despite past US sanctions that were levelled under Trump's first term over Ankara's purchase of Russian S-400 missile defences. He also said he expected fallout on banks to ease from Washington's current Russia-related embargoes over Moscow's war in Ukraine. Trump's promised trade and immigration policies could also leave Turkey relatively unscathed among large emerging market (EM) economies such as Brazil, Mexico and China, bankers said. "The Turkey trade is a relative outperformer within global EMs with the Trump victory," said Blaise Antin, head of EM sovereign research at asset manager TCW in Los Angeles.

India-US ties entering positive phase: Ajay Bisaria

Washington, July 21 : Former Indian High Commissioner to Pakistan and Canada Ajay Bisaria has said the India-US relationship is entering a "very positive phase" after months of strain under President Donald Trump's second term, even as concerns remain over Washington's handling of Pakistan and its rhetoric towards India. In an exclusive interview with IANS, Bisaria described US Secretary of State Marco Rubio's India visit as both a reassurance exercise and a strategic reset after what he called the "bad dream" period of Trump-era tariffs. "But the Rubio visit is partially also a damage control visit," Bisaria said. "Because I think it was overdue in the sense of some signals of reassurance politically of reassurance from the US were required."



Zambia power utility extends daily power supply to seven hours

Lusaka, July 21 : Zambia's national power utility has announced that consumers will have a power supply for seven hours a day, up from three hours. Zesco Ltd said in a statement that the daily rotational power supply hours were extended after tariffs were raised. "This adjustment aims to enhance service reliability by optimising power imports and maximising contributions from independent power producers wherever possible," the statement said. It warned that occasional changes may occur due to factors like power import availability or unexpected challenges, Xinhua news agency reported. Last month, the Energy Regulation Board, the country's energy regulator, allowed Zesco to raise electricity prices, and one of the conditions it set was the provision of a seven-hour daily power supply. Zesco had applied for the emergency rate hike to enable the utility to raise \$15 million a month from retail customers to contribute toward the importation of 788 megawatts of power to ease the shortage.

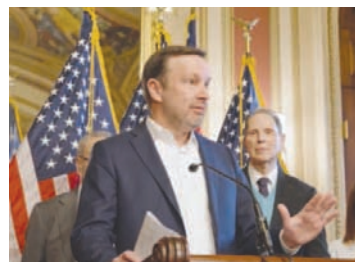


Zanzibar President to visit India, hold talks with VP Radhakrishnan

Zanzibar City/New Delhi, July 21 : Zanzibar President Hussein Ali Mwinyi will be on an official visit to India from July 17-22 at the invitation of Vice President C P Radhakrishnan. During the visit, Mwinyi and Vice President Radhakrishnan will hold talks to review the full spectrum of India-Tanzania ties and explore new avenues for future collaboration. External Affairs Minister (EAM) Jaishankar will also call on President Myinyi, the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) stated. For his visit to India, Hussein Ali Mwinyi will be accompanied by his wife and a high-level delegation comprising ministers and senior officials. President Mwinyi will be the Chief Guest at the 63rd Convocation Ceremony of the Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) Madras in Chennai.

US Democrats say Trump bypassed Congress on Venezuela

Washington, July 21 : US Democratic lawmakers accused President Donald Trump of bypassing Congress and misleading lawmakers by using military force to arrest Venezuelan leader Nicolas Maduro without authorization. Speaking on CNN's State of the Union, Senator Chris Murphy of Connecticut said the operation amounted to an illegal act of war. "This is wildly illegal," Murphy told CNN, arguing that the president cannot conduct a military operation of that scale in a foreign country without congressional approval. Murphy said the administration initially briefed lawmakers by describ-



ing the mission as a counter-narcotics effort, only for officials to later acknowledge the use of US military assets. "They came to Congress and literally lied to our face," Murphy said on CNN. Murphy rejected claims that Venezuela posed an imminent threat to the United States.

Nations must dramatically increase climate adaptation efforts: UN Environment

Nairobi, July 21 : As climate impacts intensify and hit the world's most vulnerable hardest, the "Adaptation Gap Report 2024: Come Hell and High Water", from the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP), on Tuesday found that nations must dramatically increase climate adaptation efforts, starting with a commit-

ment to act on finance at COP29. Global average temperature rise is approaching 1.5 degrees Celsius above pre-industrial levels, and the latest estimates from UNEP's Emissions Gap Report put the world on course for a catastrophic rise of 2.6-3.1 degrees this century without immediate and major cuts to greenhouse gas emissions.

Released just ahead of the COP29 climate talks in Baku, Azerbaijan, the report finds that there is an urgent need to significantly scale-up adaptation this decade to address rising impacts. But this is being hampered by the huge gap that exists between adaptation finance needs and current international public adaptation finance flows.



Iran warns of 'crushing' regional infrastructure as it strikes US bases in Kuwait, Bahrain, Jordan

Tehran, July 21: Iran's main military command, Khatam al-Anbiya Central Headquarters, warned on Tuesday that any US attack on Iranian power plants and bridges would trigger a devastating response against all infrastructure across West Asia. The warning came as Iranian forces struck US bases in Kuwait, Bahrain and Jordan. US President Donald Trump had said that the United States would expand its strikes on Iran to target power plants and bridges next week unless Tehran agrees to negotiate. The US military has launched several waves of strikes against Iran's southern provinces over the past few days, claiming that the attacks were in response to the Iranian armed forces targeting vessels in the Strait of Hormuz and aimed at "degrading Iran's ability to threaten commercial shipping."

