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PM Modi's global honours tally reaches 35 with Indonesia's top award



Jakarta, July 7 : The 'Bintang Adipurna of the Republic of Indonesia' has become the latest addition to Prime Minister Narendra Modi's growing list of international honours, taking the total number of global awards conferred upon him to 35. The Bintang Adipurna, also known as the "Medal of

Honour", is the highest civilian honour awarded by Indonesia. It is presented to individuals who have rendered exceptional service towards the unity, continuity and prosperity of the Republic of Indonesia. With this recognition, Prime Minister Modi has now received 35 international honours from countries across Asia, Europe, Africa and the Americas since 2016, the highest number received by any Indian Prime Minister. Some of these decorations have centuries-old histories. Last month, Seychelles honoured Prime Minister Modi with the 'Guardian of the Blue Horizon', the island nation's highest distinction for leadership in environmental conservation and sustainable development. The Prime Minister dedicated that honour to all nations working together to address the global challenge of climate change and those committed to environmental protection for future generations. The Seychelles award also recognised PM Modi's sustained emphasis on sustainable development and his long-standing commitment to promoting environmentally responsible growth. Among the most notable international honours con-



ferred upon the Prime Minister is Bhutan's 'Order of the Druk Gyalpo', the country's highest civilian decoration, presented by the King of Bhutan. PM Modi became the first foreign head of government to receive the prestigious honour. He was also awarded the 'Grand Commander of the Order of the Niger' by Nigeria, becoming only the second foreign dignitary after Queen Elizabeth II to receive the distinction. Similarly, Israel's 'Medal of the Knesset' was also presented to Prime Minister Modi during his visit earlier this year, making him the inaugural recipient of the honour. Egypt honoured him with the 'Order of the Nile', the country's highest state decoration, presented by President Abdel Fattah El-Sisi.

No more salary delays : Revanth orders action against errant agencies

Hyderabad, July 7 : Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy has announced the constitution of an official committee to strengthen digital governance in the Telangana state. The committee will have to submit a report in 100 days. To streamline the prompt payment of salaries of contract and outsourcing employees, the Chief Minister instructed the authorities to take action against the agencies which are not functioning in tune with the government's goals. Revanth Reddy on Tuesday held a review of the problems facing the contract and outsourcing employees. During the review meeting, he said that strict action must be taken against the agencies



which are not paying salaries promptly to the contract and outsourcing agencies even after the release of funds by the government. The Chief Minister sought the details of the implementation of the digital governance and instructed the officials to formulate plans for digital governance and draft the necessary legislation. He emphasised that the administrative system should move forward through full-scale digitisation.

KCR calls on grandson Himansh

Telangana not just a hub, but a role model for global AI standards: Bhatti

Hyderabad, July 7 : Deputy Chief Minister Bhatti Vikramarka stated that the state is not only attracting investments, but also integrating environmental protection and social responsibility, thereby positioning itself as a guiding force for AI standards. He, along with Industries and IT Minister Duddilla Sridhar Babu, inaugurated the "Green Growth Economic Summit – The Hyderabad Collective" at HICC in Hyderabad on Tuesday. The summit, organised under the aegis of "The Me-

ridian Collective," will be held over two days. Addressing delegates from various countries, the Deputy Chief Minister emphasised that AI is not just about cloud computing and servers, but also involves critical resources such as electricity, water, land, and human capital. "We are not opposing AI, but we are guiding the world on how AI should be developed," he clarified. Bhatti Vikramarka said that Telangana is emerging as a hub for AI by promoting renewable energy and responsible resource management instead of depleting natural resources like water and electricity.

BJP flags 'Sir irregularities' to Telangana CEO, seeks immediate intervention



Hyderabad, July 7 : The Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) has submitted a representation to the Telangana Chief Electoral Officer (CEO), alleging irregularities in the ongoing Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of electoral rolls and seeking immediate corrective measures to ensure a transparent and impartial verification process. Led by Telangana BJP president N Ramchander Rao, along with BJP Election Commission Affairs Committee Chairman Marri Shashidhar Reddy and other senior leaders, the party claimed that Booth Level Officers (BLOs).



Govt approves 360 crore for permanent revenue, registration offices : Ponguleti

Hyderabad, July 7 : Minister for Revenue, Housing, and Information & Public Relations, Ponguleti Srinivasa Reddy announced that the administrative approvals amounting to ₹360 crore have been granted for the construction of permanent buildings for Tahsildar, RDO, and Sub-Registrar offices in Telangana. The Minister said this initiative aims to enhance revenue administration in the state and deliver modern, respectful services to the public. During a review meeting with officials on Tuesday about construction projects, the Minister revealed that the first phase will involve the construction of new buildings at an allocation of ₹263 crore to replace 107 deteriorating Tahsildar offices and 10 RDO offices that are currently housed in rented facilities. Furthermore, ₹97 crore has been earmarked for the establishment of 48 Sub-Registrar offices, as well as District Registrar offices in Adilabad, Khammam, and Mahabubnagar districts, and DIG offices in Nizamabad and Warangal districts. The administrative approvals amounting to 360 crore have been granted for these construction projects, he said. Ponguleti Srinivas Reddy emphasised that all these buildings will adhere to a standardised design and will be outfitted with modern facilities, aiming to deliver efficient and transparent services to the public.

Warangal Cong rift rekindles as Konda Surekha targets Kadiyam Srihari

Warangal, July 7 : The simmering political differences between Telangana Minister Konda Surekha and senior MLA Kadiyam Srihari have resurfaced, bringing internal Congress tensions in the undivided Warangal district back into focus. The latest flashpoint arose after Kadiyam Srihari conducted a special review meeting with the district officials on Assembly constituency issues and sought a comprehensive master plan for the undivided Warangal district. Objecting strongly, Konda Surekha accused the MLA of overstepping his jurisdiction and interfering in district-level administration and to pressure officials in violation of protocol. Taking the issue to the party leadership, Surekha has reportedly written to the AICC leadership.



