New Delhi, Aug 10 : The Parliament approved the Taxation and other Laws (Amendment) Bill on Monday, with Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman making it clear that the legislation does not impose any tax or transaction charge on users making payments through the Unified Payments In-

terface (UPI). The Bill, which was passed by the Lok Sabha last week, was returned by the Rajya Sabha with a voice vote after a brief discussion and reply by the Finance Minister. Speaking on the floor of the Upper House.



Andhra Pradesh to finish land re-survey by 2027

Amaravati, Aug 10 : Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu on Monday announced that the land re-survey process would be completed by 2027 and Pattadar Passbooks bearing the official State emblem would be issued to farmers and landowners. Participating in the distribution of 'Mee Bhoomi-Mee Hakku' Pattadar Passbooks at Kalidindi in the Kaikaluru Assembly constituency in Eluru district, he said the coalition government was working with the sole agenda of resolving revenue-related problems. Naidu stated that the Revenue Records Reforms 2026 were introduced to cleanse and stream-

line land records. He issued a Pattadar Passbook bearing the State emblem to a woman farmer, Nallajarla Durga Bhavani. Later addressing the gathering, the Chief Minister said the double-engine government at the Centre and in the State was driving development at bullet speed and had resolved the issue of land allotted to ex-servicemen who had participated in the Second World War, which were placed under Section 22-A, and issued them pattas. He said the destruction caused by the previous government between 2019 and 2024 damaged revenue records, with lands and properties digitally placed under 22-A, creating disputes. When the coalition government came to power in

2024, a large number of complaints relating to land issues started pouring in. Naidu said the State government was incorporating strong security features, similar to those used for currency, into Pattadar Passbooks. Blockchain technology has been used to prevent tampering with property details, while QR codes and other technology-based security features have also been incorporated. So far, 32.22 lakh Pattadar Passbooks have been handed over to farmers and landowners. During the next seven months, the government will complete the re-survey in 9,365 villages and issue 68.64 lakh Pattadar Passbooks, he said. The Chief Minister said land-related problems covering nearly



41,000 acres had been resolved so far, benefiting more than 1.27 lakh farmers, industries and members of the public. He said 1.36 lakh acres had been freed from freehold restrictions. The government has taken up digitisation of old land records, including I-B, Adangal, DKT, ARC, Inam and Ceiling records. All link documents will be made available online. So far, nearly nine lakh people have been provided the facility of auto-mutation. The re-survey is being conducted in the presence of farmers. After obtaining e-KYC, Pattadar Passbooks bearing the State emblem are being printed and distributed by conducting Gram Sabhas to ensure transparency.

Interest-free loan of Rs 50,000 for tobacco farmers

Guntur, Aug 10 : Andhra Pradesh Agriculture Minister Kinjarapu Atchannaidu announced that a loan of 50,000 would be provided to each tobacco farmer. He clarified that this 50,000 loan would be interest-free for a period of two years. He also stated that the government would provide an additional 1,000 per quintal and assured that measures would be taken to ensure the funds are credited to the farmers' accounts within nine days of the tobacco purchase.



YSRCP condemns police crackdown on protests over DSC irregularities

Amaravati, Aug 10 : The YSR Congress Party on Monday condemned police highhandedness and attempt to intimidate its cadres holding peaceful protests across Andhra Pradesh demanding a CBI enquiry into the alleged irregularities in DSC recruitment and resignation of Education Minister Nara Lokesh. YSRCP national spokesperson, Y. Karthik, said that instead of answering the serious questions being asked by DSC aspirants, the government is using the police to suppress the democratic protest across constituencies. "YSRCP leaders and cadres are being stopped, detained, prevented from participating in these peace-



ful demonstrations. What is the government really afraid of? Why are police being deployed to block political leaders and activists who are only demanding justice for unemployed youth?," he asked.

Union Ministry of Jal Shakti provides clarity on the Polavaram project; details revealed in the Rajya Sabha.

New Delhi, Aug 10 : The Union Ministry of Jal Shakti revealed that the revised estimated cost approved by the Central Government for the first phase of the Polavaram project is 30,436.95 crore. It stated that the project construction in the first phase would be carried out up to a height of 41.15 meters. It noted that the Centre has released funds amounting to 12,620.53 crore for the Polavaram project over the past five years, with the highest allocation of 5,512.40 crore made in the 2024-25 financial year. It was revealed. The Union Ministry of Jal Shakti provided a written reply to a



question asked by BJP MP R. Krishnaiah in the Rajya Sabha regarding the progress of the Polavaram project. In this context, the Union Ministry of Jal Shakti stated that 96.87 percent of the earthwork for the spillway construction has been completed so far. It revealed that 98.84 percent of the concrete work and 92.9 percent.

Bengal govt issues notification announcing enhanced DA payment from Oct 1

Kolkata, Aug 10 : The West Bengal Finance department has issued a notification announcing the enhanced dearness allowance payment to the tune of 38 per cent to the state government employees with effect from October 1 this year.

The enhanced dearness allowance payment for the state government employees to the tune of 38 per cent was announced by the West Bengal Finance Minister Swapan Dasgupta, a journalist-turned-politician, on Monday while presenting his budget proposals for the financial year 2026-27 on the floor of the West Bengal Assembly on June 22.

On Monday night, the state Finance department (audit branch) has announced the date from which the enhanced dearness allowances will be paid to the permanent state government employees.

As per the notification, besides the permanent state government employees, the enhanced dearness allowances will be paid to the teaching and non-teaching staff in state-run and state-aid schools as well as the employees in statutory bodies, government undertakings, panchayats (including panchayat workers), municipal corporations, municipalities and other local bodies.

At the same time, an enhanced dearness relief (will be paid to the pensioners and family pen-

sioners) of the state. They will get dearness relief at the rate of 38 per cent of the revised basic pension or revised family pension from October 1.

The guidelines said that the pension paying authority will correctly calculate the amount of dearness relief payable on the revised pension or family pension in each individual case.

The Principal Accountant General of West Bengal Anindya Dasgupta will issue necessary instructions in this regard to various government banks in the case of Kolkata and to the concerned accountant general in the case of other districts.

For employees who are still in the pre-revised or unrevised pay structure as recommended by



the Fifth Pay Commission, the rate of dearness allowance has also been increased in one step from 171 per cent to 223 per cent, which will be effective from October 1.

Similarly, as per the notification, the dearness relief has been increased from 171 per cent to 223 per cent for those who are still

getting pre-revised pension or family pension as per ROPA (Revision of Pay and Allowance), 2009. In addition, the daily wage of all government daily wage workers or daily rated workers whose wages are not regulated by any statutory provision like the Minimum Wages Act has been increased by an ad-hoc increase of Rs 110.

This new wage increase will also be effective from October 1. The state Finance department's guidelines clearly state that in the case of government undertakings or statutory bodies, all the expenses of this additional dearness allowance and dearness relief will have to be borne from their own funds or from the financial assistance received in the budget.



MP govt procures 59 lakh quintals of wheat, target set at 7.8 MT

Bhopal, Aug 10 : Wheat procurement in Madhya Pradesh has gained pace this season, with the state government stepping up arrangements to handle higher arrivals and ensure smooth purchase at the Minimum Support Price, Food, Civil Supplies and Consumer Protection Minister Govind Singh Rajput said on Monday.

From Maoist Bastion to tourism Hub :

DGP Anand Unveils New Vision For Karreguttalu

Mulugu, Aug 10 : Telangana DGP C.V. Anand on Monday visited Karreguttalu (Black Hills), once considered a major Maoist stronghold on the 60-km long hill range along the Telangana-Chhattisgarh-Odisha border, and announced plans to transform the remote region into a tourism destination with improved infrastructure.

Inspecting ongoing road works, Anand unfurled the National Flag and released white doves as a symbol of peace, marking the region's transition from decades of Left Wing Extremism to development.

The DGP said coordinated operations by the Telangana Police, Greyhounds, CRPF, CoBRA and Chhattisgarh Police had significantly weakened Maoist activity. Nearly 700 Maoists had surrendered during Operation Kagar, while several senior leaders were killed in encounters and others returned to the mainstream, he said.

He assured that surrendered Maoists would receive rehabilitation support, including financial assistance, land and livelihood opportunities, to facilitate their reintegration into society.

Further, Anand said the government planned to develop Karregutta's tourism potential while adhering to environmental and legal norms.

The road from Pamuru to Chalamadava has been completed, while blacktopping works are set to begin shortly.

Electricity, mobile connectivity and other basic facilities will also be developed, he added.

During the visit, the DGP distributed essential commodities to Gutti Koya families near the Pamuru camp and assured them of continued government support.

He also lauded the CRPF, particularly the personnel of its 196 Battalion, for their sustained service in difficult terrain and their contribution to restoring peace in the region.

Andhra govt to extend subsidised power to aqua farmers in non-aqua zones

The Andhra Pradesh government on Tuesday decided to extend subsidised electricity to aqua farmers located in non-aqua zones from this month. Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu directed officials to provide electricity to farmers in non-aqua zones at the same subsidised rate of Rs 1.50 per unit that is currently available in designated aqua zones. He instructed officials to implement the decision from this month. The move is expected to benefit around 12,500 aqua farmers across the state. Reviewing challenges in the aqua sector, the Chief Minister directed officials to prepare a special action plan to control shrimp feed prices. He said the State government is in discussions with the Centre to reduce fish meal exports by 50 per cent and instructed officials to ensure that shrimp feed prices remain stable until the Centre takes a decision. The Chief Minister reviewed the impact of El Niño, deficient rainfall, crop cultivation and water resources with officials at the Secretariat on Tuesday. He directed officials and public representatives to reach every farmer in the state with the El Niño Mitigation Action Plan, explaining the government's initiatives as well as alternative cultivation strategies that farmers should adopt. He instructed officials to launch farmer awareness programmes from August 7. In view of forecasts indicating below-normal rainfall across the state until October due to El Niño, the Chief Minister stressed the need to encourage farmers to adopt suitable contingency plans. He directed officials to educate farmers on the opportunities available under the PMDS cultivation system and provide them with clear guidance on managing severe weather conditions such as El Niño. The Chief Minister also instructed officials to disseminate timely field-level information through the Rythu App. He noted that while rainfall has declined, the cultivated area has increased, and directed departments to align their action plans with these changing ground realities. He emphasised the effective implementation of the El Niño Effect Mitigation Action Plan and instructed that livestock fodder management should also be integrated with the VBG Ram G programme. Naidu directed officials to implement a support price of Rs 10 per kilogram for off-style tobacco from Wednesday. He instructed officials to procure 94 million kilograms of off-style tobacco, which is expected to benefit around 44,000 farmers. He also directed the formation of a five-member committee comprising representatives of the State government, the Tobacco Board and farmers to monitor and review implementation. Officials informed the Chief Minister that 48.27 million kilograms of FCV tobacco have already been procured. To support tobacco growers further, the Chief Minister instructed officials to launch a scheme providing loans of Rs 50,000 per tobacco curing barn (barrel).

