Revanth directs officials to expedite Hyderabad old city metro works

Hyderabad, Aug 11 : Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy directed officials to expedite the Metro Rail works in the old city under the Hyderabad Metro Rail Phase-2 project. The Chief Minister on Tuesday held a review of the Metro Rail-old city project with senior officials of the Hyderabad Metro Rail Limited (HMRL). The authorities were ordered to complete the road widening works along the 7.5 km stretch from MGBS to Chandrayangutta at a fast pace

and initiate the tender process for the Metro works on this corridor. Revanth Reddy enquired the officials about the pending land acquisition and instructed them to finalise the Metro expansion plans immediately. Noting the steadily increasing ridership on the Hyderabad Metro, the Chief Minister emphasised appropriate measures to handle the passenger load including adding extra coaches to



the trains and directed officials to procure the necessary additional metro rail coaches. Furthermore, regarding the 7.5 km corridor from MGBS to Chandrayangutta under Phase-2, the Chief Minister instructed officials to consult the Delhi Metro for assistance

on the appropriate technology to be employed. During the meeting, Revanth Reddy also reviewed the preliminary arrangements for the 'Invest Telangana Global Summit' scheduled for December.

Azharuddin urges protection of Telangana's Ganga-Jamuni Tehzeeb

Hyderabad, Aug 11 : Minister for Minorities Welfare and Public Enterprises Mohammad Azharuddin has called for preserving the state's long-standing tradition of Ganga-Jamuni Tehzeeb, emphasising that peace, brotherhood, and harmony remain vital to social unity. Highlighting the universal teachings of spiritual leaders and saints, Azharuddin urged the people to rise above religious and social differences to strengthen communal bonds and work collectively toward

the state's collective progress. Azharuddin was the chief guest at the Urs-e-Mubarak of Hazrat Syed Shah Afzal Biabani (R.A.) held at Dargah Shareef, Kazipet, Hanamkonda district. The spiritual and religious programme was attended by Minister for Revenue Ponguleti Srinivas Reddy and Minister for Endowments Konda Surekha, the local MLA, various chairpersons, elected representatives, senior officials, religious scholars, devotees and members of the public. The annual Urs-e-Mubarak is being observed with great spiritual fervour and is attract-



ing devotees from Telangana and different parts of the country. The Sandal ceremony was held on Monday, followed by Mehfil-e-Chiragan and Mehfil-e-Badawa. Speaking on the occasion, Minister Mohammad Azharuddin extended his heartfelt greetings to all devotees on the occasion of the Urs-e-Mubarak. He expressed his happiness at being invited to participate in the programme.

CM Vijay leads mass pledge, calls on youth to help build drug-free Tamil Nadu

Chennai, Aug 11 : Tamil Nadu Chief Minister C. Joseph Vijay on Tuesday led a major state-level anti-drug campaign in Chennai, calling upon students and the wider public to join hands with the government in its efforts to eliminate substance abuse and trafficking. Addressing a large gathering at a city college, CM Vijay said the fight against narcotics required collective action involving the government, educational institutions, families and young people. He urged students in particular to remain vigilant against attempts to lure them into drug use and to encourage their friends and peers to stay away from addictive substances. The Chief



Minister administered a mass anti-drug pledge at the event, with participants committing themselves to staying away from narcotics and helping create greater awareness about the dangers posed by drug abuse. The pledge emphasised personal responsibility, protection of families and communities, support for people undergoing rehabilitation and cooperation with government agencies working to curb the supply and consumption of illegal drugs.

Who is the person next to Rahul Gandhi? : Giriraj Singh

New Delhi, Aug 11 : A photograph featuring senior Congress leader and Leader of the Opposition in the Lok Sabha, Rahul Gandhi, has become a topic of discussion in political circles. Union Minister Giriraj Singh shared a photo on social media showing Rahul Gandhi in a boat with a woman and a child. He

raised questions asking, "Where was this photo taken? When was it taken? Who are the woman and the child with Rahul?" The BJP has criticized Rahul Gandhi's foreign trips in the past as well. The party had raised several questions regarding



the foreign tour he undertook from June 22 to July 13. However, it is not clearly known whether the photo recently shared by Giriraj Singh pertains to that specific trip. Meanwhile, the Congress issued a clarification after a political debate erupted over the viral photo.

'Vande Mataram' now on par with 'Jana Gana Mana' – President gives assent to the bill

New Delhi, Aug 11 : 'Vande Mataram' will now receive legal protection similar to the Indian national anthem, 'Jana Gana Mana'. President Droupadi Murmu gave her assent to the 'Prevention of Insults to National Honour Bill' on Tuesday, thereby enacting it into law. 'Vande Mataram' has been brought under the ambit of the law through an amendment to Section 3 of the 1971 Act. Legal action can be taken against anyone who obstructs the National Anthem or acts



in a manner that disrespects it. However, 'Vande Mataram' did not previously enjoy the same level of specific legal protection; the recent amendment has now extended such legal protection to it as well.

Andhra Pradesh to adopt 'Dharavi model' for slum redevelopment

Amaravati, Aug 11 : The Andhra Pradesh government led by Chief Minister Chandrababu Naidu, has cleared a new redevelopment model for slums, beginning with the Velampeta slum in Visakhapatnam, officials said on Tuesday. Taking a leaf from large-scale urban redevelopment models such as Dharavi in Mumbai, the Andhra Pradesh government proposes to leverage the value of development rights to create

modern housing for existing residents while minimising the direct financial burden on the exchequer. The government has accorded permission to the Greater Visakhapatnam Municipal Corporation (GVMC) to redevelop the Velampeta Slum in Zone-IV, Ward No.35 under the Visakhapatnam Economic Region (VER) Programme on a Design, Build, Finance and Transfer (DBFT) basis. The project will accommodate

177 housing units on a compact site measuring just 1,986.45 sq metres, through construction of a high-rise residential complex of up to 45 metres. According to an official release, a key feature of the model is that instead of relying entirely on conventional government funding, the successful private bidder will undertake redevelopment against Transferable Development Rights (TDR). The government has permitted a



TDR ratio of up to 1:4 as the maximum bidding parameter, with the project to be awarded through a competitive tender process. The bidder will quote the

TDR requirement competitively in lieu of the construction cost. This is expected to create a market-driven mechanism for upgrading valuable urban land while en-

suring that existing residents receive proper housing. To make the project viable, the government has also approved a series of special relaxations and exemptions under the Andhra Pradesh Building Rules. These include permission for a high-rise complex in a congested area, reduced setbacks, parking provision of around 10 per cent of the total built-up area against the normally prescribed 22 per cent, as well as waiver of specified fees and charges payable to GVMC, urban development authorities and other agencies.

Tummala orders tight vigil on cotton procurement, rules out middlemen

Hyderabad, Aug 11 : Telangana Agriculture and Marketing Minister Tummala Nageswara Rao has directed the officials concerned to ensure transparent and hassle-free procurement of cotton during the 2026-27 season, stressing that farmers must receive the Minimum Support Price (MSP) without interference from middlemen.

Reviewing procurement arrangements with Cotton Corporation of India (CCI) officials at Golkonda Hotel here on Tuesday, the Minister said the Central and State governments must work in coordination to protect the interests of cotton growers, particularly small and marginal farmers. Cotton cultivation in Telangana is projected at around 46.33 lakh acres this season, with an estimated production of 25.85 lakh metric tonnes. The Centre has fixed an MSP of Rs.8,667 per quintal for Long Staple Cotton, Rs.557 higher than the previous year.

Tummala warned that farmers should not be forced to sell their produce below the MSP and asked officials to prevent a recurrence of irregularities flagged during earlier procurement seasons.



"Dethrone Revanth Govt to honour Mala Martyrs": Mala Mahanadu Chief



Hyderabad, Aug 11 : Mala Mahanadu National President Dr. Pabbathi Srikrishna on Tuesday called upon the Mala community to defeat the governments led by Telangana Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy and Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu, alleging that they had harmed the interests of Malas and other poor Scheduled Castes through SC categorisation.

Addressing a gathering at the NSS in Hyderguda to mark the death anniversary of Mala activists who were killed during the 1997 ‘Chalo Secretariat’ protest against SC categorisation, Srikrishna paid tributes to Gopatoti Narayana, Panangi Seshayya and Reddy Sudarshan.

After garlanding the portrait of P.V. Rao, he said defeating the Revanth Reddy government would be the “true tribute” to the Mala martyrs. He appealed to members of the Mala community in Telangana and Andhra Pradesh to use their voting rights to oppose the two governments.

Srikrishna also criticised Nagarkurnool MP Mallu Ravi and former MLA Addanki Dayakar, alleging that they had worked against the interests of Mala community. He further alleged that attempts were being made through “staged protests” to dilute opposition within the community.

He urged Malas not to vote for the Congress in the upcoming elections and said supporting the Revanth Reddy government would be against the community’s interests.

Mala Mahanadu leaders A.N. Vinay Kumar, M.G. Vinay Kumar, K. Sekhar, Nagaraju and Jetti Haribhushan are among those who attended the programme.

BJP seeks fair compensation for Rajiv Rahadari expansion victims

Hyderabad, Aug 11 : Telangana BJP president N Ramchander Rao on Tuesday demanded that the state government provide fair compensation to residents losing their lands, houses and commercial buildings for the Rajiv Rahadari expansion project.

Rao, who participated in a protest by affected residents at Karkhana, said the people were not opposed to development and were cooperating with the road expansion project undertaken in the public interest.

However, he said those surrendering their properties must be compensated according to prevailing market values. Referring to the enhanced compensation announced for affected landowners in Thumkuntha, Rao demanded similar or higher compensation for residents of Karkhana, pointing out that the area falls in a more expensive urban zone.