Andhra Pradesh’s Rayalaseema region hit hard by El Nino

Amaravati, July 7 : Andhra Pradesh's Rayalaseema region has been significantly affected by the El Nino effect, with moderate to severe rainfall deficit in 11 districts, officials said on Tuesday.

Andhra Pradesh Home and Disaster Management Minister Vangalapudi Anitha reviewed the impact of the Southwest Monsoon and El Nino in the state. The high-level review meeting was held at the Andhra Pradesh State Disaster Management Authority (APSDMA) headquarters in Tadepalli regarding the rainfall deficit and dry weather conditions in the state. The meeting noted that

Rayalaseema districts are significantly affected by El Nino. Severe rainfall deficit was observed in Sri Sathya Sai, Anantapur, and Annamayya districts, while moderate rainfall deficit was noted in Kurnool, Nandyal, Chittoor, Kadapa, Prakasam, Markapuram, Nellore, and Tirupati districts. Anitha directed officials to create awareness among farmers regarding alternative crops in drought-prone mandals. The minister comprehensively reviewed issues such as the rainfall deficit and dry spells associated with the current Southwest Monsoon, their impact on the agricultural sector, drinking water availability, drought mitigation measures, and disaster manage-

ment preparedness. Officials from various departments and agencies participated in this high-level meeting, including APSDMA MD Prakhara Jain, state police, fire services, army, navy, air force, the NDRF, the SDRF, Agriculture, Horticulture, Animal Husbandry, Rural Water Supply, Municipal Administration, Panchayat Raj, Water Resources, Electricity, Roads & Buildings (R&B), and Civil Supplies. The minister directed officials to implement effective measures to mitigate the impact of disasters, emphasising that the state government's goal is to ensure zero loss of life due to disasters. She said special control rooms



must be established to operate round-the-clock at both state and district levels. She also asked the departments to prepare plans to evacuate residents from low-lying areas vulnerable to floods. Measures must be taken to ensure the availability of food, drinking water, and medical services at rehabilitation centres. There should be no disruption to essential services such as drinking water and electricity supply, she said and asked the police, fire, NDRF, and APSDRF teams to remain ready for emergency response.

Bhogapuram Airport To Be India's Best Airport : Union Minister Rammohan Naidu

Amaravati, July 7 : Union Minister Rammohan Naidu said that the work of Bhogapuram Airport has been completed quickly. A review meeting of the final touches of Bhogapuram International Airport was held on Tuesday. Speaking on the occasion, the Union Minister said that the central and state governments, along with GMR, have built a magnificent airport. He said that Chief Minister Chandrababu Naidu came here in the first month of the coalition government coming to

power and ordered the construction to be started earlier than the planned time. He said that GMR has built the airport on time as per those orders. The Union Minister said that the aerodrome license has also been received. He said that the inauguration of the airport will be held by Prime Minister Narendra Modi. Operations will be carried out a week after the airport opens. The Union Minister said that the date will be announced after Modi's schedule is finalized. He said that the operations of Visakhapatnam Airport will be shifted to Bhogapuram in the coming days. He said that the terminal construction will be done so that 4 crore people can travel. He said that a 78,000 square meter terminal building has been constructed. Bhogapuram Airport is said to be the best airport design in



the country. He said that the interior design has been undertaken to uphold the arts and traditions of Uttarandhra. Union Minister Rammohan Naidu said that Bhogapuram will remain the best airport in the country.

Jagan should apologize: MLA Kotam Reddy



Nellore, July 7 : Nellore Rural MLA Kotamreddy Sridhar Reddy strongly objected to former Chief Minister and YSRCP president Jagan Mohan Reddy extending support to Prashna Ravan, alleging that he made remarks against Hindu deities, traditions, and customs. Addressing a press conference at his office on Tuesday, Kotamreddy said he was speaking not merely as an MLA but as an ordinary Indian citizen. He stated that he is proud to be an Indian and a Hindu, adding that Hinduism has taught him to respect people of all religions. He recalled that he had spoken out when objectionable remarks were made against Prophet Muhammad and had also stood in support of Christians. He questioned why Jagan Mohan Reddy was now supporting a person who, according to him, had made offensive remarks against Hindu deities. "Whether someone believes in God or not is a personal choice, but who gave Prashna Ravan the right to insult Hindu gods?" he asked. Kotamreddy further questioned Jagan, saying, "On one hand you say 'Hey Ram,' and on the other you support Ravan. What has happened to you, Jagan?" He said he was asking these questions out of concern and urged Jagan to listen to the statements allegedly made by Prashna Ravan against Lord Rama, the Ramayana, and the Mahabharata. The MLA claimed that several cases had already been registered against Prashna Ravan and alleged that he had spoken in a manner supporting extremists. He argued that if such actions did not warrant serious legal action, including charges of sedition, then what would. Kotamreddy alleged that Prashna Ravan's statements could create hatred between communities and criticized Jagan Mohan Reddy for supporting such an individual.