Vadodara students' landmark research finds glowing bacteria in Ratnagiri waters

New Delhi, Aug 10 : Two B.Sc. Microbiology students from M.K. Amin College in Gujarat's Vadodara, Arnav Dhamdhare and Hariom Pathak, have made a notable scientific discovery by isolating bioluminescent bacteria from seawater samples collected off the Ratnagiri coast in Maharashtra. The bacteria are capable of naturally emitting light in darkness, a rare biological phenomenon with wide-ranging scientific applications. The discovery was made under the guidance of Prof. Devarshi Gajjar and Dr Priya Mishra after nearly 11 months of sustained laboratory research, experimentation, and microbial analysis. The students collected seawater

samples from coastal regions, including Ratnagiri, and successfully isolated the luminous bacteria through a detailed scientific process. Explaining the origin of the idea, student Hariom Pathak said, "We were reading about molecules and came to know that oceans glow at night because of bioluminescent bacteria. That inspired us to take up this experiment." He also added that samples were collected from coastal waters during field visits, including a trip to Goa. "In our institution, we have an open house every year where we interact with school students. We wanted to do something different to make them curious. That is how we thought of working on bioluminescent bacteria."



He further noted that the research required consistent experimentation over a long period. Another student, Arnav Dhamdhare, said, "We were experimenting on different samples to isolate the bacteria. We got the successful sample last year in April, and the entire process took around one year, including identification work." The research involved meticulous laboratory work and continuous analysis to isolate and confirm the presence of bioluminescent microorganisms. Experts say such bacteria have significant potential applications in pollution monitoring, environmental diagnostics, medical research, and biotechnology. The samples are currently undergoing further pathological analysis to determine broader scientific applications. The work was conducted at M.K. Amin College, part of the Maharaja Sayajirao University system in Vadodara. The achievement has been seen as a boost for student-led scientific innovation. The Gujarat government, under Chief Minister Bhupendra Patel, has been actively promoting research and innovation, providing encouragement to young scientists engaging in advanced studies. The discovery is expected to contribute to future research in marine microbiology and open new possibilities in bio-luminescence-based scientific applications.



Attack on Melbourne defence manufacturer under investigation as act of terrorism

Melbourne, Aug 10 : Australian authorities said on Monday that a 2025 attack on a Melbourne defence manufacturer is being investigated as an act of terrorism. Lovitt Technologies in the north-east suburbs of Melbourne was targeted in the early hours of July 5, 2025, with several vehicles set alight and the premises vandalised, reports Xinhua news agency. The Australian Federal Police (AFP), Australian Security Intelligence Organization (ASIO) and Victoria Police said in a joint statement on Wednesday that the incident is being investigated as an act of terrorism. They said that the Victorian Joint Counter Terrorism Team

(JCTT), a joint initiative between the three agencies, is investigating the attack as an act of terrorism, potentially orchestrated by far-left extremists with anarchist and revolutionary ideologies. The JCTT alleges that masked members of a group later posted a video online claiming responsibility for the attack. In the video, the alleged offenders outlined their support for Palestine and provided instructions on how to create an incendiary device similar to one believed to have been used in the July 2025 attack. A video shared online following the incident by an individual wearing a mask, who claimed to speak on behalf of the "Anonymous

cell," expressed support for Palestine and alleged that Lovitt Technologies was targeted because of its involvement in the global F-35 joint strike fighter programme, aircraft that have been used by the Israeli military. Authorities said that the alleged offenders targeted the company in the belief it was part of the Australian Defense Force supply chain. Lovitt Technologies' website says the company supports Lockheed Martin's F-35 Joint Strike Fighter program as well as several Boeing military aircraft production programs. The JCTT said that the alleged offenders could face life imprisonment if convicted of engaging in a terrorist act.



Every fourth household in Pakistan's Islamabad has child as domestic worker: Report

Islamabad, Aug 10 : Every fourth household in Pakistan's Islamabad has a child as domestic worker as the implementation of the legislation on child domestic labour remains far from satisfactory, local media reported. Executive Director of the Society for the Protection of the Rights of the Child (Sparc), Asiya Arif, made these remarks during an event organised by Sparc in collaboration with the National Commission on the Rights of the Child (NCRC) to mark the World Day Against Child Labour 2026, Pakistan-based daily Dawn reported. She underscored the need to have collective red card against child labour and called for addressing the issue across several sectors like supply chains, hotels, automobile workshops and the brick kiln industry. She called for making coordinated and sustained efforts through strong implementation mechanisms.

Former diplomat slams BNP govt, says Sheikh Hasina not treated fairly by Bangladesh judiciary

New Delhi, Aug 10 : Former Bangladesh Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina's desire to return to Dhaka and file an appeal against the death sentence awarded by the country's International Crimes Tribunal (ICT) is "fair" and should not be judged politically, Veena Sikri, India's former High Commissioner to Bangladesh, told IANS on Monday. "I don't consider it as a political activity. She just said she wants to go back. She has been given a death sentence by something described as a kangaroo court in Bangladesh. That court is not authorised to

try her. They didn't allow her to bring her own defence. So she had been tried in absentia. They gave her a defence lawyer who never did anything, who was just sitting there. So obviously, she had not been treated fairly by the judiciary in Bangladesh," said Sikri. The former diplomat urged that there must be a "proper hearing" where Hasina must be allowed to have her own lawyer. "It's not political. So saying that it will affect bilateral relations, I don't understand, first of all, on what basis the Bangladesh Nationalist Party (BNP) government is saying it will affect bilateral relations. I would say that the BNP

government itself is not interested in having good bilateral relations with India," remarked Sikri. Highlighting the recent appointment of Dinesh Trivedi as the new High Commissioner of India to Bangladesh, Sikri reflected on the ongoing political turmoil in Dhaka. "He (Dinesh Trivedi) is a political appointee. He's a cabinet-rank person. He's almost like a special envoy of Prime Minister Modi. And when he reached there in Bangladesh, first, they tried to make a controversy about some statement that he made. Jamaat-e-Islami tried to make a big controversy and then they did not give him the appointment to present



credentials. He had to wait almost three weeks, which is quite unprecedented," the former diplomat mentioned. "It's very routine and normal for the new High Commissioner to call on the Prime Minister. And that call has still not taken place. So, our High Commissioner has not been able to talk directly to the Prime Minister. I don't think these are indications that

Bangladesh wants good relations with India," Sikri added. Bangladesh PM Tarique Rahman had given assurance before elections regarding lifting the executive order banning political participation by the Awami League and that he would make the first visit to India.

Rights group urges Pakistan to restore rights of Imran Khan and Bushra Bibi Khan

Islamabad, Aug 10 : Leading international human rights organisation Amnesty International on Monday urged the Pakistani authorities to unconditionally restore Imran Khan, the former Prime Minister of Pakistan, and his wife Bushra Bibi Khan's right to see their family and lawyers. "For three years, Pakistan's authorities have systematically denied Imran Khan the right to a fair trial.



Uzbekistan's Foreign Minister holds discussions with US Ambassador Gor

New Delhi, Aug 10 : Uzbekistan's Foreign Minister Bakhtiyor Saidov has met Ambassador Sergio Gor, Special Representative of the President of US for South and Central Asia, in New Delhi. They held an in-depth exchange of views on Monday on further enhancing dialogue at the highest

and high levels, as well as on the priority areas of bilateral. "Glad to meet Ambassador Sergio Gor, Special Representative of the President of the United States for South and Central Asia, today in New Delhi. Particularly noted the steady development of the Uzbekistan-US strategic partnership across all areas. We held an

in-depth exchange of views on further enhancing dialogue at the highest and high levels, as well as on the priority areas of bilateral cooperation," Saidov said on social media platform X. "Also discussed cooperation within the C5+1 format, preparations for upcoming joint events, and current regional and interna-

tional issues. Birla said that he and Bakhtiyor Saidov held discussions on further strengthening ties between India and Uzbekistan, with a special focus on enhancing Parliamentary cooperation, trade, investment.

Army nearly downed military drone during flight test: South Korean lawmaker

Seoul, Aug 10 : A front-line Army unit nearly shot down a South Korean military drone during a flight test earlier this week, an opposition lawmaker said on Monday, just days after the same unit mistook a US spy drone for an enemy threat. The 1st Army Corps, based along the western front bordering North Korea, issued an air defence alert and stood ready to shoot down the drone as it flew through airspace under its jurisdiction on Monday, Rep. Sung Il-jong of the main opposition People Power Party said in a press conference at the National Assembly. The drone was with the Army Test and Evaluation Group conducting a flight test. The test group had notified the 1st Corps of its plan to carry out the trial in advance, the lawmaker claimed, Yonhap News

Agency reported. The incident followed a similar mishap involving the same unit and the US military, in which the 1st Corps mistook a US drone for a potential threat due to a communication mix-up and mobilised artillery to take it down. The commander of the 1st Corps has been relieved of duty pending a disciplinary evaluation related to the US drone incident and other issues. Calling the latest incident another "major blunder" at the Army Corps.