Rao assured the affected families of the BJP’s support and urged the Congress government to increase compensation by an appropriate percentage and ensure justice to those sacrificing their properties for the public project.

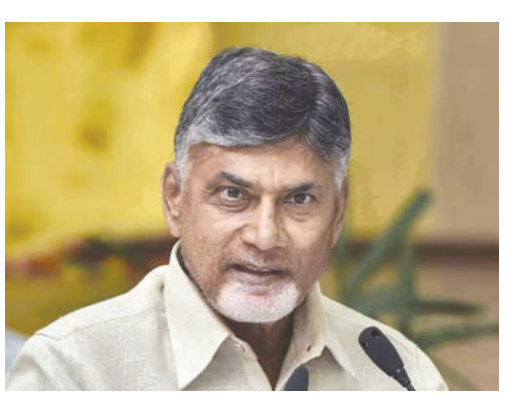

El Nino crisis: Andhra CM Naidu directs officials to take steps to check price rise

Amaravati, Aug 11 : Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu on Tuesday directed officials to ensure that people do not face any additional price burden due to the El Niño crisis. He suggested the formation of a committee to examine the issue. The Chief Minister also asked Planning Department officials to formulate plans to ensure that the state achieves its GSDP targets even during the El Niño crisis. He gave the direction when planning department officials presented the July 2026 economic report to him at the Camp Office here on Tuesday. The Chief Minister called for a contingency plan covering critical aspects such as water availability and value addition to agricultural and other products. He noted that the state is experiencing deficient rainfall due to the impact of El Niño. With inadequate inflows into the Krishna River, projects such as Srisailem and Nagarjuna Sagar have not yet reached full reservoir levels. The CM said the state had diverted floodwaters from the Godavari to provide water to the Krishna Delta. With groundwater levels also declining, he directed officials to coordinate with various departments and take necessary measures to ensure that economic output does not decline. CM Naidu called for comprehensive analysis of



available data and corrective action wherever gaps are identified. He directed officials to undertake all necessary measures to achieve the state's target of 15 per cent growth. He also stressed the need to ensure that exports to international markets are not adversely affected. Reporting from the district, constituency and mandal levels would make it easier to monitor progress and achieve targets, the Chief Minister said. The CM called for a comprehensive approach that takes into account factors ranging from the state level to the field level. The Chief Minister stressed the need for effective technology integration across all government departments.

HIPLEX 2026 Generates Rs.150 cr business, draws 55,000 visitors

Hyderabad, Aug 11 : HIPLEX 2026, South and Central India's largest plastics exhibition and India's third-largest plastics expo, concluded in Hyderabad with strong business activity, machinery sales and new orders.

Organised by the Telangana and Andhra Plastics Manufacturers Association (TAAPMA) at HITEC, the four-day exhibition attracted more than 55,000 visitors, including manufacturers, buyers, technology providers, investors and entrepreneurs from India and abroad. According to organisers, more than 110 machines were sold during the event, while around 75 per cent of the ancillary equipment displayed by participating companies was also sold. Exhibitors received orders for up to six machines each, apart from generating substantial business enquiries. India, China discuss boundary delimitation, border management issues

India and China held discussions on issues related to boundary delimitation, border management, mechanism-building and trans-border cooperation. The discussions were held during the 36th meeting of the Working Mechanism for Consultation and Coordination on India-China Border Affairs (WMCC) in New Delhi on August 6, the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) said in a statement on Friday. "The two sides engaged in frank discussions and reviewed the situation along the Line of Actual Control (LAC). Further, it was underlined that maintaining peace and tranquillity in the border areas is essential for the overall development of bilateral relations," said the MEA. Sujit Ghosh, Joint Secretary (East Asia), MEA, led the Indian delegation while the Chinese delegation was led by Hou Yanqi, Director General of the Boundary and Oceanic Affairs Department of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs. During the meeting, the officials of the two nations agreed to continue to use existing diplomatic and military channels, including the WMCC, local commander-level meetings and other agreed mechanisms, to resolve outstanding issues and avoid misunderstanding and miscalculation along the LAC. "As a follow up to the outcomes of 24th SR Talks, two sides held detailed exchanges on issues related to boundary delimitation, border management, mechanism-building and trans-border cooperation," the MEA stated. The Indian side reiterated the need for early convening of the next meeting of the Expert Level Mechanism on trans-border rivers and stressed the importance of sharing technical details on upstream projects. Earlier on August 4, the MEA said that India and China have taken several steps to improve ties between the people of both nations, including the resumption of the Kailash Mansarovar Yatra and the re-establishment of civil aviation connectivity. Addressing a bi-weekly media briefing in New Delhi on Tuesday, MEA spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal expressed confidence that these measures will further strengthen the positive ties between India and China. "Discussions between the two countries are ongoing, and the talks are moving in a positive direction. Several steps have been taken to improve relations between the people of both countries. You may have seen the resumption of the Kailash Mansarovar Yatra. Civil aviation connectivity has also been re-established between the two countries, along with many other such measures. We believe these steps will further strengthen the positive relationship between the two countries," said Jaiswal. The MEA spokesperson was responding to a question on concerns raised by the Indian diaspora regarding the rise in abusive content against Indians and Indian culture on Chinese social media platforms. Members of the Indian community had reportedly highlighted the issue during an 'open forum' hosted by the Indian Embassy in Beijing.

Putin announces senior military appointments

Moscow, Aug 11: Russian President Vladimir Putin on Tuesday announced a series of senior military appointments and changes within the Defence Ministry, saying the reforms would improve the military's organisational structure. Speaking at a Kremlin meeting with Defence Minister Andrei Belousov, Chief of the General Staff of the Russian Armed Forces Valery Gerasimov, and commanders of the Centre and East groups of forces, Putin said the ministry is continuing efforts to optimise its command and logistics system. Putin said the ministry had recently consolidated responsibility for weapons procurement and supply under Deputy Defence Minister Alexander Sanchik, a former Field Commander. He also announced the appointment of Valery Solodchuk as Deputy Defence Minister in charge of all rear and logistics services. Putin also approved changes to the command of several frontline military groupings, Xinhua news agency reported. Andrei Ivanayev was appointed Commander of the Center group of forces, which Putin said is responsible for carrying out key operations in the Donetsk region. Pyotr Bolgarev was named Acting Commander of the Eastern Military

District and Commander of the East group of forces. Putin also announced the appointment of Denis Lyamin, who previously served as Chief of Staff of the Center group of forces, to oversee the formation of Russia's newly established unmanned systems forces. Last week, Putin had signed a Presidential Decree to boost the number of servicemen in the Russian Armed Forces by 25,000, according to the information published on the official portal for legal acts. In June, the Russian President set the authorised strength of the Russian Armed Forces at 2,399,130 personnel, including 1,510,000 servicemen. "Due to the establishment of new military construction units within the Armed Forces of the Russian Federation, I hereby order amendments to Presidential Decree No. 419 dated June 12, 2026 'On Establishing the Authorized Strength of the Armed Forces of the Russian Federation'. Clause 1 shall read as follows: Set the authorized strength of the Armed Forces of the Russian Federation at 2,426,130 personnel.

Large AI data centres require environmental clearance: MoS Kirti Vardhan Singh

New Delhi, Aug 11 : Artificial Intelligence data centres proposed as part of a "Building and Construction Project" with a built-up area exceeding 20,000 sq m require an Environmental Clearance (EC) under the Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA), the Rajya Sabha was informed on Tuesday. Minister of State for Environment, Forest and Climate Change Kirti Vardhan Singh, in a written reply, said as per information provided by the Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology, the 'Resilience, Innovation & Efficiency' Working Group of the India AI Impact Summit has been set up to examine energy efficiency, water management, and environmental resilience in digital and AI infrastructure.



Bengal to check overstating of midday meal beneficiaries in govt schools

Kolkata, Aug 11 : Different district administrations in West Bengal, following the instructions from the state secretariat of Nabanna, have decided to conduct surprise checks at various state-run schools in the respective districts to verify whether the actual numbers of students in those schools match the number of students enrolled in the midday meal portal. "In case it comes to the notice of the administration that any school authority had shown inflated students' numbers in the midday portal, the concerned school authority, including the headmaster or headmistress, will be first served with a show-cause notice. In the absence of a satisfactory answer, disciplinary actions as per legal provisions will be initiated against the school

authority concerned," said a state secretariat insider. It is learnt that the decision to conduct these surprise checks has been taken following complaints that some school authorities for a long time have been showing an inflated number of students in the midday meal portal. "Already, the authorities of some state-run schools in certain districts have been identified guilty on this count, and disciplinary action has been initiated against them," the state secretariat insider said. According to him, one particular state-run school under Patashpur-1 block in East Midnapore district has been identified where the number of students shown in the midday meal portal was almost ten times the actual number. "On receiving complaints on this count, the block development officer concerned, on his own, conducted a surprise check at that school, and de-



tected such a mismatch between the actual number of students and the number shown in the midday meal portal. The headmaster of that school has been served with a show-cause notice and disciplinary action has been initiated against him," the state secretariat insider said. During the previous Trinamool Congress regime in West Bengal, there have been several complaints of gross irregularities in the implementation of the midday meal project. To recall, a joint review committee of the Union Education Ministry had earlier accused the previous Mamata

Banerjee-led Trinamool Congress government of overreporting midday meal beneficiaries between April and September of 2022, which led to an estimated financial discrepancy of over Rs 100 crore. Apart from that, the previous dispensation had often been accused of compromised food standards, with students in some state-run schools being served with only rice and salt. "The new dispensation is determined to bring an end to such anomalies in this scheme and take all necessary actions on this count," the state secretariat insider said.