India plans to position
Ayurveda as a pillar of global healthcare by 2047

NITI Aayog, in collaboration with PwC, has released a report titled Strategic Roadmap for Making Ayurveda Global that sets out a phased plan to transform Ayurveda from a largely India-centric traditional system into a globally recognised healthcare framework by 2047. The report observes that Ayurveda today enjoys formal recognition in nearly 30 countries, with varying degrees of licensing and integration into national health policies. India has a robust ecosystem with over 355,000 trained practitioners, with 95 per cent of them remaining within the country, leaving a limited international workforce. Exports of Ayurvedic products have grown steadily, doubling from USD 1.09 billion in 2014 to USD 2.16 billion in 2023 and reaching around 150 countries. However, most exports are categorised as dietary supplements rather than medicines, reflecting regulatory barriers abroad. International research collaborations are expanding, the report notes, with nearly 70 countries now engaged in Ayurveda-related studies. The establishment of the WHO Global Traditional Medicine Centre in Jamnagar has further boosted credibility. Educational outreach is also growing, with scholarships offered to international students and Ayush academic chairs established in foreign universities. Still, standardised global curricula remain a work in progress. Acceptability, too, is uneven. While Ayurveda is increasingly visible in wellness tourism and integrative medicine centres, mainstream healthcare systems remain cautious. Insurance coverage for Ayurvedic services is rare outside India, and regulatory compliance remains a hurdle. Quality assurance gaps, inconsistent GMP adoption, and concerns over contaminants have slowed wider adoption. The report draws a sharp comparison with Traditional Chinese Medicine (TCM), which has achieved far greater global penetration. TCM's success is attributed to mission-scale state support, deep R&D funding, and proactive diplomacy. China has reportedly established over 30 overseas TCM centres, integrated TCM into free trade agreements, and secured recognition through ISO standards. Ayurveda, by contrast, suffers from fragmented regulation, limited practitioner licensure abroad, and insufficient harmonised pharmacopeial standards. Since the creation of the Ministry of Ayush in 2014, India has launched multiple initiatives to enhance Ayurveda's global visibility. These include signing over 75 MoUs with foreign governments and institutions; establishing Ayush Information Cells in 39 countries; launching the Ayush Visa in 2022 to facilitate medical value travel; creating the Ayush Export Promotion Council (AyushExcil); collaborating with the WHO to establish the Global Traditional Medicine Centre in Jamnagar; integrating Ayurveda into the WHO's ICD-11 classification system; and promoting digital platforms such as the Ayush Grid and the m-Yoga app. Challenges still remain. Regulatory harmonisation across countries is limited, evidence-based clinical research is inadequate, and integration into insurance frameworks is minimal. The report emphasises the need for a unified global branding strategy. Currently, fragmented messaging creates confusion about Ayurveda's identity. The roadmap suggests culturally adaptable communication strategies, multilingual consumer education campaigns, myth-busting initiatives to address misconceptions, and transparent sourcing and manufacturing practices to build trust. Meanwhile, Medical Value Travel (MVT) has been identified as a major growth area. The report suggests creating international Ayurveda hubs, domestic wellness zones, and bundled Ayush Visa packages that include diagnostics, treatment, and tele-follow-ups. Additionally, it calls for India's diplomatic capital to be leveraged. Embassies should act as proactive Ayurveda information nodes, while global visibility can be enhanced through premium Ayurveda Experience Centres at landmarks such as the WHO headquarters in Geneva, the UN Headquarters in New York, and Trafalgar Square in London. The roadmap is structured across three phases. In the short term (2025-2029), it calls for fast-tracking WHO-GMP certification for major manufacturers, launching flagship international Ayurveda centres in priority markets.

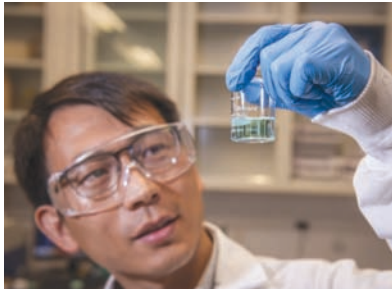

Researchers develop new technology to help
reduce dependency on imported, expensive superalloys

Kolkata, July 7 : Researchers at Hyderabad's International Advanced Research Centre for Powder Metallurgy and New Materials (ARCI), an autonomous institute of the Department of Science and Technology (DST), have come up with a crack-free bi-metallic structure developed by researchers using

a technique called laser-based powder bed fusion additive that can help reduce the overall use of expensive superalloys and import dependency. Stainless steels and nickel-based super alloys are widely used in aerospace, nuclear, as well as thermal power plants. Certain regions of a gas turbine may experience temperatures as high as 2000°C, while adjacent



sections are exposed to lower temperatures during service conditions. Therefore, combining stainless steel (good toughness and corrosion resistance) with nickel-based superalloys (excellent high-tem-

perature strength and creep resistance) in a single component is technologically attractive. However, conventional welding of Stainless steel (SS316L) and the Inconel superalloy (IN718) is challenging due to differences in chemical composition, melting temperatures, and thermal expansion coefficients. These differences often lead to solidification cracking, porosity, segregation of Nb/Mo-rich phases, and formation of brittle intermetallics.



From pen-pals to bullet trains: PM Modi's
bond with Japan that shaped a strategic alliance

New Delhi, July 7 : When Japanese Prime Minister Sanae Takaichi arrived in India, the visit was hailed as another milestone in the Indo-Japanese partnership. Yet, for Prime Minister Narendra Modi, this relationship is not merely a matter of statecraft -- it is a personal journey that began long before he assumed office in 2014. His fascination with Japan, its culture, and its technological brilliance stretches back decades, weaving a story of friendship, curiosity, and vision. Prime Minister Modi's earliest brush with Japan dates to the early 1980s, when as a young Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh

(RSS) pracharak he befriended a Japanese visitor from Nagoya during a trip to Nepal. As shared on Modi Story's X account, the bond blossomed into a pen-pal friendship, with letters and gifts exchanged across borders -- Japanese shoes and T-shirts from one side, and a copy of the Bhagavad Gita from the other. Even then, Prime Minister Modi viewed such ties as more than personal gestures; they were cultural bridges. By 2007, as Chief Minister of Gujarat, PM Modi's engagement with Japan had matured into a mission of learning. Leading a 40-member delegation, the Prime Minister toured Tokyo, Osaka, Hiroshima, and Kobe,

meeting corporate giants like Mitsubishi, Suzuki, Toshiba, and Nippon Steel. Agreements with Japan External Trade Organisation (JETRO) marked the beginning of Gujarat's deep economic ties with Japan. His meeting with the former Japan Prime Minister late Shinzo Abe during this visit sowed the seeds of a friendship that would later blossom into one of the closest relationships between two world leaders. Prime Minister Modi's regular inquiries about Abe's health during his illness reflected the personal warmth behind the diplomacy.