IOM launches housing scheme for 600 displaced families in Mogadishu

Mogadishu, Aug 10 : The International Organisation for Migration (IOM), the UN migration agency, has said that it has completed Somalia's Garasbaley housing project, providing improved shelter for 600 vulnerable households. The project was delivered in partnership with the Iskaashi Union, a key community representative body, and the Banadir Regional Administration's Durable So-

lutions Unit (BRA-DSU). "Access to housing is much more than a roof over someone's head. It is about safety, dignity, stability, and the opportunity for families to rebuild their lives," Prestage Murima, deputy chief of mission of IOM Somalia, said on Monday in a statement, Xinhua news agency reported. Murima said rapid urbanisation and the internal displacement of more than 3.5 million people have severely strained cities such as Mogadishu, making sus-

tainable housing solutions an urgent priority. Funded by the EU, the project benefits displacement-affected communities in Mogadishu, providing vulnerable families with safer living conditions while reducing their exposure to evictions. IOM said it partnered with BRA-DSU, legal experts, landowners and community representatives to secure land tenure agreements, memoranda of understanding and rental arrangements. These measures provide participating households with at least five years of tenure security and strong protection against forced evictions, according to IOM. To ensure long-term sustainability, the project trained government representatives, community leaders, camp committees and technical teams. IOM said the capacity-building efforts focused on housing solutions, tenure security, accountability, disaster risk reduction and community engagement. The agency developed a

new settlement in the Garasbaley district and built 400 transitional housing units, 100 shared latrines, water access points, solar lighting and drainage systems. It also constructed all-weather roads, footpaths and a community multipurpose centre. Meanwhile, 200 nearby households received shelter repair kits, tools and technical support to improve their living conditions. Batulo, a mother of three displaced from the Lower Shabelle region, spent years moving between temporary shelters that offered little protection, stability or sense of home. She and her family lived under the constant threat of eviction and lacked any real sense of security. Reflecting on the impact of the project, Batulo said: "Now, we feel that we are living in permanent, secure homes. I no longer fear eviction. My children feel safe, and we finally have stability."

US ready for '78 Super Bowls in 38 days': DHS chief

Washington, Aug 10 : The United States is prepared to host one of the largest sporting events in its history despite significant security and logistical challenges, Homeland Security Secretary Markwayne Mullin said, describing the FIFA World Cup as the equivalent of "78 Super Bowls in 38 days". With millions of visitors expected to travel across North America for the tournament, Mullin on Monday added that the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) was confident in its security posture across

host cities in the United States. "Are we safe? Yes, we're going to have a safe and one of the best World Cups in the history of this event," he said during an interview on CNN's State of the Union. The Secretary said between five and seven million visitors are expected during the competition, creating an enormous security challenge for federal, state and local authorities. "There's not specific threats. There's a threat because of the amount of people coming in," Mullin added. The United States is serving as a

principal host of the expanded FIFA World Cup, with matches taking place across multiple cities. Mullin said each venue must be treated as a major national security event. "We have, keep in mind, 78 Super Bowls in 38 days throughout the United States and 11 different host cities," he added. Each one of those had to be treated like a Super Bowl. Each one of those will have a bigger audience than the Super Bowl." According to Mullin, DHS has the lead responsibility for security planning and coordination, work-

ing closely with local law enforcement agencies and international partners. He acknowledged that funding delays earlier in the year created additional complications for preparations. "The truth is, though, with the Democrats defunding ICE and CBP for 115 days and DHS for 76 days, it made it tough," Mullin said. He added that delayed reimbursements affected local law enforcement agencies that are helping secure venues, transport hubs and team facilities. "Our MOUs that we had with our local law enforcement, the reimbursement was be-



hind," he said. "We can't do this without our local partnerships." Despite those challenges, Mullin insisted that security agencies were fully prepared for the tournament. "We feel very confident on our posture in each one of these

places," he said. The Secretary also noted the scale of operations required to protect not only stadiums but team base camps, transportation networks and public gathering areas.

Central Europe calls for EU coordination in combating foot-and-mouth disease

Prague, Aug 10 : Central European states are seeking European Union (EU)-wide coordination to contain the spread of foot-and-mouth disease (FMD), Czech Minister of Agriculture Marek Vyborný said. The minister told journalists on Monday that the objective is to present a unified proposal to the European Commission together with partners from the Visegrad Group (V4) -- Czech Republic, Slovakia, Poland, Hungary -- and neighbouring Austria and Germany. "The current situation requires a coordinated response at the EU level to prevent further spread of the disease and to protect livestock in individual member states," he said. Also, on Wednesday, the



Czech government approved the deployment of military veterinarians to assist in border controls in response to the current situation surrounding FMD. Up to 20 military veterinarians are expected to support the State Veterinary Administration and contribute to inspections of cargo transport from Thursday or Friday, according to the Ministry of Agriculture, reports Xinhua news agency. The minister added that extraordinary veterinary measures are already in place, and an emergency status would only be declared if an outbreak was confirmed.

Qatar says US-Iran mediation efforts ongoing, draft agreement under discussion

Doha, Aug 10 : Qatar confirmed on Monday that mediation efforts between the United States and Iran remain underway, with draft language for a possible agreement continuing to be exchanged between the two sides as regional mediators work to prevent further escalation. "We can confirm that the efforts are still ongoing with all the parties," said Majed Al Ansari, adviser to Qatar's prime minister and spokesperson for the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, during a weekly press briefing, Xinhua News Agency reported. "We are looking towards diplomatic resolution as we are speaking right now," Al Ansari said, noting that the talks had reached "very progressive stages." The official said Qatar and Oman were coordinating closely to facilitate indirect contacts between Washington and Tehran. Asked about the Strait of Hormuz, Al Ansari said Qatar's immediate priority was "avoiding escalation, reopening the strait and reopening the door for diplomacy between the parties." "What we do not want to see right now is a major escalation in our region," he added, stressing that mediators were working toward a short-term diplomatic solution that would help restart negotiations. Al Ansari noted there were no direct talks sched-

uled between the United States and Iran but expressed hope that mediation efforts would soon lead to the resumption of negotiations. "Right now we don't have anything on the books when it comes to direct talks," he said. "But we are hopeful that if we can get a resumption of the talks anytime

soon, we'd be able to push forward towards a major deal." On the possibility of reaching an agreement, Al Ansari said no timeline could be set. Earlier in the day, US President Donald Trump said that talks with Iran are "going on right now."





Gujarat man held for posing as Hindu widower on matrimonial site, cheating women

Ahmedabad, Aug 10 : A 44-year-old man has been arrested in Ahmedabad for allegedly posing as a Hindu widower on a matrimonial website, using forged documents and false claims about his personal life to gain the trust of widowed women before cheating them of money and property, officials said on Monday.

The accused, identified as Karim Sipai, a resident of Sarghatani Ghati in Kadi, Mehsana district, was arrested by the Ahmedabad Crime Branch after a case was registered at the Mahila West Police Station.

According to investigators, Sipai created a profile on a well-known matrimonial platform under the name “Aditya Patel”, concealing his identity and presenting himself as a Hindu widower without children.

Police said he specifically targeted widowed women living alone, developing relationships with them by claiming that his wife had died and that he was leading a solitary life.

Inherited Rs 14,191 crore liability, says Punjab minister on HC order over DA arrears

Chandigarh, Aug 10 : Emphasising that Punjab already paid some of the highest government pay scales in the country, state Finance Minister Harpal Singh Cheema has said that the state government has inherited a Rs 14,191 crore liability of employees' pay commission arrears. He said on Monday that the state government has already cleared more than Rs 6,000 crore under a High Court-approved liquidation plan and remained committed

to paying all constitutionally and legally valid dues while examining the court's Monday's judgment and the available legal remedies. Cheema told the media here that the employee pay commission report was originally formulated in 2016 during the tenure of the Shiromani Akali Dal-BJP government but remained unimplemented for years. "The report was implemented only in July 2021. As a result, dearness allowance (DA) arrears from January 1, 2016, to July 2021 were frozen, creating a liability of Rs 14,191 crore," he said. The

state Finance Minister said that although the process of implementing the pay commission recommendations had been initiated under the previous government, the then Congress government remained in power without releasing even a single rupee towards clearing these arrears, leaving the entire financial burden for the present Aam Aadmi Party (AAP)-led state government. Explaining the steps taken by the current AAP government, Minister Cheema said after various employees approached the High Court the state government



prepared a structured liquidation plan, which was accepted by the court. "Out of the total liability of Rs 14,191 crore, the AAP government has already paid over Rs 6,000

crore to employees. The High Court accepted the liquidation plan, and its implementation is proceeding smoothly," he added.

K'taka Congress defends Speaker, Chairman candidate announcement

Bengaluru, Aug 10 : Karnataka Pradesh Congress Committee (KPCC) President B.K. Hariprasad on Monday defended the Congress' announcement of candidates for the posts of Speaker and Deputy Speaker of the Legislative Assembly and Chairman and Deputy Chairman of the Legislative Council, rejecting Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) allegations of constitutional impropriety.

The BJP had accused the Congress of violating constitutional norms by declaring names for the posts before they fell vacant.

The Congress high command has nominated G.S. Patil as Speaker, A.S. Ponnanna as Deputy Speaker, Saleem Ahmed as Chairperson of the Legislative Council and Umashree as Deputy Chairperson. Hariprasad said the party had only announced its candidates and had



not appointed anyone to constitutional offices. "The BJP leaders should first read the Constitution and then read the Congress party's letterhead," he remarked. He cited Articles 178 and 182 of the Constitution, which state that the Speaker and Deputy Speaker of the Assem-

bly and the Chairman and Deputy Chairman of the Council are elected by the respective Houses.

He accused the BJP of deliberately confusing candidate announcements with the constitutional election process.

"What else can it be called but ignorance when the BJP describes the announcement of party candidates as unconstitutional?"



India's Atmanirbhar policy in fertiliser sector cushions farmers from global shocks

New Delhi, Aug 10 : Under the visionary leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi over the last 12 years, the Department of Fertilisers has achieved monumental milestones, driving India toward complete self-reliance (Atmanirbhar Bharat) and insulating its farmers from unprecedented global market disruptions. Despite the West Asia crisis triggering a sharp rise in fertiliser prices and disrupting ship movement, the Union government has been able to mount a proactive response to ensure adequate supplies to farmers for the ongoing kharif season. This has been made possible due to a massive boost in self-reliance in fertiliser production under the Prime Minister's Atmanirbhar Bharat campaign over the last 12 years, according to an official statement issued on Monday.

Six new mega urea plants have been established since 2014, adding a robust annual capacity increase of 76.2 lakh metric tonnes (LMT). Two more high-capacity urea plants with a combined annual capacity of 25.4 LMT are set to commence production shortly, the statement said. As a result, India's domestic urea production surged from a mere 225 LMT in 2014-15 to an all-time record high of 314.07 LMT in 2023-24. In 2024-25, production remained steady at 306.67 LMT.