Police demolish 1,000 acres of poppy farms in Northern Afghanistan

Kabul, July 21 : Afghan police have destroyed around 1,000 acres of poppy fields in Samangan province, north of Afghanistan, over the past two days in a drive against illegal crops and illicit drugs, provincial police spokesman Hashmatullah Rahmani said Tuesday. During the counter-narcotics operations, which commenced recently in Dara-i-Suf Payen district and covered several

villages, around 1,000 acres of land have been cleansed of poppy since the weekend, the official said, Xinhua News Agency reported. The official added that stern action will be taken against anyone who produces or traffics illegal drugs. Police have earlier reported the destruction of hundreds of acres of poppy farms in Baghlan, Takhar and Badakhshan provinces over the past couple of weeks.



On May 10, the provincial police office said that Afghan police have destroyed nearly 400 acres of land cultivated with narcotic crops in northern Afghanistan's Baghlan province.

Two brothers disappear after being detained by Pakistani forces

Quetta, July 21 : An incident of enforced disappearance by Pakistani forces has come to light from the Dasht-e-Ballangur area of Kech district, Balochistan province of Pakistan, local media reported.



'Sit quietly and clap': Samson reflects on early struggles at T20 WC

New Delhi, July 21 : India wicketkeeper-batter Sanju Samson has revealed how he came to terms with missing out on the spot in India's XI at the ICC Men's T20 World Cup 2026 after a disappointing series against New Zealand, saying he knew his hopes were over once Ishan Kishan's explosive performances pushed him ahead in the selection race. Reflecting on the turning point in his international career, Samson admitted he could see the selectors' thinking change as Kishan grabbed his opportunity. "After that, Ishan came in, and his story was completely different. He wasn't even in the team. He won Jharkhand the Syed Mushtaq Ali Trophy almost single-handedly, then came into the Indian team and was batting on a different level altogether. I could clearly see that Ishan was moving above me in the pecking order," Samson told JioStar.



'Unfinished businesses': Swimmer Sajan Prakash targets CWG, Asian Games podium

New Delhi, July 21 : Returning to competitive swimming after taking a break due to a severe 'burnout' post the Paris Olympics, veteran Indian swimmer Sajan Prakash believes that understanding the critical role of rest and recovery has been the defining pillar of his comeback as he set his sights on the podium finish at the Commonwealth Games, starting in Glasgow on Thursday, and Asian Games in September. Prakash, 32, has qualified for both the Com-

monwealth Games and the upcoming Asian Games, set to take place in Aichi-Nagoya, Japan, by breaching the Swimming Federation of India's qualification mark in the men's 200m butterfly event. He recently reached Glasgow after finishing extensive training camps in Edinburgh and Sierra Nevada, Spain.



FIFA WC: 'I will continue to give my all,' Fernandez breaks silence after red card in FIFA WC final

New Delhi, July 21 : Argentina midfielder Enzo Fernandez has vowed to keep giving everything for his country after breaking his silence following the FIFA World Cup final defeat to Spain, a match that saw him sent off late before the team's title defence ended in

heartbreak. Spain edged Argentina 1-0 after extra time at New York New Jersey Stadium on Monday, with Ferran Torres scoring the decisive goal. Fernandez's dismissal in second-half stoppage time left Lionel Scaloni's side with 10 men for the closing stages before the European champions clinched the title.



'Both teams will have equal chance of winning,' says Raza ahead of T20Is against India

Harare, July 21 : Zimbabwe skipper Sikandar Raza has dismissed the thought of the 2026 T20 World Cup champions India being favourites in the upcoming three-match T20I series, saying the contest will not be one-sided and both teams will have an equal chance of emerging victorious. Zimbabwe are hosting the Shreyas Iyer-led side, with all three matches of the series to be held at the Harare Sports Club. The first match will be played on Thursday. India is coming to the contest after a poor show against Ireland and England. Under the new captain, Iyer, the team endured a 0-2 T20I series defeat to Ireland in Belfast before going down 0-4 in the five-match T20I series against England.

Seven Indians progress to next round at Junior World Squash

Niagara-on-the-Lake (Canada), July 21 : India have kickstarted their campaign at the World Squash Junior Championships strongly with women's top seed Anahat Singh, who is hoping to become India's first-ever junior world champion, advancing into the

next round after a straight-game 11-2, 11-1, 11-3 against Australia's Lilly Wilson. Amidst the excitement of the opening day, India's Saanvi Kalanki was able to impress and book her place into the next round after enduring a five-game battle against the Netherlands' seed, Elcke Mols, 11-9, 9-11, 11-8, 7-11, 11-6.

Kalanki, who took the lead in the opener, 11-9, was forced into a back-and-forth battle, with Mols levelling the scoreline twice to force a fifth game.



'They cannot touch Virat, Rohit if they want to play': Ashwin backs senior stars for 2027 WC