Gujarat: Two absconding
undertrial prisoners
held after three years

Ahmedabad, July 7 : Two undertrial prisoners who failed to return to jail after being granted interim bail in 2023 and allegedly spent nearly three years evading arrest by disguising themselves and begging outside temples across Gujarat have been apprehended by the Ahmedabad Crime Branch under its "Operation Karavas" campaign, officials said on Tuesday. The accused, identified as Ashok alias Maharaj Patel, 48, and his wife Renuka Patel, 51, were arrested from beneath the CTM Bridge opposite Hanuman Nagar in the Ramol area of the city. Police said the couple had been living on the footpath while concealing their identities by changing their appearance and begging outside temples in different parts of the state.

bypoll on July 30, counting on August 3

Bhopal, July 7 : The Election Commission of India (ECI) on Tuesday announced the schedule for the Datia Assembly by-election, setting in motion the process to fill the vacant seat. According to the notification, the bypoll will formally be notified on July 6, with candidates permitted to file their

nominations until July 13. Scrutiny of nomination papers will be conducted on July 14, while July 16 has been fixed as the last date for withdrawal of nominations. Polling will take place on July 30, and the counting of votes will be held on August 3. The entire election process will conclude by August 4. With the announcement, the Model Code of Conduct has come into immediate effect in the constituency. Voting will be conducted using Electronic Voting Machines (EVMs) and Voter Verifiable Paper Audit



Trail (VVPAT) units across all polling centres. The by-election was necessitated after Congress MLA Rajendra Bharti lost his membership of the Madhya Pradesh Assembly following his conviction in a decades-old fraud case.



Bamboo to play key role in Assam's bio-economy

Guwahati, July 7 : Assam Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma on Tuesday said that bamboo will play a significant role in strengthening the state's bio-economy by generating rural livelihoods and creating sustainable in-

dustrial opportunities. In a social media post, Sarma highlighted the government's efforts to unlock the economic potential of bamboo, describing it as "green gold" capable of transforming the rural economy. "Bamboo will play a big role in powering

Assam's bio economy," the Chief Minister said. "We are working towards improving the livelihoods of our bamboo farmers in unlocking the value of this 'green gold' -- creating rural livelihoods and driving sustainable industry. This value chain will turn our strength into global economic opportunity," he added. The Chief Minister's remarks came alongside a promotional video showcasing bamboo as "A Resource for the Future", underscoring its importance in sustainable development and value-added manufacturing. Assam possesses vast bamboo resources, making it one of the leading bamboo-producing states in the country.

The government has been promoting bamboo cultivation, processing and entrepreneurship to generate employment and increase farmers' incomes. The Chief Minister said that strengthening the bamboo value chain will encourage the establishment of bamboo-based industries producing furniture, handicrafts, construction materials, engineered bamboo products and other eco-friendly alternatives. The initiative also aligns with the state's focus on promoting green industries, reducing dependence on conventional raw materials and supporting environmentally sustainable economic growth.

Trump says US must win AI race

Washington, July 7 : US President Donald Trump said the United States must remain ahead of China in the race to dominate artificial intelligence, describing AI as a technology with greater long-term significance than the internet. Speaking in an interview with CNBC, Trump said maintaining American leadership in AI was a strategic priority and warned against allowing China to overtake the United States. "AI is bigger than the internet," Trump said. "I've never seen anything. The internet was a big deal. I think this is much bigger than the internet." Trump said the country leading AI development would gain a decisive global advantage. "I really think whoever's number one is going to really win the race. And right now, we're substantially number one." The President also said the United States was leading China in artificial intelligence development. "We're leading substantially in AI over China and

everybody else." He said the country's expanding AI industry would require a dramatic increase in electricity generation and claimed his administration had found a solution by allowing companies to build their own power generation facilities. "We need double the energy, double the electricity that we have right now to do that, just that one AI industry." "I let the plants, as they build these billions and billions of dollars of plants, I let them build their own electric generating plants." Trump argued the policy had helped preserve America's technological advan-

tag. "If I didn't come up with that concept, we wouldn't have... we would be in last place." The President said safeguards were necessary but warned against excessive regulation of AI. "You need some guard rails, but you want to do as little as possible." He said his administration would act quickly when it identified potential security risks. "When we think there's a bad player out there, there's a little danger, we stop the player quickly and effectively."



Authorities report first suspected H5N1 bird flu case on Australia's east coast

Sydney, July 7 : Authorities in the Australian state of New South Wales (NSW) said on Tuesday that they have detected the first suspected case of the deadly H5N1 avian influenza on the country's east coast. Tara Moriarty, NSW's minister for agriculture, told reporters that preliminary testing of samples taken from a migratory giant petrel that was found sick near the small coastal town of Hawks Nest, 165 km northeast of Sydney, returned a positive result for the highly pathogenic

strain. She said that the samples have been sent to the national science agency for confirmatory testing. If confirmed, it would be the sixth case of the H5N1 strain on the Australian mainland and the first on the east coast. All five previous cases were detected in migratory birds in June, with four in Western Australia (WA) and one in South Australia (SA). Moriarty said on Friday that the state government has notified the poultry industry about the suspected case. "We haven't had any reports of the poultry industry be-

ing impacted," she said. "So there's no need to panic, keep buying eggs, keep buying chicken." Prior to the first case being detected in WA, the Australian mainland was the only continent free from the strain that has caused the deaths of millions of birds and other wildlife globally since 2020, Xinhua news agency reported. NSW's Chief Veterinary Officer, Jo Coombe, said that Australian authorities were "very aware" of the looming threat of the H5N1 strain and have spent several years preparing for a local outbreak.

US, Japan step up cyber cooperation

Washington, July 7 : The United States and Japan agreed to deepen cooperation on cyber security following two days of talks in Washington, committing to expand intelligence sharing, strengthen protection of critical infrastructure, combat cybercrime across the Indo-Pacific and accelerate adoption of post-quantum cryptography. The commitments were announced in a joint statement issued after the 11th US-Japan Cyber Dialogue, held in Washington on June 30 and July 1.