Haryana govt fully committed to development of cities: Minister

Chandigarh, Aug 10 : Haryana Cabinet Minister Vipul Goel on Monday said the government is fully committed to the development of cities and development works will be done at a faster pace in the coming time. Chairing a joint meeting, Goel directed officials of the Municipal Corporation and the Electricity Department to work in coordination with all councillors and not to keep any development project pending unnecessarily. He also directed the

officials that whatever development work is currently going on, it should be completed within the stipulated timeframe. "If there is unnecessary delay in any work, it will be considered as negligence of the officer concerned and appropriate action will be taken against him," he said. Food, Civil Supplies Minister Rajesh Nagar was also present at the meeting, whose objective was to establish better coordination between all departments and public representatives so that development works of the wards can be conducted



smoothly and high-quality facilities can be provided to the citizens of Faridabad. Goel clarified that the drainage system should be repaired in time so that people do not face any kind of inconvenience during the rainy season. He

directed the Municipal Corporation officials to start the work of cleaning drains and sewer lines with immediate effect and monitor it regularly. He also reviewed the water supply, sanitation system, health services and other ba-

sic facilities and directed all the departments concerned to work together so that citizens can get better services.

New Delhi, Aug 10 : The All India Muslim Personal Law Board (AIMPLB) on Monday condemned the allegedly "inflammatory, misleading, and factually baseless" remarks made by Bangladeshi author Taslima Nasrin against madrasas. "Defaming such institutions, which render invaluable national service, is not only unjust but also detrimental to the country's educational and social harmony,"

said AIMPLB Spokesperson S.Q.R. Ilyas. The AIMPLB calls upon the Union government to take serious cognisance of these inflammatory remarks and prevent foreign refugees from interfering in India's internal and religious affairs, Ilyas added. He said the Union government must ensure that the country's constitutional and social fabric is not allowed to become a casualty of the hate-driven politics of any foreign individual. He said Taslima Nasrin, while speaking to the media in Kolkata, made highly provocative statements regarding the Uniform Civil Code (UCC).

India aims to become world's innovation partner: Piyush Goyal

New Delhi, Aug 10 : India is working to transform itself into the world's innovation partner and deepen global collaboration in emerging technologies, Union Commerce and Industry Minister Piyush Goyal said on Monday. Addressing the gathering at the inauguration of the Bharat Innovates summit in Nice, France, Goyal said that while the theme of Bharat Innovates is to serve as a global accelerator for India's innovation ecosystem, the broader objective is to translate that vision into concrete action and position India as a trusted innovation partner for the world.

"While the theme of Bharat Innovates is a global accelerator for India's education system, the real spirit is to concretise our efforts to be the world's innovation partner," he said. "The year 2026, which is being celebrated as the India-France Year of Innovation, gives this initiative an appropriate setting."



Change in SIR schedule in Maha, final electoral roll to be published on Oct 27

Mumbai, Aug 10 : The Election Commission of India has revised the schedule for the Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of electoral rolls currently underway in Maharashtra, with reference to the qualifying date of October 1. According to the revised schedule, the house-to-house visitation drive by Booth Level Officers (BLOs) will be conducted from June 30 to August 17, 2026. The rationalisation and restructuring of polling stations will be completed on August 17.

The draft electoral roll will be published on August 24, 2026. Claims and objections will be accepted between August 24 and September 23.

The hearing and disposal of the received claims and objections will take place from August 24 to October 22, 2026. After completing all necessary processes, the final electoral roll will be published on October 27, 2026, said the ECI release. Government sources said that the door-to-door verification drive launched by BLOs on June 30, 2026.

Bharti Airtel's Q1 profit jumps 37 pc to Rs 8,167 crore

Mumbai, Aug 10 : Telecom major Bharti Airtel on Monday reported a robust 37.3 per cent year-on-year (YoY) rise in consolidated net profit for the June quarter (Q1 FY27), driven by strong subscriber additions, growing adoption of premium plans and healthy performance across its India and Africa businesses. The company's consolidated net profit rose to Rs 8,167 crore in the quarter ended June

30, compared with Rs 5,948 crore in the corresponding period last financial year (Q1 FY26), according to its stock exchange filing. Revenue from operations grew 18.4 per cent year-on-year and 5.7 per cent sequentially to Rs 58,539 crore, as per its regulatory filing. Commenting on the performance, Bharti Airtel Vice Chairman and Managing Director Gopal Vittal said the company delivered a strong quarter with healthy growth across both India and Africa op-

erations. "Our balance sheet remains strong, reflecting disciplined capital allocation and focused investments to future-proof Airtel," he mentioned. Consolidated EBITDA stood at Rs 33,599 crore during the quarter, translating into an EBITDA margin of 57.4 per cent. Airtel continued to strengthen its subscriber base during the quarter, adding 14.9 million customers and taking its total customer count to 681 million across 15



countries. The company said it recorded its highest-ever quarterly addition of postpaid customers, adding one million users during the period. Its postpaid subscriber base now stands at 30 million. Airtel also

reported strong growth in smartphone users, with its smartphone data customer base increasing by 21.1 million over the past year, representing growth of 7.5 per cent.



India's downstream textile sector gets support from QCO revocation amid US tariffs

New Delhi, Aug 10 : The government's recent decision to rescind the Quality Control Order (QCO) on several polymer and fibre intermediates will ease raw-material costs for the readymade garments sector, according to a report on Monday. The move will provide respite to the tariff-impacted downstream textiles segments, particularly readymade garments, which will now have access to more competitively priced raw material imports, said the report from Crisil Ratings.

The rating agency's analysis of 20 polyester yarn makers, representing 40-45 per cent of the sector's revenue, found that the move will increase competition for upstream polyester yarn makers.

The Ministry of Chemicals and Fertilisers withdrew the QCO on November 12, 2025, which removed mandatory BIS certification on imported yarn. The mandatory BIS certification was imposed in October 2023 to curb cheaper polyester imports from China.

8 of India's top-10 valued firms add Rs 1.90 trillion in market value last week

Mumbai, Aug 10 : The combined market valuation of eight of India's 10 most-valued companies surged by Rs 1.90 trillion last week, driven by a strong rally in domestic equities. The positive momentum came as benchmark indices posted solid gains during the week. The Sensex climbed 1,284.61 points, or 1.73 per cent, while the Nifty advanced 256.2 points, or 1 per cent. Market sentiment remained upbeat amid optimism over a possible peace agreement between the United States and Iran, which raised hopes of easing geopolitical tensions and bringing stability to global energy markets. The improved outlook boosted investor confidence and supported gains across several heavyweight stocks. Among the top-10 most-valued firms, HDFC Bank, Bharti Airtel, ICICI



Bank, State Bank of India, Bajaj Finance, Larsen & Toubro, and Hindustan Unilever recorded gains in their market capitalisation. In contrast, Tata Consultancy Services (TCS) and Life Insurance Corporation of India (LIC) witnessed a decline in valuation. ICICI Bank topped the chart in terms of weekly gains, with its market capitalisation rising by Rs 56,223 crore to Rs 9.61 lakh crore. HDFC Bank added Rs 38,571 crore, taking its valuation to Rs 11.89 lakh crore, while State Bank of India saw its market value increase by Rs 36,138 crore to Rs 9.39 lakh crore.

Dabur issues clarification on FSSAI order, says 'stands by purity and quality of its products'

New Delhi, Aug 10 : After the Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (FSSAI) issued a prohibition order against Dabur India Limited over the sale of food products carrying allegedly misleading "100 per cent" claims, the company said on Monday that its product labels comply with the prevailing legal and regulatory framework. In a filing with the BSE and the NSE, Dabur India said it stood by the quality and purity of its products. "Dabur India Limited believes that the declaration on our product labels comply with the prevailing legal and regulatory framework and are consistent with long-standing industry practices. Dabur stands by the purity and quality of its products and has never made any misleading claims," the company said in its fil-

ing. Earlier, the country's food regulator directed the FMCG major to immediately cease the sale of products bearing claims such as "100 per cent Natural", "100 per cent Pure", "100 per cent Purity Guaranteed", "100 per cent Organic" and "100 per cent Tender Coconut Water".



Coupang swings to Q2 loss on data breach fines

Seoul, Aug 10 : E-commerce giant Coupang said on Monday it swung to a net loss in the second quarter from a year earlier due to fines related to a massive data breach. In the three months that ended in June, the U.S.-listed company shifted to a net loss of 865 billion won (US\$570 million) from a net profit of

43.5 billion won in the same period last year, it said in a press release. Coupang, which generates most of its revenue from its Korean operations, has faced strong public backlash following the disclosure of a data breach in November 2025 involving more than 37 million customers, reports Yonhap news agency. In June, the Personal Information Protection Commission imposed

a record fine of 624.7 billion won over the data breach and the collection of users' online activity without their consent. Sales in the Product Commerce segment, its core online shopping business.

Chhattisgarh's first solar village: Nathukonha now powered by free energy

Dhamtari, Aug 10 : In an important step aimed at promoting renewable energy and ensuring electricity access to every household, Nathukonha village in Dhamtari district has become Chhattisgarh's first solar-powered village under the Prime Minister Surya Ghar Muft Bijli Yojana. The announcement was made recently during the visit of Union Agriculture Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan to Dhamtari. The minister handed over a certificate to the village head, Akbar Mandavi, officially recognising Nathukonha as a solar village. According to information, all households in the village have been equipped with solar panels under this scheme. Now the residents are getting free electricity. Houses are full of bright lights like never before. This scheme provides subsidies from the central and state governments to those who want to install

solar panels in their homes. The aim is to deliver free electricity to citizens. and also to encourage the use of solar energy to make the country self-reliant in power generation. Located along the banks of the Madamsilli Dam, Nathukonha is surrounded by forests and hills and is home to 27 tribal families. The installation of solar panels under the scheme ensures that villagers now have electricity throughout the year, greatly improving their quality of life. The villagers, who previously relied on kerosene lamps and a limited grid supply, can now power lights, fans, and small appliances, transforming daily life and creating opportunities for education and economic activities. Village head Akbar Mandavi expressed pride and gratitude on behalf of the community.



Tax amendment bill a positive step for data centre ecosystem: Nasscom

New Delhi, Aug 10 : Industry on Monday hailed the Taxation and Other Laws (Amendment) Bill, 2026, which proposes to simplify the tax exemption framework introduced under the Finance Act, 2026 for foreign companies procuring services from specified data centres in India. The Bill removes the need for case-specific notifications for both foreign companies and data centres, while also recognising data centre facilities operated through ownership or leasing "While the Bill is currently before Parliament, the proposed changes is a positive step for the industry."