Shehbaz Sharif's party leader out on bail in UK grooming case wins PoK polls: Report

London, Aug 11: Former Pakistani state minister Rukhsar Ahmed, who was arrested in the United Kingdom in July 2024 on suspicion of raping vulnerable young girls in Manchester in the 1990s and trafficking children in care as part of a grooming gang, has been "re-elected" as a "law-maker" from Pakistan-occupied Kashmir (PoK), according to media reports. He was elected last week after five years out of office, despite remaining on police bail in the UK following his arrest, British daily 'The Guardian' reported. Reports suggest that 62-year-old Ahmed was due to answer bail at a police station



in Manchester last month, but failed to appear, citing that he was "too unwell to fly". However, social media images showed him campaigning at various election gatherings in the Mirpur region of PoK. He was elected last week to the so-called PoK legislative Assembly as a lawmaker for the Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N).

408 students from Eklavya schools for STs cleared NEET: MoS Durgadas Uikey



New Delhi, Aug 11 : As many as 408 students from Eklavya Model Residential Schools (EMRSs) have qualified for NEET for MBBS courses, and 41 students have qualified for the Joint Engineering Exam (Advanced) 2026 for admission to Indian Institutes of Technology, the Lok Sabha was informed on Tuesday. Minister of State for Tribal Affairs Durgadas Uikey, in reply to a question, said eight Centres of Excellence are operational to provide focused mentoring and high-quality coaching to meritorious EMRS students preparing for IIT-JEE and NEET.

'Handloom has become our source of income': Himachal's Sharan village weavers celebrate revival of traditional craft

New Delhi, Aug 11 : The handloom sector in Himachal Pradesh's Sharan village has witnessed a significant transformation since the village was declared a Handloom Village by the Union Ministry of Textiles in 2020, creating new livelihood opportunities for local artisans, particularly women, while helping preserve the region's traditional weaving heritage. Located under the Rumsu Panchayat near Naggar in Kullu district, Sharan was selected for the recognition after a Ministry of Textiles survey found that nearly 95 per cent of its houses were built in the traditional Kath-Kuni architectural style and that a large number of residents were already engaged in handloom weaving, fulfilling the criteria for the designation. Since then, local artisans have expanded their work beyond household use



and are now producing a wide range of handwoven products, including traditional pattu shawls, stoles, caps, mufflers and other woollen items for the market, contributing to their household incomes. On National Handloom Day, sharing how the initiative has changed their lives, a local artisan said, "Earlier, we used to make products such as pattus only for our own use.

Indian American Thanedar loses Democratic Party nomination for Congress re-election in upsurge for progressives

New York, Aug 11 : Indian American member of the House of Representatives, Shri Thanedar, has lost the Democratic Party primary in an upsurge of support for progressive candidates in Michigan state where Israel was a factor in the background. Thanedar, who was first elected in 2022 and won again in 2024, lost to Democratic Socialist Donovan McKinney by a narrow 3.8 per cent margin, according to the results announced on Tuesday in the intra-party elections held. The seat in a majority African American constituency that covers parts of Detroit

and its suburbs is considered safe for the Democratic Party in the November mid-term elections. In the trend of progressives upstaging more moderate Democrats, Abdul El-Sayed won the state-wide primary for the Senate seat, and if elected would be the first Muslim in the upper Chamber of Congress. By a slender margin of less than one per cent, he defeated Haley Stevens, a moderate member of the House who sought the party's Senate nomination to succeed Gary Peters, who is retiring. The American Israel Public Affairs Committee's backing for Thanedar and Stevens -- as also many other candidates -- were turned into election issues by their

opponents. There are six Indian Americans in the House, and two of them, Thanedar and Raja Krishnamoorthi, who ran unsuccessfully for the Senate nomination, will not be there next year. But they could be joined by Amish Shah, who won the Democratic primary last month if he can turn the tide in the Arizona constituency held by a Republican. Thanedar's victory in the last two elections was remarkable because he ran in a constituency that is nearly 75 per cent African American. Besides his story of rags to riches, he was helped by several African Americans running against him in the primaries splitting the community's votes. This time McKinney, an African

American, was the only opponent in the primary. He was backed by several socialist and anti-Israel campaigners like Senator Bernie Sanders and Representative Rashida Tlaib and US Senate candidate Abdul El-Sayed. El-Sayed and many progressives made the Palestine issue a central in their campaigns. Thanedar had been a member of the Democratic Socialists, but quit in 2023 after the Hamas terrorist attack on Israel. However, he shared common stands with McKinney, like opposition to the Iran War and demand for extending government health insurance for all. Thanedar ranked among the staunchest opponents of President Donald Trump, trying to introduce



measures for impeaching him. His full name is Shrinivas Prasad Thanedar and he was born in Chikodi in Karnataka, coming to the US for a PhD at the University of Akron. While working for a pharmaceutical company, he

took out a relatively small loan to buy the failing enterprise. After turning it around, he went on to buy several other companies and became a multi-millionaire who financed his campaigns.

US Senate confirms Erica Schwartz as CDC chief after nearly year of vacancy

Washington, Aug 11 : The US Senate has voted to confirm Erica Schwartz as director of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) after nearly a year-long vacancy in which the role was filled only on an acting basis. The upper chamber on Tuesday (local time) voted 51 to 44 to confirm the nomination, mostly along partisan lines. Schwartz, who served as deputy surgeon general during President Donald Trump's first term, was already the Trump administration's third nominee to lead the CDC in the past two years, reports

Xinhua news agency. She has served as a rear admiral in the US Public Health Service Commissioned Corps and was Deputy Surgeon General from January 2019 to April 2021. Trump initially nominated David Weldon, a physician and former US Representative from Florida. Weldon's nomination was withdrawn in March 2025 due to insufficient Senate support. Then Susan Monarez was confirmed by the Senate as CDC director, but she was fired by Health and Human Services (HHS) Secretary Robert F. Kennedy Jr. in August 2025, just a month into her tenure, over vaccine policy disagreements.



After Monarez was removed, HHS Deputy Secretary Jim O'Neill was appointed acting director of the CDC, but he then departed the department in February 2026, prompting the appointment of Jay Bhattacharya, director of the National Institutes of Health, as acting CDC chief. The newly Senate-confirmed

CDC director will take the helm of the agency that is confronting a series of high-profile public health threats, ranging from domestic outbreaks of measles and cyclosporiasis to a surge in Ebola cases in Africa.

Hundreds of Japanese protestors demand PM Takaichi retract Taiwan remarks

Tokyo, Aug 11 : Hundreds of Japanese people held a protest in front of the prime minister's official residence in Tokyo, demanding that Prime Minister Sanae Takaichi retract her recent erroneous remarks on Taiwan and offer an explanation and apology. People started to arrive at the rally around 7 p.m. local time, holding signs with slogans such as "Retract remarks, oppose war," "This is all because of Takaichi," and "Takaichi step down," and shouted out slogans like "Prevent the resurgence of militarism," Xinhua news agency reported. At a Diet meeting on November 7, Takaichi claimed that the Chinese mainland's "use of force on

Taiwan" could constitute a "survival-threatening situation" for Japan and implied the possibility of armed intervention in the Taiwan Strait. Takaichi later insisted that her remarks were in line with the government's longstanding view and refused to retract the remarks. Several protesters at the scene demanded that Takaichi take responsibility for her remarks regarding Taiwan and resign as prime minister. Protester Haruko Oki told Xinhua that she was "very shocked" when she saw Takashi making the statement in the Diet on television.

Ebola caseload in Congo tops 4,000

Kinshasa, Aug 11 : The number of confirmed Ebola cases in the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC) has reached 4,053, including 1,850 deaths, according to an update released by the country's health authorities. A total of 694 patients remain in isolation or hospital care, while 793 people have recovered. International medical humanitarian organization Medecins Sans Frontieres warned Tuesday that the Ebola outbreak in eastern DRC is "more critical than ever," spreading at an alarming and unprecedented pace with "no sign of slowing down." Meanwhile, the Ebola outbreak in the DRC has killed 330 children and is severely disrupting essential health services in the hardest-hit Ituri Prov-

ince, the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) said Tuesday. "Although Children represent nearly one in four confirmed cases, they account for almost one in three deaths. Young children under five are particularly affected, with a case fatality rate more than double that of adults," the organisation noted, Xinhua News Agency reported. According to UNICEF, the outbreak also caused a sharp decline in childhood immunisation, maternal healthcare and other essential services, as fear of infection and disruptions to health facilities kept families away from care. "The Ebola outbreak is severely disrupting the entire health system.

100 deaths in mass border crossing into Spain's Ceuta: Local leader

Brussels, Aug 11 : About 100 people died during a mass border crossing into Spain's North African enclave of Ceuta last week, Ceuta President Juan Jesus Vivas told an extraordinary meeting of the European Parliament's Committee on Civil Liberties, Justice and Home Affairs on Tuesday. Vivas said about 80,000 people entered Ceuta, nearly 75,000 of whom subsequently returned voluntarily, Xinhua News Agency reported. Between 3,000 and 5,000 migrants remain in the enclave, leaving reception centres overwhelmed and creating a severe humanitarian emergency, he said, calling for stronger security, more reception resources and greater support from EU agencies. "An attack, a violation of territorial integrity. It is not a migratory crisis, but an episode in which the integrity of

the city, of Spain, and of Europe has been called into question," said Vivas, Italian News Agency Adnchronos reported. According to Guillaume Mercier, European Commission spokesman, the European Commission maintains "very high" attention in view of August 15, a date indicated by various rumours and speculations for a possible new attempt to massively cross the border between Morocco and the enclave of Ceuta. "Threats to external borders can happen, as we have seen. We have seen the alerts and are in contact with the Spanish authorities on this. Attention remains very high, in view of August 15. We are also in contact with Frontex and Europol. We remain very vigilant," he stated during the press briefing in Brussels. The European Commission is expected to disburse "additional" funds to Spain, to help it manage migratory flows in Ceuta, said spokesman Guillaume Mercier "We have seen that through various channels, including Russian

ones, the situation we saw on the ground last week has rapidly escalated," he added. He confirmed that the Commission received a first needs assessment from Spain on Wednesday and the Commission is rapidly examining the document to identify the best way to provide support. According to the spokesperson, the next step "will be for Spain to submit a formal request to the Commission, in order to concretely demonstrate what we are doing. It will be additional support," which "could cover a range of elements, starting from

equipment and services for border management, given the current situation, and could also provide humanitarian and medical assistance." "Regarding European Union agencies, we have offered support through Frontex and the European Asylum Agency. Yesterday, a meeting was held between DG Home and the heads of the executive agencies to discuss a regular and coordinated exchange of information on how we can support Spain. Work is ongoing on several fronts.