The United States hosted the meeting, which was co-chaired by the Department of State's Bureau of Emerging Threats and the Bureau of East Asian and Pacific Affairs. Japan's Ministry of Foreign Affairs and the National Cybersecurity Office co-chaired the talks for Tokyo. The US delegation included officials from the White House National Security Council staff, the Office of the National Cyber Director, the Office of the Director of National Intelligence, the Department of War, the Department of Justice, the Federal Bureau of

Investigation, the Department of Homeland Security, the Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency, the National Institute of Standards and Technology and the Federal Communications Commission. Japan's delegation included representatives from the Ministry of Internal Affairs and Communications, the Ministry of Economy, Trade and Industry, the Ministry of Defence, the National Police Agency and the Public Security Intelligence Agency. In the joint statement, the two countries said they "reaffirmed their shared commitment

to addressing threats in cyberspace directly." They also said both sides deepened bilateral security cooperation in cyberspace and the strength of the US-Japan alliance by agreeing to leverage emerging technologies, strengthen information-sharing and improve interoperability. Among the commitments, the two governments agreed to "leverage new technologies such as artificial intelligence (AI) and advance secure and sovereign cloud infrastructure built on trusted technology to deepen information-sharing and interoperability." They also



Japan would "combat cybercrime and scam centers in the Indo-Pacific region through law enforcement action, international diplomacy, and coordinated engagement with the private sector as appropriate." The two countries further committed to "coordinate technical assistance for cyber resilience and defense in third countries across the Indo-Pacific region." They also agreed to "collaborate to accelerate Post Quantum Cryptography (PQC) adoption domestically." The statement said the United States and Japan committed to continued close coordination on cyber policy, operations, technical assistance and engagement with the private sector.

Lebanon pushes ahead with local elections despite border conflict, displacement

Beirut, July 7 : Lebanon is moving forward with municipal elections in its conflict-ravaged south on Tuesday, pressing ahead despite ongoing Israeli airstrikes, widespread displacement, and severe logistical challenges. The vote is held in the governorates of South Lebanon and Nabatieh, even as large parts of the border region remain under sporadic fire. Tens of thousands have been displaced since the cross-border conflict between Israel and Hezbollah began in October 2023, and basic ser-



vices have collapsed in many towns. Interior Minister Ahmad Al-Hajjar this week reiterated the government's commitment to asserting sovereignty across all Lebanese territory.



Asim Munir's rise as Pakistan's Chief of Defence Forces symbolises deep institutional decay: Sindhi leader

Berlin, July 7 : Shafi Burfat, Chairman of the Jeay Sindh Muttahida Mahaz (JSMM), on Tuesday slammed Pakistan's "self-appointed" Field Marshal and Chief of Defence Forces Asim Munir, saying he symbolises not military excellence but the deep institutional decay of a state captured by its own security establishment. The Sindhi leader asserted that Munir's elevation to the highest ceremonial rank -- Chief of Defence Forces-- despite not having fought or won a single international or decisive domestic war, reflected unchecked militarised power rather than professional merit. "Titles earned through coercion rather than competence often reveal psychological insecurity. Munir's fixation with grand ranks and religious symbolism suggests not confidence.

South Korean FM vows to seek dialogue with North Korea, other countries for peace on Korean Peninsula

Seoul, July 7 : South Korea's Foreign Minister Cho Hyun said Tuesday he would work to establish peace on the Korean Peninsula by seeking dialogue with North Korea and other relevant nations, reiterating the government's efforts to reengage with Pyongyang. Cho made the remarks in a keynote speech at an event hosted by the South Korea-US Parliamentarians Union, saying it is time to "deeply reflect on what must be done" to ensure security and peace on the peninsula, Yonhap News Agency reported. "The two summit meetings between South Korea and the United States this year would provide a foundation for those efforts," he said, stressing the importance of "swiftly and properly" negotiating the agreements reached in the joint fact sheet. He added that South Korea should work to bolster deter-

rence while simultaneously seeking dialogue with North Korea and other relevant nations. Following two summits in August and October between South Korean President Lee Jae Myung and U.S. President Donald Trump, the two countries released a joint fact sheet outlining their agreements. Under the agreements, the US committed to supporting South Korea in its efforts toward civil uranium enrichment and spent fuel reprocessing for peaceful uses. It also includes US approval for and its commitment to advancing Seoul's drive for nuclear-powered submarines. Cho added that Seoul will hold talks with Washington on the submarines and uranium enrichment next year. On Friday, South Korean President Lee Jae Myung instructed officials to arrange a security-related ministers' meeting to better coordinate the government's North Korea policy.



We would die of hunger, must defuse water bomb hanging over us: Pak Senator

Islamabad, July 7 : Asserting that the country is staring down the barrel of a major water crisis, yet another Pakistani politician on Tuesday made a desperate appeal to the Shehbaz Sharif government to "defuse".



US pressuring other govts to isolate Cuba, says Cuban diplomat

Havana, July 7 : The US government has been pressuring governments around the world to end bilateral healthcare programs with Cuba, according to Cuban Deputy Foreign Minister Carlos Fernandez de Cossio. The impact of ending these programs has been "to deprive many communities of access to health services," he wrote on Facebook, Xinhua news agency reported.



Corruption biggest hurdle to good governance and development : Mizoram CM

Aizawl, July 7 : Mizoram Chief Minister Lalduhoma on Tuesday said that corruption remains one of the biggest obstacles to good governance and the overall development of the state, stressing that eliminating the menace requires the collective commitment of both citizens and government employees. Releasing the first-ever Annual Report of the Anti-Corruption Bureau (ACB) for 2025-2026 at the Chief Minister's Conference Hall, Lalduhoma said that combating corruption is not the responsibility of a single agency alone but a shared responsibility of all citizens as well as every government employee.

Rajasthan bans sale, use of Bupivacaine injection used in caesarean deliveries, other surgeries

Jaipur, July 7 : The Rajasthan Drug Control Department has imposed a statewide ban on the sale and use of a specific batch of Bupivacaine injection following reports of serious adverse reactions among patients at a hospital in Hyderabad. Bupivacaine is widely used to administer spinal anaesthesia during various surgical procedures, including Caesarean deliveries.