RBI projects GDP growth at 6.7 pc for FY27 as India remains fastest-growing economy

New Delhi, Aug 10 : Terming India as the fastest-growing economy amid persistent global uncertainties, the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) on Monday projected real GDP growth at 6.7 per cent for FY27, 10 bps higher than its previous projection of 6.6 per cent in the prevision Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) meeting. In his address, RBI Governor

Sanjay Malhotra pegged Q1 FY27 GDP growth at 7 per cent, Q2 at 6.4 per cent, Q3 at 6.5 per cent, and Q4 at 6.8 per cent. He said that supply-side pressures from the West Asia conflict have eased somewhat since June 2026. However, the re-escalation of the conflict since the first week of July has amplified volatility in energy prices and renewed uncertainty around supply chains.

India's EV sales likely to grow 55 pc annually through 2034

New Delhi, Aug 10 : India's shift to electric vehicles is becoming a key economic driver, with EV sales rising 46-fold from about 50,000 units in 2016 to 2.3 million units in 2025 and the market is projected to grow to \$191.04 billion by 2034 at a CAGR of 54.94 per cent, the government said on Monday. India's growth has outpaced glo-

bal trends, where EV sales increased roughly 20 times-from 9.18 lakh in 2016 to 18.78 million in 2024, an official statement said. The EV battery market is likely to grow from \$2.71 billion in 2025 to \$15.90 billion by 2034 at a CAGR of 21.70 per cent. India aims for 30 per cent of all vehicle sales to be electric by 2030 and plans 1.32 million charging stations by 2030 to strengthen the ecosystem.





J&K L-G advises students to use skills for nation building

Srinagar, Aug 10 : J&K Lt Governor (L-G) Manoj Sinha on Monday advised students to use skills acquired at universities for nation building and improving the lives of people. He was addressing the Alumni Meet of Sharda University in Srinagar. In his address, he extended his felicitations to the Alumni, Management, Faculty and Students of Sharda University. Addressing a gathering of community members, officials, and local leaders, Sangma said the project symbolises the transformation underway in the state over the past eight years. "Together with my colleagues and officers, we have worked as a team to bring visible and meaningful changes. It is encouraging to see the pace of development in Tura," he said. The Chief Minister emphasised that the proposed facility should serve as a vibrant community hub for youth and women. He suggested that the building accommodate skill development programmes, indoor games, music and activity spaces, coaching centres, and study facilities. Stressing the need for women's empowerment, he also called for training initiatives in tailoring, handicrafts, and food processing. Highlighting key infrastructure initiatives, Sangma pointed to projects such as the P. A. Sangma Integrated Sports Complex, the Additional Secretariat, and an upcoming five-star hotel, which he said would significantly boost tourism and economic activity in the region.



Shashi Tharoor's proposal to unite 8 scientific and research institutes gets Central boost

Thiruvananthapuram/New Delhi, Aug 10 : A proposal to bring together eight premier scientific and research institutions in Thiruvananthapuram under a coordinated research cluster received an encouraging response from the Centre on Monday, with Union Minister for Science and Technology Dr Jitendra Singh expressing willingness to discuss the initiative with Kerala Chief Minister V.D. Satheesan. The proposal was discussed during a meeting between Thiruvananthapuram MP Dr Shashi Tharoor and the Union Minister in New Delhi. In a social media post after the meeting, Tharoor said the minister had fully embraced the idea

of creating a collaborative research cluster and was willing to take it forward as a model of Centre-State cooperation. He said the projects under the proposed cluster would be conceived and developed by the institutions themselves. "I am looking forward to further discussions in Thiruvananthapuram," Tharoor said, describing the meeting as excellent. The proposed cluster will bring together eight leading national institutions located in and around the capital city -- the Rajiv Gandhi Centre for Biotechnology (RGCB), the Indian Institute of Science Education and Research (IISER), the National Centre for Earth Science

Studies (NCESS), the Central Tuber Crops Research Institute (CTCRI), the CSIR-National Institute for Interdisciplinary Science and Technology (CSIR-NIIST), the Indian Institute of Space Science and Technology (IIST), the Centre for Development of Advanced Computing (C-DAC), and the Sree Chitra Tirunal Institute for Medical Sciences and Technology (SCTIMST). Six of these institutions fall within Tharoor's Lok Sabha constituency. The proposal builds on an initiative launched in September last year when these eight institutions signed a Memorandum of Understanding to deepen academic and research collaboration.

BJP's Bansuri Swaraj attacks Rahul over RSS remarks, questions his silence on Jharkhand exams row

New Delhi, Aug 10 : BJP Member of Parliament Bansuri Swaraj on Monday slammed Lok Sabha Leader of Opposition (LoP) Rahul Gandhi over his recent remarks targeting the Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh (RSS), alleging that the Congress leader "lacks the vi-

sion for a positive agenda" and relies on accusations instead of constructive politics. Her remarks came against the backdrop of Rahul Gandhi's continued criticism of the RSS, in which he has accused the organisation of attempting "institutional capture", rewriting India's

history and exercising influence over key Union ministries and public universities through the backdoor. Reacting to the remarks, Bansuri Swaraj accused Rahul Gandhi of lacking a developmental vision and said his politics was centred on allegations rather than meaningful public discourse.

Speaking to reporters, she said, "Leader of the Opposition Rahul Gandhi has neither a vision for development nor a positive agenda. His politics is based only on allegations and creating illusions. Due to a lack of facts, he repeatedly targets national and ideological organisations."



MP: Congress reviews 'Sangathan Srijan' exercise

Bhopal, Aug 10 : The Congress on Monday reviewed its organisational structure in Madhya Pradesh and discussed ways to strengthen the party's grassroots network under the ongoing 'Sangathan Srijan Abhiyan'. The review meeting was chaired by Congress General Secretary (Organisation) K.C. Venugopal at Indira Bhavan in New Delhi. It was attended by AICC in-charge for Madhya Pradesh Harish Chaudhary, Pradesh Congress Committee president Jitu Patwari, Leader of Opposition Umang Singhar, and

AICC secretaries handling the state. In a post on X after the meeting, Venugopal wrote that he held an in-depth discussion on organisational strengthening initiatives in Madhya Pradesh with Harish Chaudhary, Jitu Patwari, Umang Singhar, and concerned AICC secretaries. He added that the party also met District Congress Committee (DCC) presidents appointed last year under the Sangathan Srijan Abhiyan to gather feedback and suggestions on measures to further rebuild the organisation in the state.



Juvenile among two held in 30 kg heroin seizure case in Punjab

Chandigarh, Aug 10 : Making yet another breakthrough in the 30 kg heroin seizure case, Amritsar Commissionerate Police has arrested two more accused, including a juvenile, and recovered an additional 5.041 kg heroin, said Director General of Police (DGP) Punjab Gaurav Yadav here on Monday. Those arrested have been iden-

tified as Abhishek, a resident of Chheharta in Amritsar, and one Juvenile. The accused has a criminal background, with previous cases registered against him under the Arms Act, the NDPS Act, snatching and assault-related offences. The development comes close on the heels of the arrest of six individuals -- Gautam, Kabir, Sameer, Gurpreet and two juveniles-- after recovering 30.045 kg of heroin from

their possession last week. DGP Yadav said the investigation has revealed that the accused were linked to a Dubai-based smuggler who was facilitating the supply of heroin consignments from across the border. Further investigation is underway to identify other associates involved in the network, trace the financial trail, and uncover possible hawala connections, he said. Sharing operational details, Commissioner of



Police (Amritsar) Gurpreet Singh Bhullar said, acting on linkages established during the investigation, the police have recovered an additional 2.006 kg heroin from the possession of the arrested accused Kabir and also arrested his two associates on his disclosure statement.

'Rule of law' has replaced 'riot culture' in UP, says CM Yogi

Lucknow, Aug 10 : Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath on Monday said that the state has undergone a fundamental transformation since 2017, shedding its image of crime and anarchy to emerge as a state defined by "technology, trust and transformation". Replying to the debate on the Governor's Address in the

Legislative Council, the Chief Minister launched an attack on the opposition, accusing it of disrespecting constitutional traditions through its conduct during the Governor's speech. Such behaviour, he said, weakens democratic institutions. CM Yogi claimed that curfews and riots, once seen as the hallmark of the state, have now been replaced by governance rooted in the "rule



of law." "Uttar Pradesh has moved from being a 'fear zone' to a 'faith zone'," he declared. Citing the participation of over 40 lakh devotees in the Triveni bath on Mahashivratri as proof of improved law and order, he highlighted the deployment of more than 44,000 women personnel in the police force and the creation

of modern training centres and barracks as milestones in strengthening security infrastructure. The Chief Minister said the state, once labelled a "BIMARU", now contributes 9.5 per cent to the national GDP, with per capita income having tripled. He maintained that no new taxes have been imposed in the past eight-and-a-half years, tax evasion has been curbed, and the state is now revenue-surplus. Security, convenience and policy clarity -- the pillars of the double engine government.

Pakistan Defence Minister preparing to deploy iron fist on PoJK: Report

Islamabad, Aug 10 : Pakistan's Defence Minister Khawaja Asif equating protesters of Pakistan-occupied Jammu and Kashmir (PoK) with India and calling them "enemies" indicates that he is preparing to deploy the iron fist on the occupied territory, a report has revealed.

"I put them (protesters) in the same category as India and consider them also as enemies like India," Asif said in a video that has surfaced on various social media platforms. His remarks came amid the ongoing unrest in PoJK, which has claimed dozens of lives. Videos of Pakistani security personnel openly firing on civilians in PoJK's Rawalakot and several other areas have also gone viral on social media.

'His comment does not bode well for the people of PoJK. By portraying the protesters as 'enemies,' Asif is preparing to deploy the iron fist on PoJK," Sudha



Ramachandran wrote in a report in The Diplomat.

At least 21 protesters were killed and dozens of others injured when Pakistani security forces opened fire on protesters in PoJK on July 27. The protesters led by the Joint Awami Action Committee (JAAC), a coalition of traders, students and civil society organisations, had gathered at Rawalakot and had started marching towards Muzaffarabad, when the Pakistani forces launched a

crackdown. Casualty figures are difficult to confirm as the Pakistan authorities imposed a shut-down on communications in PoJK.

Formed in 2023, the JAAC initially raised issues of a hike in wheat prices and electricity tariffs. However, in 2025, the JAAC called for governance and electoral reforms, like the abolition of refugee seats in PoJK assembly, which are reserved for people who migrated from India's Kashmir after 1947, the majority of whom do not reside in PoJK. Among the PoJK legislative assembly's 53 seats, 12 are reserved for refugees, eight for women, ulema (Islamic scholars) and technocrats, resulting in only 33 seats left for direct polling. All the political parties in PoJK have exploited the refugee seats to form the government in the occupied territory, according to The Diplomat report.