Manipur prepares for Har Ghar Tiranga with 2 lakh flags

Imphal, Aug 11 : Manipur has geared up for the nationwide Har Ghar Tiranga 2026 campaign by keeping around two lakh National Flags ready for distribution, with a series of patriotic and cultural programmes planned across the state from August 9 to 17, officials said on Tuesday. Art and Culture Department Secretary Naorem Praveen Singh said this year’s campaign will also commemorate the 150th anniversary of Vande Mataram, featuring events aimed at promoting patriotism and national unity, and encouraging every household to hoist the National Flag. He said the campaign, organised as part of the nationwide initiative of the Union Ministry of Culture, seeks to take the message of patriotism to every village and urban centre across Manipur. “The week-long programme has been designed to encourage public par-

ticipation, strengthen the spirit of national unity and inspire citizens from all walks of life to join the celebrations actively,” Singh told the media. Among the major events, a state-level Vande Mataram-themed Tiranga Concert will be held in Imphal on August 12 in collaboration with the Jawaharlal Nehru Manipur Dance Academy (JNMDA). The Education Department, Higher and Technical Education Department, along with the Art and Culture Department, will organise Tiranga and Vande Mataram exhibitions in schools, colleges and public places to educate students and the public about the significance of the National Flag and the national song. Ex-MLA Kanwarlal Meena moves Rajasthan HC over delay in parole decision

Jaipur, Aug 11 : The Rajasthan High Court has directed the State Parole Committee to decide within seven days on the permanent parole application filed by former MLA Kanwarlal Meena, who is currently serving a three-year prison sentence in a two-decade-old case involving allegations of threatening an SDM with a pistol and obstructing government officials from performing their duties. A division bench comprising Justice Ganesh Ram Meena and Justice Pramil Kumar Mathur issued the direction while hearing a petition filed by Meena after his parole application remained pending for over two months without a decision.



Congress attempted to create violence on polling day in Manjalpur: Gujarat BJP

Vadodara, Aug 11 : Gujarat Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) President on Tuesday alleged that the Congress attempted to create violence and disorder on polling day in the Manjalpur Assembly by-election after realising it was heading for defeat, while also thanking party workers for the BJP's victory in the constituency. The allegation was made during a "Rin Svikar" (Expression of Gratitude) programme organised at Tarsali in Vadodara to acknowledge the efforts of party workers following the party's victory in the by-election. State Organisation General Secretary Ratnakarji was also present at the event.

Addressing party workers, Vishwakarma claimed that the Congress "did not even have enough polling agents during the election" and alleged that it "attempted to create violence and disorder on polling day" after accepting defeat. "Expressing gratitude to voters and party workers after every electoral victory was part of the BJP's organisational culture and tradition," he said. He attributed the party's victory to Prime Minister Narendra Modi's leadership, public confidence in the BJP's lotus symbol and what he described as "meticulous booth-level planning combined with the hard work of party workers".

KBR park to go one-way from Aug 18 amid H-CITI works

Hyderabad, Aug 11 : Hyderabad Traffic Police will introduce a one-way traffic system around KBR Park from August 18, 2026, to ease congestion caused by ongoing flyover and underpass construction under the H-CITI project in and around the KBR Park corridor. With road space reduced due to construction and traf-

fic volumes remaining high, two-way movement on the available carriageway is expected to cause delays and congestion. The new arrangement follows two pilot trials conducted on April 5 and June 21, during which traffic flow, junction performance and congestion points were assessed. The Traffic Police said lane markings, directional signages and round-the-clock deploy-

ment of personnel would be put in place. Traffic movement will also be monitored through CCTV, the Integrated Command and Control Centre and drones, with necessary changes made based on real-time conditions. Commuters have been urged to strictly follow the revised traffic di-



rections, lane markings and police instructions. Motorists have also been warned against wrong-side driving and illegal parking, while emergency vehicles will be given unobstructed passage through Lane II. The Traffic Police appealed to citizens to rely only on official advisories and updated navigation routes during the transition.

200 Stanford graduates walk out during Sundar Pichai's speech: Report

New Delhi, Aug 11 : Google CEO Sundar Pichai faced protests and walkouts as he delivered the keynote address at Stanford University's commencement, even though he skipped mentioning artificial intelligence to avoid getting booed, a report has said. Roughly 200 students walked out of the ceremony to protest Google's ties to Israel and other grievances, the report from SFGate said. Though artificial intelligence may seem like a natural fit for graduates of the Stanford University located in the heart of Silicon Valley, every college commencement speaker this year got booed when they touched upon this subject. So Pichai spoke instead about his personal journey from India to Silicon Valley.

Experts advise investors to avoid impulsive decisions driven by short-term noise

New Delhi, Aug 11 : Markets are reacting to US tariff-related concerns and global uncertainties, yet these periods of volatility have always tested — and ultimately rewarded — long-term conviction, market experts said on Tuesday. The Indian stock markets, like their global peers, reacted sharply to the US reciprocal tariffs, and plunged. According to Arvind Kothari, smallcase manager and Founder, Niveshaay, panic is rarely a strategy and staying anchored to fundamentals is key. "We urge investors to remain calm and focused, avoiding impulsive decisions driven by short-term noise. While it's difficult to pinpoint which sectors will rebound first, but domestic-focused areas like FMCG and consumption appear better placed in the near term," he said. Export-heavy or globally linked sectors may take longer, with clarity emerging over time. Periods like these often pave the way for the next growth cycle. As clarity improves, staying invested in fundamentally strong businesses are likely to lead the recovery and create long-term value, according to Kothari.

Thiruvananthapuram, Aug 11 : Seeking to bridge the gap between India's fast-growing startup ecosystem and established industrial and business sectors, the Kerala Startup Mission (KSUM) has launched BRIDGE (Business Revolution through Innovation, Digital Growth and Enterprise), a corporate-startup convergence programme

aimed at accelerating technology adoption and innovation partnerships. The state-run KSUM, through this initiative, expects to enable structured collaboration, faster deployment of emerging technologies and new growth opportunities by bringing startups and established enterprises onto a common platform. KSUM CEO Anoop Ambika said BRIDGE would create a structured pathway for collaboration between startups and established businesses with measurable outcomes.

Sula Vineyards' Q1 profit slumps 45 pc as margins shrink

Mumbai, Aug 11 : Sula Vineyards, one of India's largest wine producers, on Tuesday reported a sharp decline in profitability for the first quarter, with net profit falling 45 per cent year-on-year (YoY) amid weaker operating performance and margin contraction. The company posted a net profit of Rs 1.06 crore for the quarter ended June, compared with Rs 1.94 crore in the corresponding period last financial year (Q1 FY26).



Sarvam AI turns unicorn after raising \$234 million in Series B round

Bengaluru, Aug 11 : Indian artificial intelligence startup Sarvam on Tuesday announced that it has entered the unicorn club after raising \$234 million in the first close of its \$300 million Series B funding round, taking its post-money valuation to \$1.5 billion. The funding round was led by HCLTech as a strategic investor, with participation from Bessemer Venture Partners and continued backing from existing investors Khosla Ven-

tures and Peak XV Partners. The latest fundraise marks a major milestone for the Bengaluru-based company, which is positioning itself as India's full-stack sovereign AI platform. Sarvam said the capital will be used to advance research on its next-generation frontier AI models focused on agentic AI, coding and cybersecurity applications, while also expanding access to large-scale computing infrastructure and accelerating deployments across key sectors.

As part of the round, HCLTech will invest \$150 million, making it the lead strategic investor. The IT services major said the partnership would combine Sarvam's AI research capabilities with HCLTech's enterprise expertise, engineering talent and global customer relationships to build a comprehensive sovereign AI ecosystem for India and international markets.



Blue Star's Q1 profit falls over 15 pc to Rs 102 crore

Mumbai, Aug 11 : Blue Star Limited on Tuesday reported a 15.3 per cent year-on-year (YoY) decline in net profit for the June quarter (Q1 FY27), as margin pressure and lower operating profitability offset healthy growth in revenue. The cooling products and refrigeration major posted profit of Rs 102.5 crore for the quarter despite reporting a one-time gain. In the corresponding quarter of the previous financial year (Q1 FY26), the firm reported a profit of Rs 121 crore, ac-

cording to its stock exchange filing. The air-conditioning and commercial refrigeration company registered strong revenue growth during the quarter, with revenue rising 13.3 per cent year-on-year to Rs 3,378 crore from Rs 2,982 crore. However, operating performance weakened during the period. Earnings before interest, taxes, depreciation and amortisation (EBITDA) declined 12.3 per cent to Rs 175 crore from Rs 200 crore a year earlier. EBITDA margin contracted to 5.2 per cent from 6.7 per cent in the

year-ago quarter, as per its regulatory filing. The company said the quarter's earnings included a one-time gain of Rs 9.2 crore, as per its filing. Meanwhile, tax expenses declined to Rs 32.1 crore from Rs 42.4 crore in the corresponding quarter last financial year. Following the announcements, the shares of the company were trading at Rs 1,565.40, down by 5.98 per cent or Rs 99.60. Founded in 1943, Blue Star is among India's leading air-conditioning and commercial refrigeration companies.