One should not object to India-Pakistan dialogue: Omar Abdullah

Srinagar, July 7 : Jammu and Kashmir Chief Minister Omar Abdullah on Tuesday said that nobody should have an objection to India-Pakistan dialogue since it is aimed at improving relations between the two neighbours. The Chief Minister said the conflict between the two countries was not new and has persisted for the last three to

four decades. "This conflict is 30 to 40 years old, and last year, it intensified after the Pahalgam attack. Now, the Prime Minister is being requested, through a letter, that the relations between the two countries should be improved.



K'taka SIR: Over 1.12 crore enumeration forms distributed in three days

Bengaluru, July 7 : The Election Commission's Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of electoral rolls in Karnataka gathered pace on Tuesday, with more than 1.12 crore (1,12,65,893) Enumeration Forms distributed to voters within the first three days of the door-to-door verification exercise. According to the Office of the Chief Electoral Officer (CEO), Karnataka, the state had a total of 5,54,32,314 registered electors as of June 16, 2026. Enumeration Forms have been printed and supplied to Booth Level Officers (BLOs) for distribution as part of the revision exercise. The house-to-house enumeration and digitisation process commenced on June 30 and will continue until July 29. The CEO's office said a total of 1,12,65,893 Enumeration Forms, accounting for 20.32 per cent of the electorate, had been distributed to voters so far.

Monsoon Mango Festival: Tripura to expand mango cultivation, boost infra for growers

Agartala, July 7 : Tripura Agriculture and Farmers' Welfare Minister Ratan Lal Nath on Tuesday announced that the state government would expand mango cultivation across an additional 55

hectares of land in mountainous Dhalai district, besides providing more infrastructure and financial assistance to strengthen the livelihoods of mango growers and enhance their income.

The Minister made the announcement after inaugurating the Monsoon Mango Festival 2026 at Narikelkunja in tribal people inhabited Gandatwisa sub-division under Dhalai district.

New Delhi, July 7 : The Women and Child Development Ministry on Tuesday called upon schools, youth groups, NGOs, panchayats and individuals to identify and support potential nominees to file online applications for the Pradhan Mantri Rashtriya Bal Puraskar Awards (PMRBP) 2026 by July 31. Any citizen, school, institution, or organisation can nominate

candidates they deem deserving. Children may also apply through self-nomination for the awards that celebrate the extraordinary achievements of children aged 5 to 18 years, said a statement. The prestigious national-level award is conferred annually by the President to recognise exceptional achievements of children in the fields of art and culture, bravery, sports, social service, environment and science and technology. The

objectives of the awards are to celebrate and amplify the achievements of India's youth in diverse spheres, to inspire peers nationwide by showcasing real-life role models and to foster an enabling environment for children's holistic development, said a statement. In a social media post on X, the Ministry said, "The last date for submission of applications is July 31, 2026. All nominations for the PMRBP award must be made

through the online portal <https://awards.gov.in>." Applicants will need to fill in basic personal details and the category of award and then upload a recent photograph and supporting documents. They will also need to submit a write-up (up to 1000-words) about the achievement and its impact, said the statement. To apply, young achievers must first register or log in on the portal by providing details such as First Name, Last



Name, Date of Birth, Applicant Type (Individual/Organisation), Mobile Number, Email ID, Aadhaar Number, etc. and CAPTCHA verification, said the statement. It said that once registered, they should select the

'Pradhan Mantri Rashtriya Bal Puraskar 2025' under the 'On-going Nominations' section and click on 'Nominate/Apply Now'. Applicants must then choose the relevant award category and indicate whether the nomination is for themselves or someone else. Bengal Cabinet clears draft UCC Bill, CM Adhikari directs strict cost control measures

Kolkata, July 7 : The draft of the Uniform Civil Code, West Bengal, 2026, aiming to implement a uniform civil code in the state, was cleared at a meeting of the state cabinet on Tuesday, which was chaired by Chief Minister Suwendu Adhikari. "Now the draft Bill will be sent to a newly constituted committee headed by former Supreme Court judge Justice Ranjana Prakash Desai (retired), for examination. Following the recommendations of the high-powered committee that will be received within the next four weeks, the final Bill will be drafted and tabled on the floor of the Assembly in August this year," said a state cabinet insider. To recall, while addressing the Assembly earlier on June 29, the Chief Minister said that the state's tribals, indigenous people, Kurmis and other recognised ancient

tribal communities will be kept outside the purview of the proposed law. In this regard, the Chief Minister clarified that the exception is being made following the model adopted by Uttarakhand and Gujarat. The main purpose of the Bill is to implement a single law across the state. , instead of having separate personal laws on the basis of religion. Once implemented, West Bengal will be the fourth Indian state to implement UCC after Gujarat, Uttarakhand and Assam. At the same time, at the meeting, the Chief Minister directed all departments to go for strict cost-control measures and stop all avoidable departmental expenditure. "The Chief Minister strictly instructed that non-eligible people should be immediately excluded from various social welfare projects and thus ensure cost curtailment and bring ease in running those projects," the cabinet insider said. Sources said that the Chief Minister also directed that all state government departments should adopt all possible measures to seal the avenues of revenue leakages, especially as regards tax collection from sectors like stone quarries



and sand mining, the areas where the leakage was maximum during the previous Trinamool Congress regime because of rampant corruption. "The Cabinet also approved a proposal for perpetual transfer of government-vested land in different districts in favour of the Border Security Force (BSF) and Sashastra Seema Bal (SSB) for various purposes like construction of border outposts, border fencing and road construction, among others," said sources. The cabinet also cleared a proposal for the creation of nine additional fast-track courts in nine districts of the state and also approved the creation of 35 posts for these courts.

Karnataka CM Shivakumar warns of a potentially severe drought this year

Bengaluru, July 7 : Karnataka Chief Minister D.K. Shivakumar on Tuesday warned of a potentially severe drought this year, urging farm-

ers not to depend on reservoir water for cultivation as inflows into most major reservoirs have dropped drastically.