US says southern route through Strait of Hormuz remains open, over 1,000 vessels assisted

Washington, Aug 10 : The United States Central Command (CENTCOM) said the southern route through the strategically vital Strait of Hormuz remains open for commercial shipping, despite what it described as continued Iranian aggression, adding that US forces have helped more than 1,000 vessels safely transit the waterway over the past three months. In a post on X, US CENTCOM said, "The

southern route through the Strait of Hormuz remains free and open for all commercial vessels seeking to transit the international waterway. Over the past three months, U.S. forces have assisted more than 1,000 vessels in successfully transiting the strait despite unwarranted Iranian aggression, and these transits continue today." The statement comes amid heightened tensions in the Gulf.

US Congressional panel splits on disability wage rule

Washington, Aug 10 : A House hearing in Wisconsin has reignited the US debate over disability employment and wages, with lawmakers weighing whether Section 14(c)—which ties pay to productivity for some workers with significant disabilities—protects "dignity" and "purpose" through work or should be ended in favor of competitive, integrated jobs. The hearing was held at Green Valley Enterprises in Beaver Dam this past week. Rep. Glenn Grothman said the goal was to move the discussion "out of the Beltway" and into "the real world."



Congress steps up cadre rebuild in MP, plans statewide outreach drive soon

Bhopal, Aug 10 : The Madhya Pradesh Congress Committee on Monday intensified its organisational revamp, directing district leaders to strengthen party cadres at the grassroots.

The decision was taken at a high-level meeting of district in-charges held at Indira Bhawan. The meeting was chaired by the state in-charge, Harish Chaudhary, and the state Congress president, Jitu Patwari. Senior leaders, including Sukhdev Panse, Sanjay Kamle, All India Congress Committee secretaries Usha Naidu and Sanjay Dutt, along with district in-charges from across the state, were present at the meeting.?

The leadership conducted a detailed review of the party's organisational status across Madhya Pradesh. It identified gaps at the booth and village levels and



stressed the need for sustained grassroots engagement to rebuild the party structure. District in-charges were directed to accelerate organisational activities in their respective regions. They were asked to maintain regular contact with party workers and ensure that local public issues are raised more effectively to reconnect with voters. Bratislava, Aug 10 : As Prime Minister Narendra Modi is set to arrive in Bratislava on Monday evening, the Indian diaspora in Slovakia is eagerly awaiting and "looking forward" to give a rousing welcome to the Prime Minister. On the second leg of his trip, at the invitation of the Slovak Prime Minister Robert Fico, Prime Minister Modi is set to arrive on a two-day State Visit to the Slovakia till June 16.

Earlier on Sunday evening, PM Modi concluded his successful visit with French President Emmanuel Macron in Nice, the first leg of his visit to France.

This will be the first-ever visit by an Indian Prime Minister to Slovakia since its In-



dependence in 1993. On PM Modi's visit to Slovakia, a member of Indian diaspora said, "I'm already getting goosebumps. It is a historical moment and we are all so excited. I can't tell you, I feel proud. It is giving a thrilling kind of feeling, of course, and it is beyond words, truly fascinating... He is a kind of a legend..."

Commenting on PM Modi's Slovakia visit, another member of Indian diaspora said, "I think this is the biggest moment for Slovakia... Because Slovakia is a

very small community, but now slowly industrialisation is increasing. Trade between India and Slovakia is increasing because of the EU-India deal. We are very excited to have PM Modi in Slovakia. This is a very big moment for us... We are very happy and have been waiting for a long time. We welcome PM Modi with open arms..." Another Indian community member said, "This is a matter of great pride for us that, for the first time.



Bangladesh's 'foreign policy bankruptcy' laid bare amid global crisis: Report

London, Aug 10 : Bangladesh is grappling with fuel shortages, rising prices, and diplomatic uncertainty while attempting to avoid offending any major power. The government's carefully worded statements during the recent conflict in West Asia have drawn criticism at home and scrutiny abroad, a report stated on Monday. According to the UK-based Middle East Monitor, at a deeper level, the situation reflects a more fundamental issue – the absence of a coherent foreign policy strategy in Bangladesh. A reactive, risk-averse posture shaped more by dependency than principle is, the report stated, a condition that can be described as foreign policy bankruptcy.

"The US–Israel war on Iran has shaken the whole world. The surprising air attacks on February 28, amid ongoing diplomatic negotiations, came as a shocking development, drawing

condemnations and muted responses from around the world. Bangladesh's reactions to the war, crafted in measured words, condemned violations of sovereignty of the Gulf states by Iranian counterstrikes, but not Iran's sovereignty violated by the US and Israel," the report detailed. "The reference to Iran as the primary victim was missing, exposing not just economic vulnerability, which is widely acknowledged, but a deeper, structural weakness in Bangladesh's foreign policy. The war has not created this weakness; it has simply revealed it," it added.

The report underscored that while the Iran war remains geographically distant, its repercussions are immediate, leaving Bangladesh affected despite not being a participant — a reflection of the "paradox of globalisation" for smaller states.

Ceuta migration crisis resolved; no one crossed border: EU Commissioner

Brussels, Aug 10 : European Commissioner for Home Affairs and Migration, Magnus Brunner, on Monday confirmed that the Ceuta migration crisis is now "resolved", local media reported.

"Spain confirmed today, as previously stated, that practically all those who entered Ceuta have now returned. No one has crossed the border from Ceuta to mainland Spain and continental Europe," stated the European Commissioner at a press conference in Brussels at the end of the informal videoconference of the Council of Interior Ministers, Italian News Agency Adnkronos reported. He also mentioned that there were no "criticisms" regarding the massive regularisations of migrants decided by Spain.



Brazil condemns US visa action against ambassador

Rio De Janeiro, Aug 10 : The Brazilian government strongly condemned the US State Department's decision to alter the visa status of Brazil's ambassador to Washington, Maria Luiza Ribeiro Viotti, calling the reasons cited by the United States "false." The US government revoked the Brazilian ambassador's visa in retaliation for Brazil's refusal last month to issue visas to two US State Department officials and its delay in approving US President Donald Trump's nominee for ambassador to Brazil. In a statement, the Brazilian government defended its decision to deny entry visas to the two US officials, saying they intended to visit Brazil to question the integrity of the country's electoral system, which it described as an unacceptable attempt to inter-

fere in domestic political affairs, Xinhua news agency reported. Regarding Washington's criticism of the approval process for the new US ambassador, Brazil said the United States had publicly announced its nominee before formally requesting approval, in violation of Article 4 of the Vienna Convention on Diplomatic Relations. "There is no rule in the Vienna Convention stipulating a deadline for granting agreement," the statement said, adding that the US request remains under review. The statement also noted that unilateral US sanctions against Brazilian officials, including Supreme Court justices and senior government officials whose US visas were revoked over allegations of political persecution, remain in place.

Israel expects US to safeguard its military edge amid Saudi F-35 deal

Jerusalem, Aug 10 : Israel expects Washington to preserve its access to more advanced US weaponry, a spokesperson for the Prime Minister's Office said, commenting on US plans to sell F-35 fighter jets to Saudi Arabia. Israel is currently the only Middle Eastern country operating the advanced stealth aircraft, and US law requires that any arms sales in the region do not erode Israel's "qualitative military edge" over its neighbours, Xinhua news agency reported. "The United States and Israel have a long-standing understanding, which is that Israel maintains the qualitative edge when it comes to its defense," spokeswoman Shosh Bedrosian told reporters.

"That has been true yesterday, that has been true today, and the Prime Minister (Benjamin Netanyahu).



MP govt sets Aug 15 deadline to complete work in 107 hostels, launch mess facilities

Bhopal, Aug 10 : Madhya Pradesh government has set a deadline to complete construction work in 107 government hostels by August 15 and start mess facilities without further delay to ensure better residential facilities for students.

A direction in this regard was issued during a review meeting of the Backward Classes and Minority Welfare and Nomadic & Semi-Nomadic Tribes Welfare Department at the Mantralaya, where the minister reviewed the progress of departmental schemes and hostel infrastructure. During the review meeting on Monday evening, Minister of State for Backward Classes and Minority Welfare Krishna Gaur expressed displeasure over the delay in preparations for mess facilities and instructed officials to complete all pending construction work within the stipulated deadline. "There should be no delay in completing the construction work or starting mess facilities. All pending work in the 107 hostels must be completed by August 15 so that students get nutritious food and better residential facilities," she said.



34-36 Ayushman Arogya Mandirs to be built in Delhi : Pankaj Singh

New Delhi, Aug 10 : The Delhi government is planning to establish 34 to 36 Ayushman Arogya Mandirs under the Pradhan Mantri Ayushman Bharat Health Infrastructure Mission, Health Minister Pankaj Singh said on Monday. Speaking exclusively to IANS, the Health Minister said: "We are planning to set up around 34 or 35 kendras. I can't confirm the exact number right now - it could be 30 or 36. We will reveal the final figure within the next 15 to 20 days."

Singh further slammed the opposition AAP over the recent Comptroller and Auditor General (CAG) report.

"I would advise the Opposition (AAP) to learn to face the truth. If there is a CAG report, they should at least sit down and review the mistakes they have made. They have cheated the people of Delhi and committed errors. Who will stop them from paying the fines for these mistakes and accepting the truth?" he stated.

Citing the CAG reports presented during the Delhi Assembly Budget session, showcasing many irregularities of the AAP regime, Pankaj Singh said: "Those involved in scams will not be spared. We are focused on our work, and our party genuinely cares about the health system and is taking steps to improve healthcare infrastructure."

Maharashtra needs Rs 2.56 lakh crore to complete 225 irrigation projects

Mumbai, Aug 10 : The Maharashtra government, which has launched an ambitious plan to make the state drought-free, will require Rs 2.56 lakh crore to complete 225 irrigation projects that are either pending from earlier or have been taken up since July 2022, when Eknath Shinde assumed office as Chief Minister. The data relating to the performance of the Irrigation Department since July 2022 was presented at the state Cabinet meeting.

As per the presentation made at the meeting, the total cost of the approved 225 irrigation projects, including previously approved and newly approved ones, is Rs 4.35 lakh crore. Of this, Rs 1.78 lakh crore has already been spent, while the state requires an additional Rs 2.56 lakh crore to complete the projects.

"The requirement of funds looks large in absolute terms, but it also includes the project cost of recently approved river-linking projects. It is not merely revised administrative approval for existing projects," an official from the state's Irrigation Department said.