NE entering transformative phase under Act East Policy: Nagaland CM

Shillong, Aug 11 : Nagaland Chief Minister Neiphiu Rio on Tuesday said the Northeast is entering a transformative phase of development under the Centre's Act East Policy and stressed the need for stronger collaboration between governments and investors to unlock the region's full potential. Speaking at the inaugural session of the North East India Infrastructure Summit and Exhibition (NEINFRA) 2026 in Shillong, Rio said the region is witnessing unprecedented opportunities in connectivity, trade and infrastructure development. The summit, hosted by the Meghalaya government at the

Lariti Complex in New Shillong, has brought together policymakers, industry leaders, investors and representatives from all eight Northeastern states. Expressing appreciation to the Meghalaya government for organising the event, Rio described the summit as an important platform for fostering cooperation among stakeholders and accelerating development initiatives across the region. "The Northeast is entering a dynamic phase of transformation driven by the Act East Policy," the Nagaland Chief Minister said, adding that sustained investments in infrastructure and connectivity would play a crucial role in integrating the region with national and international markets.

He noted that collaborative forums such as NEINFRA are essential for bringing together governments, industry leaders and investors to translate development plans into tangible outcomes. Rio said improved road, rail, air, and digital connectivity would strengthen economic integration among the Northeastern states while creating new opportunities in trade, tourism, logistics, and entrepreneurship. The Chief Minister also highlighted the strategic location of the Northeast, which shares inter-



national borders with several countries and can emerge as a key gateway connecting India with Southeast Asia. Western Railway completes Samakhiali-Bhachau rail quadrupling project in Gujarat

Ahmedabad, Aug 11: Western Railway has completed the quadrupling of the Samakhiali-Bhachau rail section in Gujarat, a key infrastructure project expected to strengthen freight movement between the Kutch region and the ports of Kandla and Mundra while increasing capacity for passenger train operations. The newly constructed section has undergone inspection by the Commissioner of Railway Safety (CRS), with train services on the new lines expected to begin after statutory approval. Senior railway officials, along with a team led by E. Srinivas, Commissioner of Railway Safety for the Western Circle, carried out a detailed inspection of the newly built rail stretch of around 17 kilometres.

The CRS will submit an inspection report to the Railways, following which approval for the commencement of passenger and freight train operations will be granted. The project involved the development of 32.90 kilometres of new railway line, comprising a 16.398-kilometre down line and a 16.502-kilometre up line. Western Railway said track laying and linking work across the entire stretch has been completed. Construction of the project included approximately 6.25 lakh cubic metres of earthwork, 1.27 lakh cubic metres of blanketing and 96,000 cubic metres of ballast laying. To support heavy rail traffic, engineers also constructed four major bridges and 25 minor bridges along the section.

TN steps in to protect paddy farmers with Rs 34.72 crore seed subsidy

Chennai, Aug 11 : The Tamil Nadu government will spend Rs 34.72 crore from its own resources to continue subsidising the production and distribution of certified paddy seeds in 2026-27, stepping in after the Centre discontinued financial assistance for the programme. Agriculture and Farmers' Welfare Minister R. Vinoth announced the measure while presenting the Agriculture Budget in the Tamil Nadu Legislative Assembly on Tuesday. He said the State government had decided to ensure that the withdrawal of Central assistance did not disrupt the supply of quality seeds or increase the financial burden on paddy farmers. According to the Minister, the Government of India has stopped providing subsidy support for paddy seed production and distribution from the current financial year. Tamil Nadu, however, will continue the scheme entirely with State funding, considering the importance of certified seeds in improving agricultural productivity and the demand from farmers for continued assistance. The government has consequently earmarked Rs 34.72 crore from the State exchequer for the programme during 2026-27.



Minister Vinoth said making quality seeds available to farmers at the appropriate time remained a key priority of the government. Access to certified seeds is particularly important for paddy cultivation as seed quality has a direct bearing on germination, crop health, productivity and overall yields. The State government believes that discontinuing the subsidy following the withdrawal of Central assistance could push up cultivation costs for farmers and affect their access to reliable planting material. The decision to finance the programme independently is therefore aimed at insulating cultivators from additional input costs. The initiative is also expected to help maintain an uninterrupted

system for the production and distribution of certified paddy seeds across Tamil Nadu, preventing any shortage arising from changes in the funding arrangement. The announcement comes at a time when farmers are grappling with rising cultivation expenses, including costs associated with labour and other agricultural inputs. Continued seed assistance is expected to provide some relief, particularly to small and marginal cultivators who are more vulnerable to increases in input costs. The paddy seed subsidy forms part of the broader measures unveiled in the 2026-27 Agriculture Budget to strengthen farm productivity and provide continued support to cultivators.

Punjab's debt servicing costs over 23 per cent of total revenues, says Manish Tewari

Chandigarh, Aug 11 : Punjab's debt servicing cost, interest plus principal repayment, is in the range of about Rs 42,481 crore, or "more than 23 per cent of the state revenues", Congress MP Manish Tewari said on Tuesday. "It means for every one rupee of revenue generation by Punjab 23 paise go towards only debt servicing -- the revenue expenditure minus debt servicing is at 71.4 per cent", the three-time Member of Parliament and former Union Minister Information and Broadcasting wrote on X "What is then left for Capital Expenditure -- development expenditure that creates.



Mule account supply gang busted by Delhi Cyber Police, ten arrested

New Delhi, Aug 11 : In a major breakthrough against cybercrime, the Cyber Police Station of Delhi Police's East District on Tuesday busted a well-organised mule bank account supply racket involved in facilitating cyber frauds across the country, arresting ten persons and recovering several incriminating items, including POS machines, ATM cards, cheque books, and mobile phones. According to Delhi Police, the gang was engaged in procuring, operating, and supplying bank accounts that were used by cyber fraudsters to receive and route proceeds generated through online scams. The network came to light during the investigation of

FIR No. 49/2026 registered under Sections 112(2) and 318(4) of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS) at PS Cyber East. The case originated from a cyber fraud complaint filed by a woman residing in Kerala. During the investigation, police discovered that Rs 2 lakh, fraudulently obtained from the complainant, had been transferred to a mule bank account maintained with Yes Bank. Detailed scrutiny of the financial trail revealed.



NHAI to develop 121-km long Guwahati Ring Road on BOT mode

New Delhi/Guwahati, Aug 11 : The National Highways Authority of India (NHAI) would develop a 121-km-long Guwahati Ring Road on Build Operate Toll (BOT) mode at a total cost of Rs 5,729 crore, officials said on Tuesday. The NHAI on Tuesday signed a concession agreement with the Ahmedabad-based M/s Dineshchandra R Agrawal Infracon Pvt. Ltd in the national capital to accomplish the vital project. NHAI Chairman, Santosh Kumar Yadav and senior officials were present on the occasion.

Bihar govt signs MoUs worth Rs 51,600 crore to boost industrial investment

Patna, Aug 11 : In a major push to accelerate industrial development in Bihar, the state government on Tuesday signed Memorandums of Understanding (MoUs) worth around Rs 51,600 crore with several leading industrial groups from across the country. The agreements were signed in the presence of Chief Minister Samrat Choudhary, with the state government asserting that the proposed investments will spur large-scale industrialisation and generate substantial employment opportunities in the state. Addressing the gathering, Chief Minister Choudhary said the state government is committed to converting these investment proposals into projects on the ground at the earliest. He added that Bihar aims to emerge as a major steel manufacturing hub and that the state government will actively promote investments in the steel and metal industries. He added that equal emphasis will be placed on expanding sectors such as tex-

tiles, nuclear energy, food processing, and pharmaceuticals. According to an official government statement, companies signing investment agreements with several leading private companies in above sectors. Besides these, a private firm has proposed investment in the nuclear energy sector, while several other companies have committed investments in the textile and allied industries. Highlighting the importance of the textile sector, Chief Minister Choudhary noted that it is labour-intensive and has the potential to generate large-scale employment within Bihar. He added that investments in clean and nuclear energy would help meet the state's future energy re-



quirements, while growth in the food processing sector would improve market access for farmers and strengthen the rural economy. Bengal youth arrested for leaving motorcycle on the way of train at level crossing

Kolkata, Aug 11 : A 23-year-old youth has been arrested by the Railway Protection Force (RPF) in West Bengal's South 24 Parganas district for leaving his motorcycle at a level crossing between the Sonarpur and Champahati stations, leading to a train smashing into the two-wheeler and stopping, causing a disruption in services, officials said. The incident occurred. "We are treating this matter very seriously. The act could have caused a derailment. There could also have been a fire as the motorcycle had petrol in its tank. In both cases, passengers may have suffered injuries. We have charged the man under several sections of The Railways Act, 1989," a senior Eastern Railway (ER) official said. The youth, identified as Sudipta Mistry, is a resident of Purba Mali Pukuria in Sonarpur. He evaded arrest for six days before being picked up on Tuesday evening. He has been charged with obstructing rail movement and endangering the lives of passengers and may end up spending two years in jail.



High time EU calls out Pakistan on political imprisonments, election theft and terror financing

Brussels, Aug 11 : Pakistan's Deputy Prime Minister and Foreign Minister Ishaq Dar is visiting Brussels currently for the 4th EU Indo-Pacific Ministerial Forum and also holding several meetings with European counterparts on the sidelines of the gathering. Earlier this week, Dar, who is leading the Pakistani delegation for the 7th Session of Pakistan-EU Strategic Dialogue, also called on the President of the EU Council, Antonio Costa. Ironically, his visit is taking place just weeks before the European Commission submits its 2026 report on Pakistan's compliance with the 27 core conventions tied to GSP+ – the preferential trade scheme that delivers Pakistan roughly \$3-4 billion a year in extra exports.