HCLTech bags \$1.14 billion AI deal from Europe-based Fortune Global 50 firm

New Delhi, July 7 : Noida-headquartered IT services provider HCL Technologies (HCLTech) on Tuesday announced that it has signed a deal with a Europe-based Fortune Global 50 company to establish an AI-driven operating model for transforming and managing the client's global digital workplace and enterprise networks. The agreement -- which runs from July to December 2031 with an option to extend it for another five years -- has an estimated value of \$1.14 billion during the initial term, the IT company said in an exchange filing. It added that the engagement is

entirely net-new business and is expected to strengthen its order book ahead of the company's quarterly earnings. Under the partnership, HCLTech will leverage artificial intelligence to modernise and manage the customer's global digital workplace and enterprise network operations. The deal marks another milestone in HCLTech's AI strategy, following a series of partnerships, acquisitions and investments announced in recent months. In June, the company signed a long-term strategic agreement with a renewable energy company to consolidate IT services and drive AI-led operational transfor-

mation. It also partnered with Nokia to accelerate autonomous telecom network optimisation using AI-driven rApps and teamed up with Circles and GreySkies to develop AI-powered telecom software solutions. Separately, HCLTech completed the acquisition of business intelligence platform Jaspersoft from Cloud Software Group and invested in sovereign AI startup Sarvam AI as part of its \$234 million Series B funding round. Following the announcement, HCLTech shares jumped as much as 5.68 per cent to an intraday high of Rs 1,138.75 on the BSE in early trade.



Indian smartphone volumes may see headwinds from global RAM prices: Report

New Delhi, July 7 : Indian smartphone makers are likely to face a challenging period as global memory or RAM prices surge, squeezing volumes and pushing up average selling prices, a new report has said. Brokerage CLSA said in a report that Indian smartphone shipments remained under pressure on a YoY and sequential basis in January, with volumes falling about 25 per cent.

India pips China as top investment country for global family offices

New Delhi, July 7 : Global family offices are most likely to increase their exposure to India and China over the next 12 months and India has scored far better on the list, according to the '2025 Global Family Office' report by UBS. More than a quarter (28 per cent) of family offices are planning to increase their exposure to India over the next 12 months while almost a fifth (18 per cent) are planning to increase exposure to China, the report mentioned, clearing indicating the robust macro-economic indicators and strong domestic growth in India. "Middle Eastern family offices were the most likely to increase exposure to India," the report further stated. Middle Eastern family offices, followed by those in Europe, were the most likely to increase exposure to India. The report captured the views of 317 UBS family office clients. The average net worth of participating families was \$2.7 billion, with their family offices managing \$1.1 billion each.



Infibeam Avenues' profit falls 15 pc sequentially to Rs 54 crore in Q4, revenue up

Mumbai, July 7 : Fintech company Infibeam Avenues on Tuesday reported 15 per cent sequential decline in profit from operations in the January-March period (Q4) to Rs 54 crore, from Rs 64 crore in the December quarter (Q3). The company said in a stock exchange filing that its income from operations stood at Rs 1,160 crore in the March quarter of FY25, which is 8.4 per cent higher than the December quarter's income from operations of Rs 1,070 crore. The company's profit from operations grew 17 per cent (year-on-year) in the March quarter. The company had a profit of Rs 46 crore in the March quarter of FY24. The company's expenses increased by 8.88 per cent on a quarterly basis to Rs 1,103

crore in the January-March period, from Rs 1,013 crore in the October-December period. On an annual basis, the company's expenses increased by 65 per cent, which was Rs 666 crore in the same period of FY25. Infibeam Avenues' profit from operations for the entire FY25 stood at Rs 236 crore, which is 51 per cent higher than the profit of Rs 156 crore for the entire FY24. During this period, the company's income from operations has increased from Rs 3,150 crore to Rs 3,992 crore, showing a growth of 26.73 per cent on an annual basis. The company's total income for the entire FY25 has increased to Rs 4,065 crore, which is 28.03 percent higher than the total income of Rs 3,175 crore in FY25.

Sensex, Nifty open nearly 1 pc higher; IT, metal stocks drive rally

Mumbai, July 7 Indian equity markets opened higher on Tuesday amid mixed global cues, with benchmark indices rising nearly 1 per cent each as buying was led by IT, metal, pharma and chemical stocks. Sensex began session at 78,152.34, up 650 points or 0.84 per cent, while Nifty opened around 200 points or 0.83 per cent higher at 24,375.65. Sector-wise, Nifty IT surged nearly 2 per cent, while Nifty Metal gained 1.66 per cent. Nifty MidSmall IT & Telecom, Chemicals and Pharma indices advanced over 1 per cent, 0.82 per cent and 0.72 per cent, respectively. In contrast, the Nifty PSU Bank index declined 0.87 per cent. Among Nifty 50 constituents, Tata Motors Passenger Vehicles (TMPV), NTPC, SBI and Axis Bank were the top losers. The broader market remained firm, with Nifty Smallcap 50 and Nifty Smallcap 100 indices rising 0.48 per cent and 0.46 per cent, respectively. Nifty 100 gained 0.46 per cent, while Nifty 500 advanced 0.41 per cent.



Tax changes, customs hikes to shape bullion market in H2 2026

New Delhi, July 7 : Taxation changes, customs duty hikes and global geopolitical tensions will be the defining factors of bullion prices in H2 2026, as prices are expected to remain volatile with possible consolidation after recent corrections, a report said on Tuesday. Jewellery demand is expected to remain subdued, though the festive season could revive sales, particularly in lightweight categories, the report from All India Gem & Jewellery Domestic Council (GJC) said. The industry awaits clarity on reforms to the Gold Monetisation Scheme and potential tax adjustments, while geopolitical risks remain a key factor that could trigger renewed safe-haven demand, it added. The report noted that the first six months of the year were marked by historic peaks in bullion prices, followed by corrections that reshaped consumer sentiment and industry outlook. Gold prices peaked at Rs 1,70,480 per 10 grams in January 2026 before correcting to about Rs 1,42,800 per 10 grams by late June, while silver crossed Rs 4,02,490 per kilogram in January and eased to roughly Rs 2,25,940 per kilogram by late June.