The state has undertaken the Wainganga-Nalganga and Damanganga-Vaitarna-Godavari river-linking projects, which are jointly expected to cost around Rs 1.15 lakh crore. Irrigation Minister Girish Mahajan did not respond to queries regarding the requirement of funds to complete the projects. Another official from the department said that several projects have been pending for decades, leading to cost escalations.

NHRC summons Delhi Police Commissioner over delay in enquiry into Instagram ads promoting child sexual abuse material

New Delhi, Aug 10 : The National Human Rights Commission (NHRC) on Monday issued summons to the Delhi Police Commissioner for failing to submit an Action Taken Report (ATR) within the stipulated time in a case concerning allegations that paid advertisements displayed on Instagram promoted Child Sexual Abuse Material (CSAM) in India and redirected users to Telegram channels where such content was allegedly being offered for sale. A Bench presided over by NHRC Member Priyank Kanoongo had earlier taken suo motu cognisance of media reports published by the BBC World Service alleging that advertisements carrying expressions such as "rape video" and "child video"



were displayed on Instagram and continued to remain accessible despite being reported through the platform's grievance mechanism.



Gurugram: MCG to build drain to prevent leachate at Bandhwadi landfill site

Gurugram, Aug 10 : The Municipal Corporation of Gurugram (MCG) has prepared a plan to build a new drain to prevent the leachate seeping out from the Bandhwadi landfill site to the Aravalli forests area.

'Rahul disrupting Parliament to avoid discussion', says BJP spokesperson Gaurav Bhatia

New Delhi, Aug 10 : The Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) on Monday launched a sharp attack on Lok Sabha Leader of Opposition Rahul Gandhi, accusing him of deliberately disrupting Parliament to avoid a discussion on the Modi government's record of bringing fugitive offenders back to India from abroad.

The BJP claimed that between 2019 and 2026, the Centre successfully brought back 274 fugitives from 36 countries and described it as government's commitment for bringing of-

fenders to justice in India.

Addressing a press conference at the BJP headquarters in New Delhi, the party's national spokesperson Gaurav Bhatia questioned why Parliament was repeatedly being disrupted and blamed Rahul Gandhi for the ongoing impasse. "A very important subject needs to be discussed today. Everyone is wondering why the Leader of the Opposition, the immature, irresponsible, part-time Leader of the Opposition, Rahul Gandhi, is not allowing Parliament to function. Why is it that the immature, part-time, irresponsible Leader of

the Opposition, Rahul Gandhi, is preventing Parliament from functioning?" Bhatia said. He alleged that the political contest in the country represented a clash of two contrasting ideologies, claiming, "On the other side, Leader of the Opposition Rahul Gandhi only works to divide the country. Standing with anarchic elements makes one anarchic as well," he said.

Highlighting what he described as the achievements of the Modi government, Bhatia said the figures relating to the extradition and return of fugitive offenders should

make every Indian proud.

He said that under the Modi government's zero-tolerance policy, 274 fugitive criminals had been brought back to India from 36 countries between 2019 and 2026.

"On average, 40 fugitives have been brought back every year. No matter where they were hiding in the world, they were tracked down, arrested, and brought back to India. They will now face trial under the law. That is the strength of Prime Minister Narendra Modi," he added.

Drawing a comparison with the



previous Congress-led government, Bhatia urged people to examine the difference in performance and claimed, "You will get the answer to why Rahul Gandhi does not want Parliament to function. When these figures are placed before Parliament, the

people will ask why such political will was not visible during the Congress government's tenure." The BJP spokesperson further claimed that during the period from 2004 to 2013, only around four fugitives were brought back annually.



NCW suggests free reconstructive surgeries, disability benefits, Zero FIR for acid attack survivors

New Delhi, Aug 10 : A provision of free, lifelong medical treatment, including reconstructive surgeries, disability benefits and Zero FIR are among the key recommendations made by the National Commission for Women (NCW) to the government to strengthen rehabilitation, care and justice for acid attack survivors, an official said on Monday.

The NCW recommendations, based on the Round Table Consultation titled 'Navjeevan: A Consultation on Care, Justice & Dignity for Acid Attack Survivors' held in January, also talk of recognising acid attack survivors under the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016. The Commission suggested issuance of disability certificates; integration into the Unique Disability ID system.

Army-led initiative to bring mobile connectivity to remote border villages in Arunachal

Itanagar, Aug 10: The Indian Army and a telecommunications firm have signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) to expand mobile connectivity in remote areas of Arunachal Pradesh's Kameng district in a major initiative aimed at improving communication infrastructure and enhancing the quality of life in border regions, officials said on Monday. Defence spokesman Lt Col Mahendra Rawat said that, in a significant step towards nation-building through military-civil integration, the Indian Army and a private telecommunications company have signed the MoU to expand communication infrastructure in remote areas of the border state. The MoU was also signed to develop infrastructure and establish mobile connectivity in remote areas of Kameng district in western Arunachal Pradesh.

Delhi Police arrest thief wanted in snatching mobile phone of BSF man

New Delhi, Aug 10 : Delhi Police on Monday arrested a thief wanted in a mobile phone snatching case after sustained technical surveillance and intensive field efforts by the Jama Masjid Police Station team of the Central District. The original Aadhaar card of the complainant was also recovered during the operation.

According to a statement released by the Central District Police, the incident occurred on September 16, when a case of mobile snatching was reported at Jama Masjid Police Station. The complainant, a BSF personnel who had come to Delhi for onward posting, visited the Jama Masjid area. At around



6 pm, while walking near the Service Road at Kabutar Market, he was intercepted by two unknown individuals—one obstructed his path while the other snatched his Vivo V-40E mobile phone, which contained one ATM card. The complainant immediately raised an alarm by shouting "Chor-Chor," prompting ASI

Neeraj Tyagi and Constable Sumit, who were patrolling the area, to rush to the spot. They managed to apprehend one of the accused, and the snatched mobile phone was recovered from his possession. Based on the complainant's statement and the circumstances of the incident.



Japan, Australia sign contract to jointly deliver three frigates

Melbourne, Aug 10 : Japan and Australia on Monday said that they have signed the contracts to jointly deliver three of the 11 ships for the Australian Navy. These ships are based on the upgraded Mogami-class frigate of Japan, as reported by a Japanese news outlet. Japanese Defence Minister Shinjiro Koizumi and his Australian counterpart Richard Marles, who also doubles as Deputy Prime Minister, announced this deal in

Melbourne, Kyodo news reported. Mitsubishi Heavy Industries Ltd., which produces the Mogami-class vessels, also signed the contract. After the talks, in a joint press conference aboard the Mogami-class Kumano frigate, Marles said that these vessels will be built in Japan and delivered to Australia in December 2029. Over 10 years, the government of Australia will invest up to AU\$20 billion (\$14.4 billion) for the development of a new fleet, the report mentioned. These upgraded Mogami-class frigates come with 32-cell Vertical Launch and a range of 10,000 nautical miles. According to the government of Australia, the vessels will be equipped with surface-to-air and anti-ship missiles.

Taiwan President urges international community to stand against China's 'ethnic unity' law

Taipei, Aug 10 : Taiwan's President Lai Ching-te on Monday urged the international community to oppose China's 'ethnic unity' law and expressed Taipei's firm stance against authoritarian expansion and transnational repression, local media reported. In his address at the opening of the 10th annual Ketagalan Forum on Tuesday, President Lai said that the ethnic unity law, which came into effect in China on July 1, threatens Taiwan's sovereignty, persecutes ethnic or religious minorities, demonstrates China's use of transnational repression and poses a threat to people in the world through political censorship, Taiwan-based Taipei Times reported. He expressed Taiwan's commitment to upholding the principles of democracy while maintaining peace and security in the Indo-Pacific region. "At the Ketagalan Forum, I emphasized Taiwan's firm stance against authoritarian expansion and transnational repression. The international community must oppose China's red terror and its malicious law on 'ethnic unity.' We will strengthen countermeasures through global cooperation," Lai Ching-te posted on X. The Ketagalan Forum 2026 Indo-Pacific Security Dialogue is co-hosted by Taiwan's Ministry of Foreign Affairs and the Taiwan Institute of Economic Research in Taipei. In July, over 50 Uyghur civil society organisations strongly condemned China's Law on the Promotion of Ethnic Unity and Progress (Ethnic Unity Law) and urged the international community to take meaningful action to



repeal the legislation. According to a joint statement, the law is not a "technical administrative measure" but a "legislative instrument of forced assimilation". It noted that the legislation explicitly conflates the Chinese nation with the Chinese Communist Party (CCP) and demands that ethnic groups abandon their distinct identities in favour of loyalty to the Party, the Han-defined "motherland," and "Socialism with Chinese Characteristics." Under this framework, the organisations said, the Uyghur, Tibetan, Mongolian, and other non-Han identities are permitted to exist only insofar as they are absorbed into a single, CCP-defined Chinese nation. "The law's reach is sweeping. It entrenches Mandarin as the language of education, displacing Uyghur, Tibetan, and Southern Mongolian languages from the classroom and public life. It mandates the 'sinicisation' of religion, subordinating faith to Party ideology.



173 migrants rescued after boat catches fire in English Channel

Paris, Aug 10 : French and British rescue boats on Monday rescued 173 migrants from a boat that caught fire in the English Channel near the northwestern French city of Boulogne-sur-Mer, local administration said in a statement. According to a statement issued by the French Maritime Prefecture for the Channel and the North Sea, a migrant boat departed from the French side on Monday night in an attempt to cross the English Channel. During a monitoring operation, French rescue assets identified five people on board in need of assistance.

The five people were rescued by coastguards, while the remaining occupants refused assistance offered by France, according to the statement, Xinhua News Agency reported. On Monday morning, the boat caught fire near the boundary between French and British waters, prompting French and British rescue resources to launch a rescue operation. The maritime prefecture initially said 157 people had been rescued before revising the figure upward to 173 later in the day. "So far, we have not recorded any serious injuries."

Libya unified budget wins global backing

Washington, Aug 10 : The United States and key global powers have welcomed Libya's agreement on a unified national budget for 2026, calling it a "critical step" towards economic coordination, stability, and long-term political unity in the conflict-hit country. In a joint statement released by Washington and nine other governments, including Egypt, France, Germany, Italy, Qatar, Saudi Arabia, Türkiye, the United Arab Emirates and the United Kingdom, the signatories said they "welcome the signing on April 11 of a unified 2026 budget for Libya, the first Libyan national budget in over a decade". They described the move as a breakthrough that could help bridge divisions between rival authorities in eastern and western Libya. "We applaud their constructive approach to reach this agreement."