China accused of misusing 'inciting separatism' charges after arrest of activist in Tibet

Beijing, Aug 11 : Leading international human rights organisation Amnesty International has strongly condemned the arrest of prominent Chinese pro-democracy activist Zhang Yi after he displayed a photograph of the Dalai Lama during a visit to a monastery in Tibet. The organisation described the case as a chilling example of China's continued crackdown on peaceful expression and the long-standing misuse of "inciting separatism" charges to criminalise peaceful expression in the Tibetan region. "The arrest of Zhang Yi after he showed a photograph of the Dalai Lama while visiting a monastery is a chilling reminder of how far the Chinese authorities will go to police the peaceful exercise of human rights. This case bears all the hallmarks of the Chinese authorities' long-standing misuse of the offence of 'inciting separatism' to criminalise peaceful expression in Tibetan areas and in relation to Tibetan history, culture and

religious belief," said Amnesty International's Deputy Regional Director Sarah Brooks. "Pending his release, they must ensure that he has prompt access to his family and a lawyer of his own choosing. Authorities must protect him from torture and other ill-treatment while in detention," she added. Citing an arrest notice received by his family on Tuesday, Amnesty International said that Zhang was formally arrested on July 28 on suspicion of "inciting separatism". According to the rights body, Zhang was detained by police in Lhasa on July 1 while visiting Sera Monastery in Tibet with his younger brother. It noted that after being unable to communicate verbally with a Tibetan worshipper from whom he wished to borrow a prayer mat, Zhang showed the person a photograph of the Dalai Lama on his mobile phone. Referring to his family's account, Amnesty International said that two plainclothes men observed the interaction and appeared to record Zhang.



Unknown armed men attack Pakistani forces in Balochistan's Chagai

Quetta, Aug 11 : Incidents of armed attacks on Pakistani forces' vehicles were reported in the Chahtar area of Darbandin in Chagai district located in the northwestern corner of Pakistan's Balochistan province, local media reported on Tuesday. Citing local sources, Balochistan Post reported that the attackers opened fire with automatic weapons and there was an exchange of fire after the attacks targeting vehicles of Pakistan forces in Chagai. There has been no official statement by the government regarding casualties or property damage. Meanwhile, a blockade was set up by armed men on the main highway between Al Bat and Patkan in Kharan district.

According to the Balochistan Post, armed men stopped the traffic temporarily and searched vehicles. The traffic was stopped for several hours and resulted in several lines of vehicles on the highway, noted local sources. Last week, Baloch armed fighters launched a series of attacks targeting Pakistani forces and installations across multiple districts of Balochistan, leaving several personnel dead. The fighters also seized and torched multiple vehicles transporting minerals, after opening fire on a convoy in the Nokchah area of Chagai district. The incident came against the backdrop of an "economic blockade" declared by the Baloch Liberation Army (BLA).

Pakistan: Nine killed, seven injured as rains wreak havoc in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa

Islamabad, Aug 11 : At least nine people, including four children and three women, were killed and seven others injured as rains continued to wreak havoc in Pakistan's Khyber Pakhtunkhwa province. Over 100 houses have also been damaged in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa as heavy rains triggered landslides and flash floods. Several rain-related incidents have been reported in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa's Swat, Khyber, Buner, Abbottabad, Upper Chitral and Lower Chitral areas in the ongoing monsoon spell that started on Aug 11, Pakistan's leading Samaa TV network reported on Tuesday citing details from the latest situation report. Over 103 houses have also been damaged due to heavy rains and flash floods in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, according to a statement released by the Provincial Disaster Management Authority (PDMA). Among these, 49 homes were destroyed fully while the re-



maining were partially damaged. A total of eight animals were reported dead in Abbottabad and Buner as PDMA, Rescue 1122 and other relevant agencies continued conducting search and rescue operations in the impacted areas. Authorities were also carrying out damage assessment to determine the losses caused by the monsoon rains. A total of 37 people have died and 36 injured in rain-related incidents in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa since the start of the recent monsoon season.

PM Modi makes history in Bratislava as India and Slovakia sign key agreements: MEA

Bratislava, Aug 11 : In a landmark moment for bilateral relations, Prime Minister Narendra Modi arrived in the Slovak capital on Tuesday for the first-ever visit by an Indian head of government since Slovakia's independence in 1993, a historic trip that saw the two nations sign multiple agreements, including a key defence pact. MEA Secretary (West) Sibi George said that upon his arrival, invited by Slovak Prime Minister Robert Fico, PM Modi was received with full diplomatic honours. "The significance of the visit was immediately underscored when President Peter Pellegrini conferred the Order of the White Double Cross First Class upon the Indian leader at the Presidential Palace. This decoration, the highest civilian award of the land, has rarely been bestowed upon foreign dignitaries," he said.



US Democrats push bill to rebuild America's manufacturing base

Washington, Aug 11 : The opposition Democrats unveiled sweeping legislation in the US Senate aimed at rebuilding America's manufacturing base, reducing reliance on Chinese-dominated supply chains and expanding federal support for industries considered vital to US economic and national security interests. The proposed Make More in America Act would significantly broaden the mandate of the Export-Import Bank of the United States (EXIM), allowing it to finance domestic manufacturing projects in sectors ranging from semiconductors and artificial intelligence to critical minerals, biotechnology, robotics, batteries and shipbuilding. Announcing the legislation, Senate Democratic Leader Chuck Schumer said repeated disruptions to global supply chains had exposed vulnerabilities in the US economy and contributed to higher costs for American consumers.



"Americans cannot keep paying the price every time a supply chain crisis hits — whether it's a pandemic, a war, or the whims of the Chinese Communist Party trying to undermine the American economy," Schumer said. "We have to break the cycle of supply chain shocks that are raising prices, invest in American industry, and protect our national security," he added. The legislation has been introduced by Schumer along with Senators Jack Reed, Amy Klobuchar, Chris Coons, Brian Schatz, Cory Booker, Elizabeth Warren, Chris Van Hollen, Tammy Duckworth, Mark Kelly, Andy Kim, Lisa Blunt Rochester and Angela Alsobrooks. According to the bill, EXIM

would be empowered to support the development, commercialisation, production and future export of technologies deemed critical to America's economic competitiveness and national security. The legislation would establish a permanent "Make More in America Program" focused on expanding manufacturing capacity across the United States. Priority industries include semiconductors, artificial intelligence, quantum technology, biotechnology, advanced energy systems, critical minerals, drones, robotics and shipbuilding. "The United States has faced a manufacturing decline under the Trump Administration and we need to reverse that trend," Reed said. "We must bolster domestic supply chains, revive America's manufacturing competitiveness, and get our manufacturing workforce growing again to ensure America is capable of responding to global threats and builds critical technologies here at home."



Assam: 74 cartons of foreign liquor seized, three held

Guwahati, Aug 11 : Assam Police seized 74 cartons of illegally transported foreign liquor concealed inside a cargo truck during a routine checking operation at the Kalainchhara Toll Gate police checkpoint on National Highway-6 in the Cachar district, and arrested three persons in connection with the smuggling attempt, officials said on Tuesday. Police said the contraband was hidden behind consignments of legitimate goods loaded in the truck in an apparent bid to evade detection. The three arrested have been identified as Sandhyaram Debbarma, Katarajay Debbarma and Deniya Reng,

all residents of Tripura. They have been taken into custody for further interrogation. According to police officials, the truck was intercepted during routine vehicle checking at the naka checkpoint near the Kalainchhara Toll Gate in Cachar district. Suspicious movement of the vehicle prompted personnel on duty to carry out a detailed search. During the inspection, officers discovered 74 cartons of foreign liquor concealed behind other goods being transported in the vehicle. The entire consignment, along with the truck used for transporting it, was seized.

BJP leader compares Bengaluru street vendor removal drive to Turkman Gate demolitions

Bengaluru/New Delhi, Aug 11 : BJP MP and former Karnataka Deputy Chief Minister, Govind Karjol, on Tuesday condemned the eviction of street vendors in Bengaluru by the Greater Bengaluru Authority (GBA) under the 'Safe Footpath Campaign', comparing the government's actions to the controversial Turkman Gate demolitions during the Emergency and accusing it of threatening the livelihoods of lakhs of poor families. The Karnataka government launched a 'Safe Footpath Campaign' on July 1 this year to remove footpath encroachments across Bengaluru, with

Bengaluru Development Minister Krishna Byre Gowda asserting that nearly 300 pedestrians lose their lives in road accidents every year after being forced to walk on roads due to encroached footpaths. He had clarified that the encroachments were being removed in accordance with the directions of the Supreme Court and in response to repeated demands from Bengaluru residents for safe and accessible footpaths. While the state government promised relocation and organised pushcarts for registered vendors.

Quota should continue as long as social inequality persists: Mohan Bhagwat

Mumbai, Aug 11 : Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh (RSS) chief Mohan Bhagwat on Tuesday stated that caste-based reservations in India must continue as long as social discrimination and inequality exist in society. He emphasised viewing the issue through the perspective of Dr B R Ambedkar to avoid friction and controversy. Bhagwat was speaking during an interactive session with over 2,000 youths from Gen Z and Gen Alpha at an event organised to mark the 15th anniversary celebrations of India's International Movement to Unite Nations (IIMUN). During the session,

IIMUN founder Rishabh Shah posed several questions to young participants regarding student protests at Delhi's Jantar Mantar, reservation policy, and key challenges facing the youth. When asked if the time had come to reduce reservation quotas in education and employment, Bhagwat declined to answer with a direct "yes" or "no". Instead, he stressed that the issue must be understood through Dr B R Ambedkar's vision. "Reservation exists due to social factors," he said. "As long as social inequality remains, reservation must continue." Bhagwat appealed to well-off individuals within reserved categories to show generosity. He noted that those who have already achieved socio-economic progress using reservations should voluntarily step aside so that underprivileged members of society can benefit. He added that a thought process favouring this



shift is gradually emerging among quota beneficiaries themselves, referencing recent Supreme Court observations regarding sub-classification to ensure equitable distribution of benefits. Expressing dissatisfaction over political weaponisation of reservations, Bhagwat stated that reservation was originally designed as a tool to achieve social harmony. "The concept itself is not wrong, but those holding the sword are wielding it intentionally in the wrong direction," he remarked. The RSS chief added that until this political mindset shifts, the situation will not improve, though effective implementation of welfare schemes could eventually reduce the need for quotas.