Adani Group emerges as investor magnet after Rs 38,000 crore demand for AEL QIP offering

Ahmedabad, July 7 : Global institutions and India's largest mutual funds have backed multiple Adani Group companies, marking a sharp turnaround in investor sentiment. Adani Group has emerged as one of the biggest draws for institutional investors over the past year, attracting around Rs 40,000 crore of fresh equity into its flagship company alone while also seeing marquee global and domestic investors increase their

exposure across several listed entities. Adani Enterprises Ltd (AEL) this week upsized its qualified institutional placement (QIP) to Rs 15,000 crore after receiving bids worth about Rs 38,000 crore, or 3.8 times the base issue size. The fundraising comes less than a year after the company's Rs 25,000 crore rights issue, taking its total equity capital raised over the past year to about Rs 40,000 crore. The latest offering attracted some of the world's largest insti-

tutional investors, including Capital Group, Goldman Sachs, BlackRock, Blackstone, and Nomura. Domestic participation was equally broad-based, with HDFC Mutual Fund, ICICI Prudential Mutual Fund, Kotak Mutual Fund, Aditya Birla Sun Life Mutual Fund, SBI Mutual Fund and Tata Mutual Fund among the investors. People familiar with the transaction said the order book was fully covered before the issue formally opened.



Citi downgrades Vedanta to 'sell', cuts target price to Rs 265 on zinc concerns

Mumbai, July 7 : Shares of Vedanta Limited? dropped 3.35 per cent on Tuesday after brokerage firm Citi Research issued a sharp double downgrade on the stock, turning bearish on the metals major amid concerns over zinc prices and changes in its dividend policy. Citi downgraded Vedanta from 'buy' to 'sell' and slashed its target price to Rs 265, signaling limited upside from current levels. The brokerage cited a weak outlook on zinc along with uncertainty surrounding the company's capital allocation strategy as the primary reasons behind its negative stance.

India's exports projected to reach \$1 trillion in FY26: FIEO

New Delhi, July 7 : The Federation of Indian Export Organisations (FIEO) on Tuesday said the country is projected to reach the export figure of \$1 trillion by the end of this fiscal (FY26). This will constitute merchandise exports at \$525-535 billion -- a growth of about 12 per cent from last fiscal -- and services exports at \$465-475 billion, a growth of nearly 20 per cent. India's export sector achieved a significant milestone in the fiscal year 2024-25.





Oriental Cup 2026: Holders DPS RK Puram, Govt. Girls Sr. Sec. School start with wins

New Delhi, July 7 : Defending champions Delhi Public School, RK Puram, and Government Girls Senior Secondary School, Faridabad, began their title defences with commanding victories as the fourth edition of the Oriental Cup got underway at Dr. Ambedkar Stadium on Tuesday. Ronaldo first represented Portugal as an 18-year-old against Kazakhstan on August 20, 2003, before announcing himself on the big stage with his maiden international goal against Greece at UEFA Euro 2004.



'Cabo Verde game was just a small bump in the road for Argentina': Sandesh Jhingan

New Delhi, July 7 : Team India defender Sandesh Jhingan believes Argentina's defensive foundations remain intact despite conceding twice in their Round of 32 clash against Cabo Verde, backing the reigning world champions to produce a much-improved display against Egypt in the FIFA World Cup Round of 16. Argentina survived a scare to progress after a hard-fought win over Cabo Verde,

prompting questions over their defence. However, Jhingan, who is part of Zee5 FIFA World Cup 2026 expert panel, insisted one below-par outing should not overshadow the consistency Lionel Scaloni's side has shown over the last few years.

Mooney regains top spot in batter rankings after Women's T20 WC heroics



Dubai, July 7 : Australia's Beth Mooney has returned to the top of the ICC Women's T20I batter rankings after a superb Women's T20 World Cup 2026 campaign, where she played a key role in her side's record-extending seventh title triumph. Mooney, who was named both the Player of the Match in the final and the Player of the Tournament, reclaimed the No. 1 ranking with 785 rating points after finishing the tournament with 238 runs at an average of 47.60 and a strike rate of 142.51. The experienced left-hander delivered in the biggest matches, scoring an unbeaten 61 off 36 balls in Australia's semifinal victory over the West Indies.

'Sooryavanshi needs to be ready for bowlers' plans': Pathan

New Delhi, July 7 : Former India all-rounder Irfan Pathan believes the real test for teenage batting sensation Vaibhav Sooryavanshi begins now, saying the 15-year-old must prepare for the tactical plans opposition bowlers will use against him following his eye-catching start to international cricket. Speaking ahead of the third T20I against England, Pathan said Sooryavanshi's fearless approach should remain intact but stressed that adapting to opponents' strategies would be crucial for his continued success. "He is a special talent, no doubt, but he needs to make sure he is ready for the plans bowlers will come up with against him," Pathan told Jio Hotstar. "Like in the first game, if you want to step out against the spinners in England, it's not a bad option since the ball doesn't turn that much there, but you need to maintain your balance and not move too far away from the ball," he added.



'Overturn this': Belgium mocks Balogun drama with savage social media post after ousting USA

New Delhi, July 7 : After eliminating co-host USA from the FIFA World Cup, the victorious Belgian team clapped back at the Folarin Balogun red-card drama with a savage two-word social media post. Ahead of the round-of-16 tie against the USA, football's global governing body suspended the one-match ban imposed on US striker Folarin Balogun, which he got after receiving a red card for a foul on Bosnia-Herzegovina defender Tarik Muharemovic in the round of 32 victory. The ruling drew strong criticism from the Belgian Football Association, which issued statements expressing "astonishment" at the decision. European football governing body UEFA also condemned the ruling, saying it had "crossed a red line".