Three militants killed in Northern Philippines' clash with government troops

Manila, Aug 10 : Three alleged members of the rebel New People's Army (NPA) were killed during an encounter with government troops in Abra province in the northern Philippines on Monday, according to local media reports. The Philippine authorities said troops encountered about 10 suspected NPA members while conducting pursuit operations in the area. Soldiers later recovered the bodies of the three suspected rebels along with three high-powered firearms, Xinhua News Agency reported. The local government and the Philippine Army have urged local residents to remain vigilant and report suspicious individuals or activities as security operations in the region continue. On July 30, two alleged members of the NPA were killed, and another was captured fol-

lowing a clash with Philippine Army troops in Oriental Mindoro province in central Philippines, according to local media reports. The army said the encounter occurred during an operation after residents reported the presence of an armed group. Troops exchanged fire with around 10 suspected NPA members before the remaining rebels fled, prompting pursuit operations. The military said troops recovered improvised explosive device components.



Brazil, Mexico and Spain urge action over humanitarian crisis in Cuba

Madrid, Aug 10 : The governments of Brazil, Mexico and Spain expressed deep concern over the grave humanitarian crisis facing the Cuban people and urged necessary measures to ease the situation, according to a joint statement published on the Spanish Foreign Ministry's website. The three governments on Monday, also called relevant parties to avoid actions that worsen the living conditions of the population or that violate international law, and pledged to increase, in a coordinated manner, their humanitarian response to alleviate the suffering of the Cuban people, Xinhua news agency reported.

UNGA president calls for Security Council reform to address 'historical injustice,' says Spokesperson

United Nations, Aug 10 : United Nations General Assembly President Annalena Baerbock wants the Security Council reformed to correct the "historical injustice", according to her Spokesperson La Neice Collins. "She does believe (what) should happen is that there should be a discussion and a debate on reforming the Security Council", Collins said on Monday. "She has expressed repeatedly, for example, not having any state from Africa be part of the permanent member[ship] ... is an historical injustice, and that it (Council) is not representative of the world in which we currently live", Collins said. As the president of the As-

sembly, Braerbock "has not expressed any backing for any particular plan, but she has made clear that this organisation was founded 80 years ago in a very different time, and that it there does need to be reformed to bring it into line with 21st Century realities", she said. Braerbock is a former foreign minister of Germany, and while representing the country, she advocated for expanding the number of permanent members on the Council and permanent seats for India and her country on a reformed Council. Germany is a member of the G4, a group that includes India, Brazil, and Japan, which lobbies for Council reform. Last year, she participated in a meeting of G4 foreign ministers along with External Affairs Min-



ister S Jaishankar and signed on to a statement that "reiterated their support for each other's candidatures as aspiring new permanent members in a reformed Security Council". The statement also said the ministers "voiced strong concern over the persistent absence of substantial progress in the IGN (Inter-Governmental Negotiations process for Council reform) and underlined the urgent need to begin text-based negotiations". As Assembly president, Braerbock recently appointed Permanent Representatives Tareq M. A. M. AlBanai of Kuwait and Lise Gregoire-van Haaren of the Netherlands as the co-chairs of the IGN to recharge the negotiations.



McMaster warns on China tech threat

Washington, Aug 10 : Former US National Security Adviser Lt Gen (rtd) H. R. McMaster said the United States and its allies must move quickly to secure critical technologies and supply chains as strategic competition with China intensifies. Speaking at a panel discussion at the Thrive 2026 conference at Stanford University, McMaster said years of globalisation had left Western economies exposed by prioritising efficiency over resilience. "We became complacent," he said, warning that supply chains are now vulnerable in a period of renewed great power rivalry.

Hockey World Cup 2026: New format puts greater emphasis on pool-stage results

New Delhi, Aug 10 : The FIH Hockey Men's and Women's World Cup 2026 will feature a revamped competition structure, with the traditional quarterfinal stage scrapped and the top two teams from each of the two crossover pools advancing directly to the semi-finals as Belgium and the Netherlands jointly host the tournament from August 15 to 30. The new format means teams will have little margin for error from the outset, with results from the opening pool stage potentially carrying over into the next phase. India's men have been drawn alongside

England, Pakistan and Wales in Pool D, while the Indian women will face China, England and South Africa in their Pool D campaign. The tournament will begin with the 16 teams in each competition split across four pools of four. From August 15 to 20, every team will play three matches against the other sides in its pool, with the final standings determining the composition of the next phase. The top two teams from Pools A and D will move into Pool E, while the leading two teams from Pools B and C will form Pool F. The teams finishing third and fourth in Pools A and D will make up Pool G, with the corresponding teams from Pools B and C placed in Pool H. The second phase, scheduled from August 21 to 24, will see teams play three more matches. However, one result from the opening phase will carry forward — the outcome of the Phase 1 match between the two teams that progress from the same original pool. This makes every pool match particularly significant, especially for sides targeting the semi-finals. The top two



finishers from Pool E and Pool F will advance directly to the last four. The semi-final match-ups will be Pool E winners vs Pool F runners-up and Pool F winners vs Pool E runners-up. The remaining teams will compete in classification matches for positions 5th to 16th. Indian women's team's chief coach Sjoerd Marijne acknowledged that while he would have preferred the traditional quarterfinal route, the new structure presents opportunities that his team must exploit.



Mindset-wise, it's always about how to make the team win, says Jemimah on inaugural Champions Trophy

New Delhi, Aug 10 : India batter Jemimah Rodrigues has expressed her excitement for the inaugural ICC Women's Champions Trophy, scheduled to be played in early 2027, adding that from a mindset perspective, the thought of always making the team win will remain the same. The inaugural 2027 ICC Women's Champions Trophy will take place in Sri Lanka from February 14 to 28, 2027. "We've tasted success once, and we know what it feels like to be at the top."



Sciver-Brunt, Matthews, Samarawickrama nominated for ICC Women's Player of Month award

New Delhi, Aug 10 : England captain Nat Sciver-Brunt, West Indies skipper Hayley Matthews and Sri Lankan batter Harshitha Samarawickrama have been named as the nominees for the ICC Women's Player of the Month award for July 2026. Nat earned her nomination after leading England's batting effort in the knockout stages of the ICC Women's T20 World Cup 2026 on home soil.

UEFA, AFC and CONCACAF launch fresh attack on Infantino over FIFA rights row

New Delhi, Aug 10 : UEFA, the Asian Football Confederation (AFC) and CONCACAF launched an unprecedented attack on FIFA president Gianni Infantino on Monday, accusing him of breaking trust through "deception" and placing himself above the collective after his controversial proposal to sell a stake in the commercial rights to the World Cup.

In an open letter to the football community, the three confederations didn't explicitly call for Infantino to resign. However, they demanded an independent investigation into the events surrounding the now-abandoned proposal. "Football's strength has always been its unity," the confederations said in their letter. "We call for that unity to be honoured now, for leadership that serves football, not seeks to command it."

The Swiss administrator has faced increasing opposition in the football world since proposing a plan to sell off 20% of the World Cup's commercial rights to private investors. This scheme aimed to raise around \$4.2 billion.

UEFA, supported by the AFC and CONCACAF, has threat-



ened to boycott FIFA tournaments unless it gets assurances that similar proposals regarding commercial rights will not be made in the future.

"Leadership in football is not a possession," the three confederations said. "It is not about holding — or demanding — power to be held. It is a duty of service to the football family that entrusts it."

"When trust is broken through deception, when an individual places himself above the collective that entrusted him with authority, that duty has been abandoned," they added.

Shelton survives Fonseca test to reach Montreal QF

Montreal, Aug 10 : Defending champion Ben Shelton overcame the challenge of in-form teenager Joao Fonseca to book his place in the quarter-finals of the National Bank Open, defeating the Brazilian 6-3, 7-6(3) in a hard-fought fourth-round encounter.

The American, seeded fifth and ranked No. 10 in the ATP Rankings, was forced to dig deep in windy conditions after falling behind early in both

sets. Shelton, however, responded each time to maintain his unbeaten run in Montreal this week and secure his 30th victory of the season.

"It was tough out there today and I competed well. It wasn't easy conditions to play in. I struggled to find my footing on a lot of balls, as did he. A lot of it just comes down to grit in a match like this. So to come through with a win against a really high-quality player like Joao is huge for me," Shelton

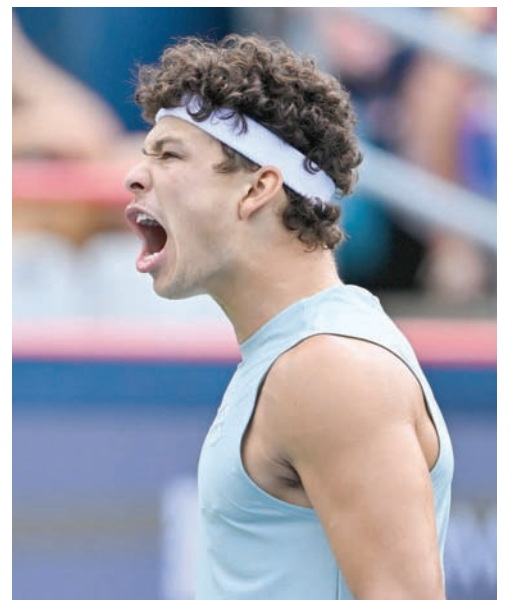
was quoted by ATP. The opening set saw both players exchange breaks before Shelton found the decisive opening at 4-3. A sharp forehand winner helped him earn another break, and he subsequently served out the set.

Fonseca, who had already eliminated former World No. 3 Stefanos Tsitsipas and ninth seed Casper Ruud in Montreal, responded strongly at the start of the second set, racing to a 3-0 advantage. His momentum was briefly

interrupted when he appeared to hurt his right ankle while attempting to chase down an overhead during a break-point opportunity. Shelton capitalised, recovering the break and drawing level at 3-3. Fonseca continued to battle and saved a break point at 5-5, but the American produced his best tennis when it mattered most, dominating the tie-break to close out the contest in one hour and 48 minutes. Shelton's attacking approach was central to his success.

He won 78 per cent of his first-serve points and claimed 14 of 18 points at the net, underlining his willingness to move forward and take time away from his opponent.

"For me, it's about playing aggressive tennis. I look to try to get to the net and be aggressive and take the time away."