Maharashtra govt waives registration fees for ancestral land partition

Mumbai, Aug 11 : In a bid to provide significant relief to farmers and the general public, the Maharashtra government on Tuesday announced a total waiver of registration fees for the partition deeds of ancestral agricultural land. The Revenue Department officially issued the circular regarding this exemption today. The waiver now extends beyond cases handled by Tahsildars under Section 85 of the Maharashtra Land Revenue Code, 1966. It also covers partition deeds of ancestral agricultural land brought directly to the Sub-Registrar's office for registration through mutual consent. This decisive step was taken by Revenue Minister Chandrashekhar Bawankule, following directives from Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis, the government circular said. According to Minister Bawankule, no registration fee will be charged for land partition among family members. The waiver applies whether the partition is processed via the Tahsildar's office or registered directly at the Sub-Registrar's office. By making the process free,



the government aims to reduce pending land disputes and encourage formal documentation of family settlements. A notification issued on June 23, 2025, had previously exempted registration fees for partitions made under Section 85, for which Tahsildars are authorised. However, many citizens preferred registering their mutual partitions directly at Sub-Registrar offices. Due to a lack of explicit provisions in the original notification, Sub-Registrars continued to charge fees, leading to confusion and a financial burden on farmers, the government circular said. The clarification ensures that as long as the partition involves ancestral agricultural land among legal heirs or co-holders of the same family.

Haryana signs pact with IIT-Madras for data-driven road safety interventions

Chandigarh, Aug 11 : The Haryana government on Tuesday announced to extend its collaboration with IIT-Madras by signing a two-year pact for data-driven road safety interventions. The agreement was unveiled in the presence of Chief Secretary Anurag Rastogi and Prof Venkatesh Balasubramanian, Head of the Centre of Excellence for Road Safety (CoERS) at IIT-Madras. The partnership leverages

tools like the 'Sanjaya' platform, previously launched in the state, to visualise accident data and plan targeted interventions. Additional Chief Secretary (Transport) Ashok Khemka, Additional Chief Secretary (Health and Family Welfare) Sudhir Rajpal, Transport Commissioner Dusmanta Kumar Behera and senior officers of various departments were present on the occasion. During a meeting on road safety measures, Rastogi called for the formation of a working group to implement actionable



strategies, emphasising the need to save lives lost in road accidents. He directed the Transport and Health Departments to develop a detailed roadmap for upgrading trauma centers, particularly near highways, to improve emergency response. The meeting was in-

formed that due to safety measures implemented by the government, there was a declining trend in the number of road accident fatalities in the state since 2022 and the major cause for these deaths was found to be overspeeding.



Punjab approves policy to enhance supply of sand, gravel; reduce illegal mining

Chandigarh, Aug 11 : The Punjab Cabinet, presided over by Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann, on Tuesday paved the way for checking illegal mining and further reducing the price of sand and gravel for the public. A spokesperson for the Chief Minister's Office said the Cabinet approved significant amendments in the Punjab Minor Mineral Policy that aims to enhance the supply of raw materials in the market, reduce illegal mining and corruption.

Lies being spread, no photo of Rahul Gandhi on sanitary pads: Pramod Tiwari

Prayagraj, Aug 11 : Rajya Sabha MP and senior Congress leader Pramod Tiwari on Tuesday said that lies are being spread by pasting Rahul Gandhi's picture on sanitary pads. He said that the fake video posted on social media reflects the poor thinking of the BJP.



Madhya Pradesh Congress begins 'talent hunt' for spokesperson selection

Bhopal, Aug 11 : The Madhya Pradesh Congress Committee (MPCC) on Tuesday launched a "talent hunt" programme for the selection of spokespersons to represent the party's views and ideology at the district, division, state, and national levels. A formal announcement was made by state Congress chief Jitu Patwari during a press conference at the party's headquarters in Bhopal, stating that in the changing political landscape, the party needs ideologically committed and research-oriented colleagues who can effectively

convey the Congress ideology to the public. Patwari shared that based on the applications received, interviews will be conducted at the division level. In these interviews, the AICC-designated coordinator, members of the talent hunt committee, senior Congress leaders.



South Korea: Gov't, ruling party agree to strive to curb inflation

Seoul, Aug 11 : The government and the ruling party agreed Tuesday to make an all-out effort to stabilise prices and to swiftly implement the supplementary budget in an effort to better support the livelihoods of the people and spur economic growth, officials said. The agreement was made during a high-level policy coordination meeting between the ruling Democratic Party (DP) and the government held at the prime minister's residence in Seoul. The meeting marked the first of its kind since Prime Minister Kim

Min-seok took office Wednesday following his parliamentary confirmation hearing. "There was a shared understanding that every effort should be made to stabilize perceived inflation, as the high price levels continue to weigh on the people's livelihoods," party spokesperson, Park Sang-hyuk, told a press briefing. "The ruling party urged the government to maintain close communication with industry stakeholders to minimize price increases in processed foods and ease the bur-

den on consumers. In response, the government agreed to actively consider the matter," he added. According to government data, consumer prices, a key gauge of inflation, increased 2.2 per cent from a year earlier in June, marking the steepest on-year increase since January. Prices of processed food products, in particular, rose 4.6 per cent on-year, the highest increase since November 2023, which contributed 0.39 percentage point to overall inflation last month. During the meeting, the DP requested the government to

execute the second supplementary budget as quickly as possible "to avoid missing the golden window for economic recovery," and the government said it plans to execute 85 per cent of the budget by end-September, according to the lawmaker. The Cabinet on Saturday approved an extra budget bill of 31.8 trillion won (US\$23.3 billion), marking the first supplementary budget under the Lee Jae Myung government. During the meeting, the government also reported that it would take measures to thoroughly pre-



pare for natural disasters, such as floods and storms, and the two sides agreed to enhance responses to heat waves, Park noted. In his opening remarks, Kim said that the meeting serves as the key venue for coordinating the na-

tional agenda. "We plan to discuss ways to maximise the impact of the supplementary budget, public relief measures and thorough preparedness for summer disasters like heat waves," the prime minister added.



Sudan's paramilitary RSF says monitoring international peace efforts with 'interest'

Khartoum, Aug 11 : Sudan's paramilitary Rapid Support Forces (RSF) has said it is monitoring international efforts to push for a ceasefire in the country. "The Rapid Support Forces are following with great interest and appreciation the intensive international movements regarding the situation in Sudan. We declare our full and serious response to these initiatives," the RSF said in a statement on its Telegram page on Tuesday (local time). The announcement followed US President Donald Trump's disclosure that he had launched efforts to end the Sudanese conflict, noting the initiative came at the request of Saudi Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman during their White House meeting. The RSF also thanked leaders of the Quartet countries -- the United States, Saudi Arabia, the United Arab Emirates, and Egypt -- for their mediation efforts.

US military says it's aware of North Korea missile launches, reaffirms defence commitment to allies

Washington, Aug 11 : The US Military said Tuesday that it is aware of a North Korean ballistic missile launch this week, reaffirming America's defence commitment to regional allies. US Pacific Command released a statement hours after Pyongyang fired a short-range ballistic missile toward the East Sea -- a launch that came ahead of a major South Korea-US military exercise that the North has decried as a rehearsal for invasion. "We are aware of the missile launch and are consulting closely with our allies and partners," the command said in a statement posted on its website, Yonhap News Agency reported. "Based on current assessments, this event does not pose an immediate threat to US personnel or territory, or to our allies. The United States remains committed to the defence of the US homeland and our allies in the region," it added. The North last tested a tactical ballistic missile, as well as new multiple rocket launchers and other weapons, on June 25. According to South Korea's Joint Chiefs of Staff (JCS).

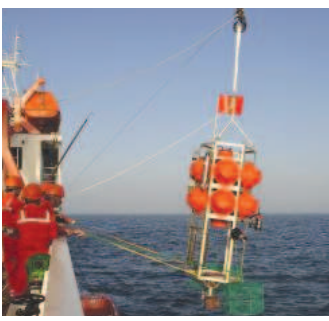
China's actions in South China Sea undermine international legal order: Report

Naypyidaw, Aug 11 : China's actions constitute a systematic assault on the international legal order. By asserting adherence to the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea (UNCLOS) — while violating its core provisions, spreading disinformation to obscure violations, intimidating monitors and negotiating in bad faith- Beijing demon-

strates that law matters only when it aligns with Chinese interests, a report said on Tuesday. According to a report in Myanmar's media outlet 'The Irrawaddy', China's stated commitment to upholding international law appears hollow amid growing evidence of systematic violations of the UNCLOS — a treaty Beijing ratified in 1996. "The scene of these egregious violations is the South China Sea,

where China lays spurious claim to sovereignty over the Scarborough Shoal, a resource-rich atoll in the Philippines' so-called Exclusive Economic Zone. Known as Bajo de Masinloc in the Philippines and Huangyan Island in Chinese, the shoal has been effectively occupied by a permanent Chinese Coast Guard presence since a 2012 standoff, both because of

the rich fishing grounds that surround it and its strategic position on international shipping routes," the report detailed. "An international arbitration ruling in 2016 invalidated China's expansive claims and found that the shoal is a traditional fishing ground for several nations. But rather than abiding by the arbitration it signed up to, China has responded by escalating its maritime aggression, combined with a coordinated disinformation campaign designed to obscure its illegality," it added. The report highlighted that China's Coast



Guard presence at the Scarborough Shoal more than doubled in 2025, with 1,094 "ship days," patrolling the area — compared to 516 in 2024 — maintaining a near daily presence in the disputed territory.

Mongolia: Indian Ambassador visits UNCCD COP17 venue

"On 11 August 2026, HE Mr Atul Malhari Gotsurve, Ambassador of India, along with the Resident Diplomatic Corps, visited the venue of the UNCCD COP17. Present at the event were HE Mr T Sandag Ochir, Minister of Environment and Climate Change, HE G Amartuvshin, Deputy Minister of Foreign Affairs, senior officials, etc," the Indian Embassy in Mongolia stated on X. The 17th session of the Conference of the Parties (COP17) to the UNCCD will be hosted by Mongolia in its capital city, Ulaanbaatar, from August 17 to 28 under the theme of 'Restoring Land. Restoring Hope'.

US embargo inflicts severe humanitarian toll on Cuba: Report

Havana, Aug 11 : The US embargo against Cuba has caused incalculable humanitarian damage and become the main obstacle to the Caribbean country's social development, local media reported. Citing a study by the Center for Economic and Policy Research, Cuban online news outlet Cubadebate said Cuba's infant mortality rate rose from 4 deaths per 1,000 live births in 2018 to 9.9 in 2025, an increase of 148 per cent. The report says that the sharp

rise in infant mortality during that period may have been mainly caused by the tightening of US sanctions against Cuba, which began during US President Donald Trump's first term in 2017, Xinhua news agency reported. Cuban officials, including Foreign Minister Bruno Rodriguez and Deputy Public Health Minister Carilda Pena, have recently denounced the impact of the US embargo on Cuba's healthcare system, particularly the effects of executive orders issued on Jan. 29 and May 1 this year.



According to official statistics cited by Cubadebate, the survival rate for children with cancer in Cuba has fallen from 85 per cent to 65 per cent since the United States imposed restrictions on oil supplies to the island and intensified its sanctions. The US measures, described by Havana as "collective punishment," have affected more than 100,000 patients awaiting surgery, including 5,152 cancer patients

and nearly 12,000 children, the outlet said. Cuba's Public Health Ministry has also reported adverse impacts on 2,888 patients receiving hemodialysis, whose treatment depends on supplies, water and specialised equipment. The restrictions have made it harder for Cuba to obtain raw materials, equipment and financial resources needed to sustain domestic production of vaccines, basic medicines and diagnostic tools for diseases such as cancer, Cubadebate said. The US oil restrictions have worsened Cuba's energy crisis, with power outages exceeding 20 hours in Havana and a daily electricity shortfall of about 2,000 megawatts, the outlet said. So far in 2026, Cuba has re-

ceived only one fuel shipment, delivered by Russian tanker Anatoly Kolodkin, which carried 100,000 metric tonnes of crude oil. The fuel crisis has prevented more than 100,000 children from receiving state-subsidized milk, as transport from production centers to cities has been disrupted, according to food industry officials cited by Cubadebate. In addition, 170 containers of essential goods worth 6.3 million US dollars have not been distributed across Cuba. Humanitarian organizations, including the United Nations Development Programme.

Mumbai, Aug 11 : India's Commonwealth Games 2026 medallists Sharmila Dhankar, Lovlina Borgohain and Jhandu Kumar are set to swap the sporting arena for the television studio as the trio is expected to appear on the popular quiz show Kaun Banega Crorepati (KBC).

Sources close to the development told IANS that the three athletes will get the opportunity to take the coveted 'hot seat' opposite Bollywood legend and veteran KBC host Amitabh Bachchan. The special episode featuring the Glasgow Commonwealth Games medallists is expected to be telecast after August 15. "Commonwealth Games medallists Sharmila Dhankar, Lovlina Borgohain and Jhandu are set to feature on the popular television quiz show Kaun Banega Crorepati (KBC). The three athletes will get an opportunity to take the coveted hot seat opposite Bollywood legend Amitabh Bachchan. The episode featuring the Commonwealth Games medallists is expected to be telecast after August 15," sources told IANS.

Dhankar, who emerged as one of the standout stories of India's campaign in Glasgow, will bring an especially inspiring journey to the show. She clinched the gold medal in the women's F57 shot put event, completing a remarkable transformation from surviving domestic violence to becoming a Commonwealth Games champion.

Boxer Lovlina Borgohain will also feature after securing the silver medal in the women's 75kg category. The Indian was beaten 1-4 by Australia's Emma-Sue Greentree in the final but returned home with a podium finish from Glasgow.



There is not much difference between Kohli in a practice session and a match : T Dilip

New Delhi, Aug 11 : Former India fielding coach T Dilip has underlined Virat Kohli's consistency in the field, saying the veteran batter carries the same intensity into matches that he displays during training and, in the process, pushes those around him to raise their own standards.

Dilip, who recently completed nearly five years with the Indian team's coaching set-up following the England tour, believes Kohli's influence is not limited to the moments when the ball comes his way. Instead, his constant involvement and willingness to remain switched on have helped create a stronger fielding culture within the team.

"With Virat Kohli, there is not much difference between him in a practice session and a match, because it's not just Virat; it's the five other players who have stretched their limits when they are fielding with Virat Kohli. That's the influence he brings into the group," Dilip told JioStar.

According to Dilip, Kohli's approach is built around an intensity that does not diminish with his position on the field or the stage of the game. Whether stationed in the inner circle or moving across the boundary during the closing overs, the former India captain continues to demand high standards of himself. "When it comes to Virat Kohli, intensity is non-negotiable."

Praggnanandhaa opens Sinquefield Cup campaign with comfortable draw against Sevian

St. Louis (Missouri), Aug 11 : Grandmaster R Praggnanandhaa began his Sinquefield Cup campaign with a comfortable draw against American counterpart Samuel Sevian in the opening round of the penultimate event of the Grand Chess Tour.

Playing with the black pieces, Praggnanandhaa gave little away as the Arkhangelsk Variation of the Ruy Lopez produced a relatively quiet encounter. The Indian's preparation appeared to be superior, while Sevian showed little inclination to complicate matters.

The players began exchanging pieces early, with a pair of rooks coming off the board as soon as

the 11th move. Further exchanges led to a queen-and-minor-piece endgame in which both players had two knights each, leaving little scope for either side to create winning chances.

Once the queens were traded, the outcome became almost inevitable and the game eventually ended in a draw after 48 moves, although



the players could have agreed to split the point earlier.

Top seed Fabiano Caruana was the only player to register a victory in the opening round of the 10-player, nine-round tournament. The American defeated Jorden Van Foreest of the Netherlands to take the early lead.

Caruana once again underlined why he has been the standout player on the Grand Chess Tour this season, outplaying Van Foreest from an initially equal position.



'We are determined to bring back the gold medal': Salima Tete ahead of Women's Hockey WC

New Delhi, Aug 11 : India women's hockey captain Salima Tete has set her sights firmly on the gold medal at the FIH Hockey Women's World Cup 2026, insisting that the team has the belief and ability to challenge for top honours after an impressive Nations Cup triumph. India head into the World Cup with considerable momentum after winning the FIH Nations Cup in Auckland, New Zealand, in June. The team remained unbeaten throughout the tournament before defeating hosts New Zealand 2-0 in the final to lift the title. Speaking to JioStar ahead of the showpiece event, Tete said the team's confidence has grown considerably and that the players are determined to convert their recent success into a strong World Cup campaign. "As a captain, my role is to support every player on the pitch. Whether we are losing or winning, I stand with the team. This time, the FIH Hockey World Cup will be ours. We will play smart, attacking hockey and bring back a medal."



Canadian Open: Svitolina, Swiatek see off Alexandrova, Shnaider to set up SF clash

Toronto, Aug 11 : Elina Svitolina's resilience once again came to the fore as the ninth seed overturned a slow start against Ekaterina Alexandrova to book a place in the Canadian Open semifinals, where she will face Iga Swiatek in a clash between two of the tournament's biggest forces.

Svitolina, the 2017 champion, was initially unsettled by Alexandrova's aggressive baseline approach. The 16th seed, fresh from her shock victory over world No. 1 Aryna Sabalenka, struck cleanly to take the opening set 6-3.

But the momentum changed dramatically after the first-set setback. Svitolina reeled off 11 of the next 12 games, sweeping the second set 6-0 and moving 5-1 ahead in the decider. Alexandrova threatened a late revival by narrowing the deficit to 5-3, but Svitolina held her nerve, breaking in the ninth game to complete a 3-6, 6-0, 6-3 victory in 93 minutes. "I think she was playing really well, serving really unreturnable to be fair. So I had to really try to find opportunities to see the ball better and I think focusing on myself more."

ICC Rankings: Nashra Sandhu among notable gainers as Pakistan's late win brings progress

Dubai, Aug 11 : Pakistan's consolation victory in the final T20I against Sri Lanka has translated into significant movement in the latest ICC Women's T20I Player Rankings, with Nashra Sandhu, Shawaal Zulfiqar and Tuba Hassan among those making notable gains despite Sri Lanka claiming the three-match series 2-1.

Sandhu emerged as Pakistan's biggest mover among the bowlers, climbing one place to eighth after returning figures of 1/17 in the third T20I. The left-arm spinner was one of Pakistan's most consistent performers throughout the series, finishing with three wickets while maintaining an impressive economy rate of 6.72. Tuba Hassan also moved upwards, gaining three places to reach 48th in the T20I bowling rankings.
